The **Chromatosphere** is the harmonic plane on which all pitched music exists, and I see free jazz and non-tonal playing as occupying a special place on the Chromatosphere. There are a few selections tonight that combine chromatic and free playing, because the rich colors of the former are in stark contrast to the flashes of color in the later. "Free" is not the absence of harmonic color, but rather the absence of rules deciding those colors in advance.

The chance to play free is to rediscover a child's approach to the music—so next time you grab your instrument, close your eyes, let go of restrictions and what you know, free jazz!
