WHY

A registry is a list of patient information organized to highlight the care needs for a patient population. Registries can help providers decide which patients need to be scheduled sooner for an office visit or called to ensure they are taking their medication as prescribed.

WHAT

Registries can be used to improve the quality of care provided to patients. For example, a provider-led team can use a registry to proactively reach out to patients with diabetes who have not had a foot or eye exam in the past year.
