#### Soccorrete, luci avare op.2 and Spesso per entro al petto op.2

Barbara Strozzi (1619-77), was the most prominent female singer, composer and author in Italy in the early Baroque era. She inherited the intellectual gene from her mother Isabella Goarzoni, who was an outstanding singer, and had a higher music education and financial support from Giulio Strozzi, her adopted father, who was a famous musician, opera composer and founder of theater. Based on the strong influence from her parents, Barbara Strozzi possessed music talent and inspiration as singing and composing secular music, which included love songs, dance music and drama. <sup>1</sup>

The music style of Babara was very lyrical, which was different than dramatic, reflected by her writing in a large number of different musical types, such as arias, cantatas, and madrigals. Her music was different than that of Giulio and Cavalli, whose music was conservative and reserved, a prime example of typical music of the times. It was incredible that she had the courage to innovate a diversity of music forms, such as simple and strophic arias, various da-capos and sundry refrains. Furthermore, to select lyrics, Barbara had her inimitable opinion and flavor, especially, for love poetry. An expert at singing, Barbara was proficient in utilizing the best approach of writing the direction of melody so that her music was fluent and eloquent.

The songs Soccorrete, luci avare and Spesso per entro al petto are simple strophic tunes that are set at least two sections of different lyrics for the same melody and both songs are reedited in 1949. The subject of the first cantata "Soccorrete, luci avare" is a tormented woman who is suffering and yearning to get charity and love. This cantata could be separated into two parts, the first part is lyric and gentle, and the second part is splitting and energetic. The second cantata "Spesso per entro al petto" is a vivid song that describes the change of the internal world of a woman. This song can be saperated into three different parts. The first part is bright and Leggero which includes a lot of melisma. Each note in the first part is fluctuate that always goes up and down. The second part is slow and lyric which means the inner struggle of the woman. The third part is going to be fast which implies the woman whose inner feeling is love.
