

# LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY

The total value of all cattle, hogs, sheep and chickens (excluding broilers) in Illinois at the beginning of 1980 was estimated at one billion 711.5 million dollars, an increase of around 2% from the beginning of 1979.

The number of cattle and calves in Illinois on January 1, 1980 was 2,700,000 head, 150,000 less than a year earlier. However, an increase in the average value per head to \$475 from \$385 a year earlier resulted in an increase in the value of the State's cattle herd to \$1,282,500,000, a 17% increase over the January 1, 1979 inventory value of \$1,097,250,000.

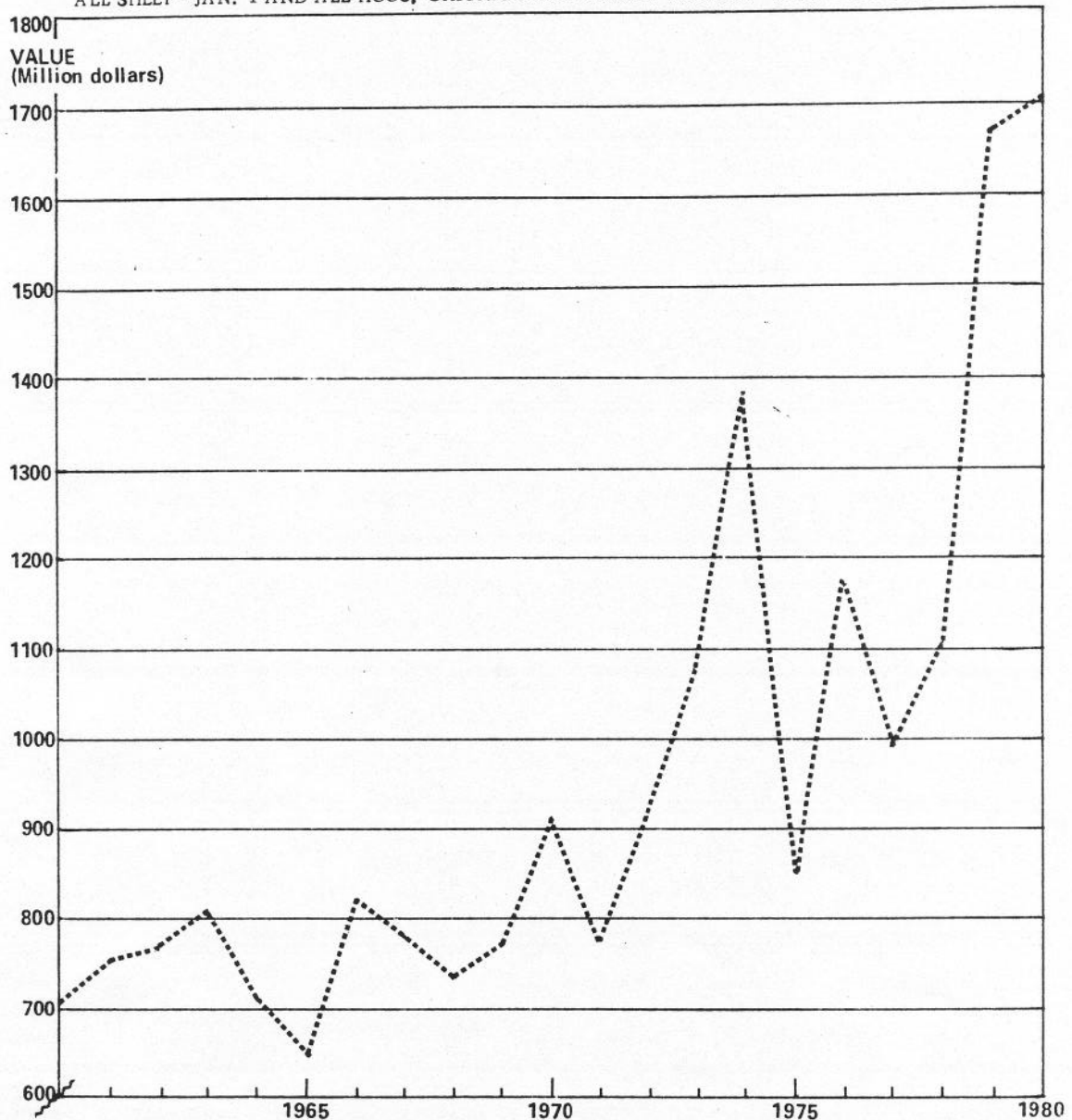
The hog and pig inventory increased 400,000 head -- to 6,950,000--from December 1, 1978 to December 1, 1979 but the sharp drop in average value per head from \$84.50 to \$58.00 resulted in a reduction in inventory value of 27%. The December 1, 1978 estimated value of all hogs was \$553,475,000. It was down to \$403,100 on December 1, 1979.

The number of sheep and lambs on January 1, 1980 was estimated at 190,000 head, 6,000 over the year earlier number. The value per head was estimated at \$76.00, up \$8.00 per head from a year earlier. This resulted in an estimated value of the sheep flock of \$14,440,000, up 15% from the year earlier value of \$12,512,000.

Chickens (excluding broilers) on December 1, 1979 were estimated at 6,950,000, down 9% from a year earlier. But a 20 cent increase in average value -- to \$1.65--resulted in a 4% increase in the value of the flock, which on December 1, 1979 was estimated at \$11,468,000.

For the livestock and poultry included in these estimates cattle accounted for about three-fourths of the total value at the beginning of 1980 compared with about 65% a year earlier.

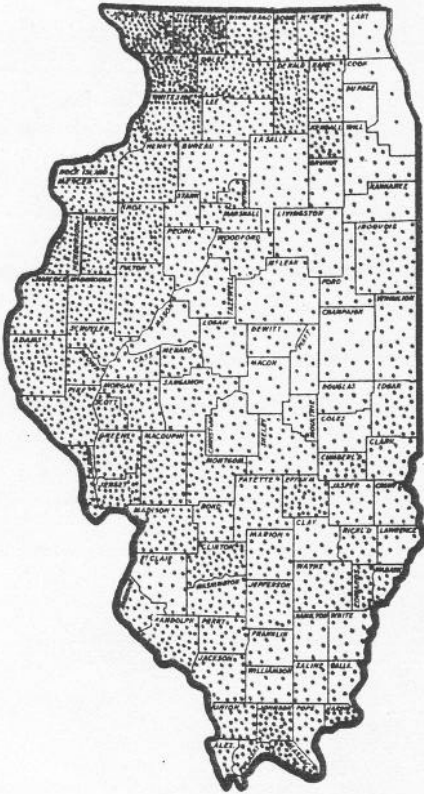

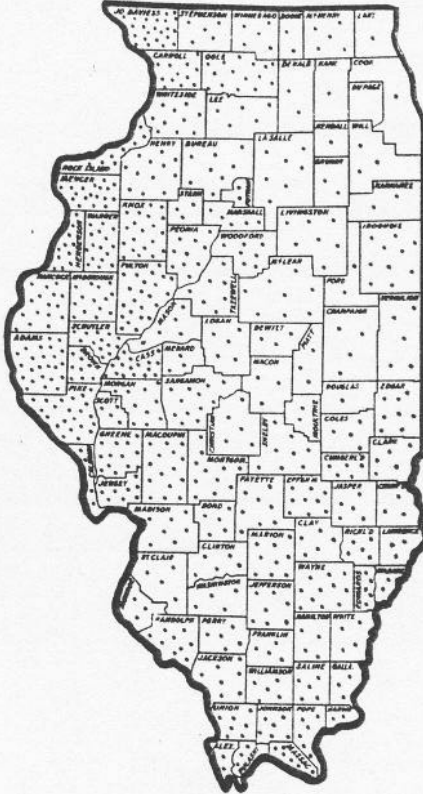

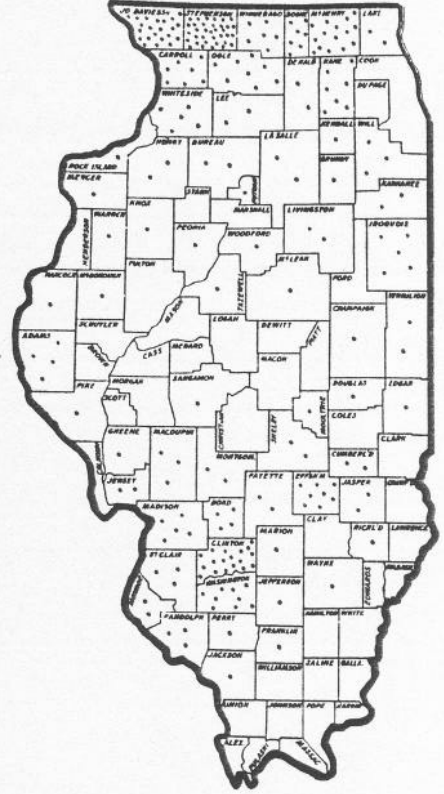
CATTLE ON FARMS  
JANUARY 1, 1980



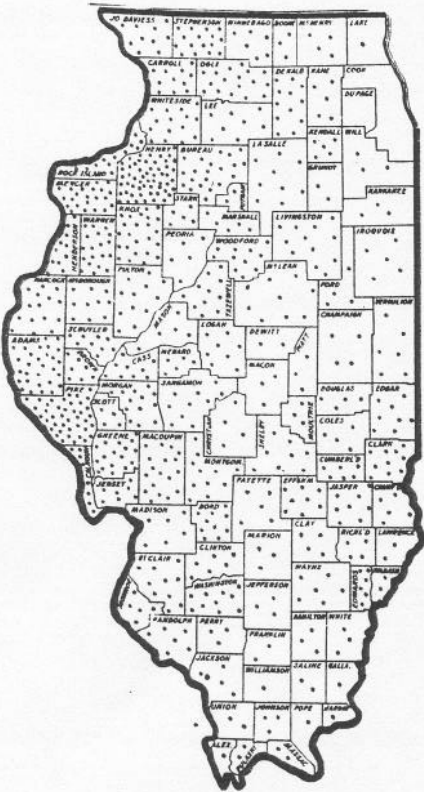
BEEF COWS  
JANUARY 1, 1980



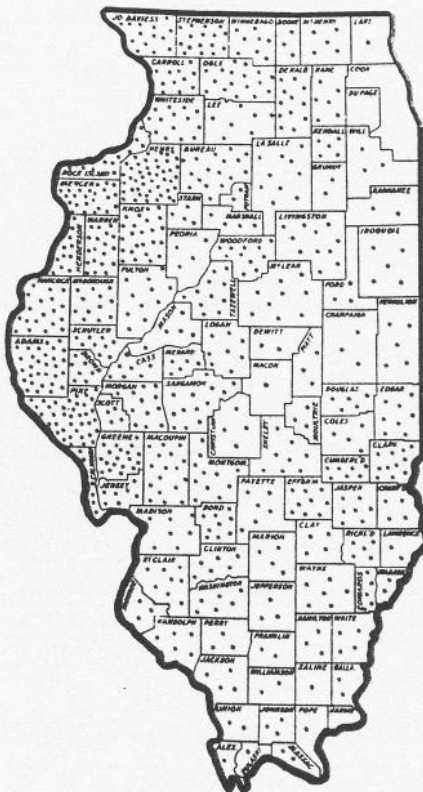
MILK COWS  
JANUARY 1, 1980



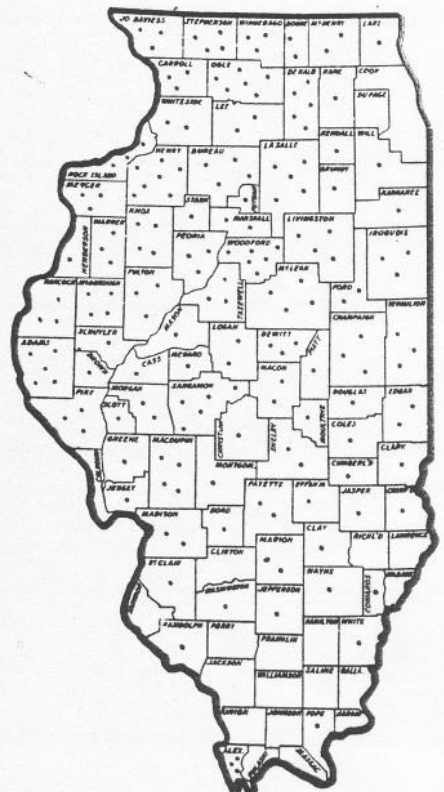
SPRING SOWS FARROWED

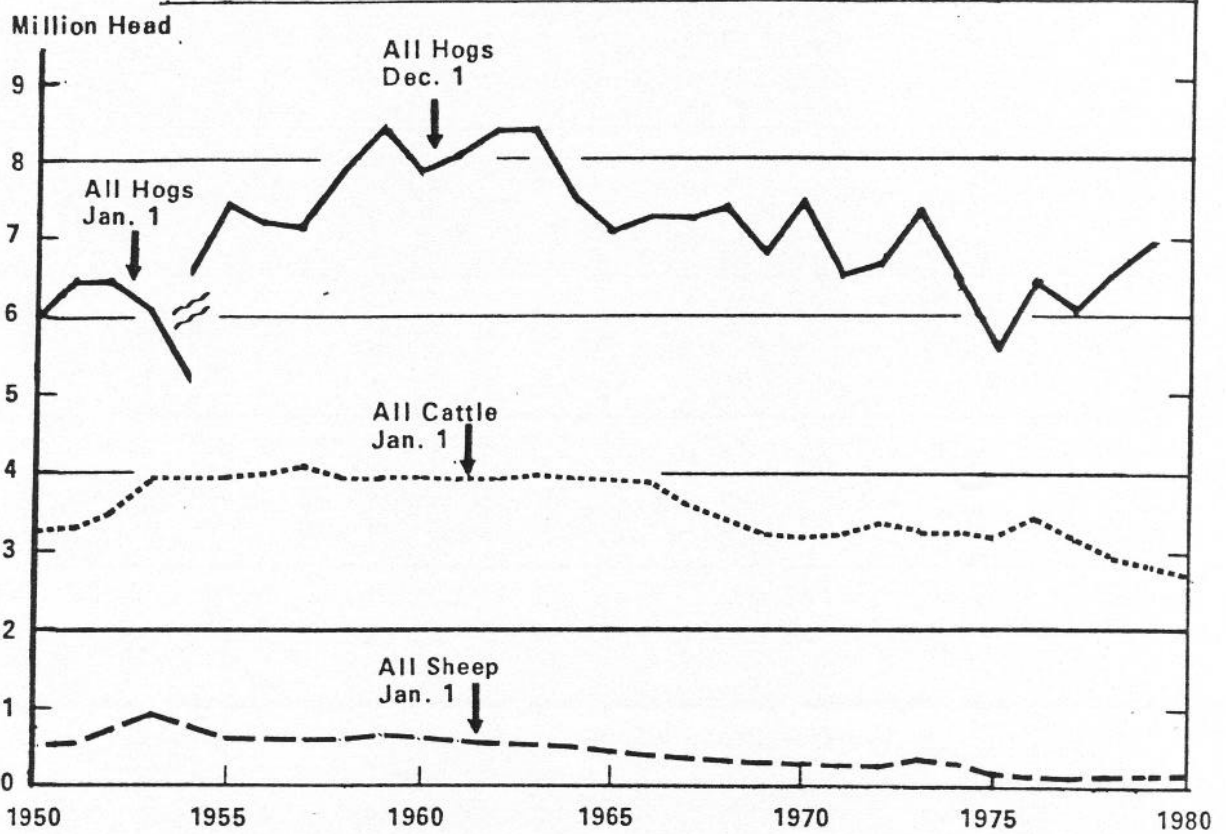

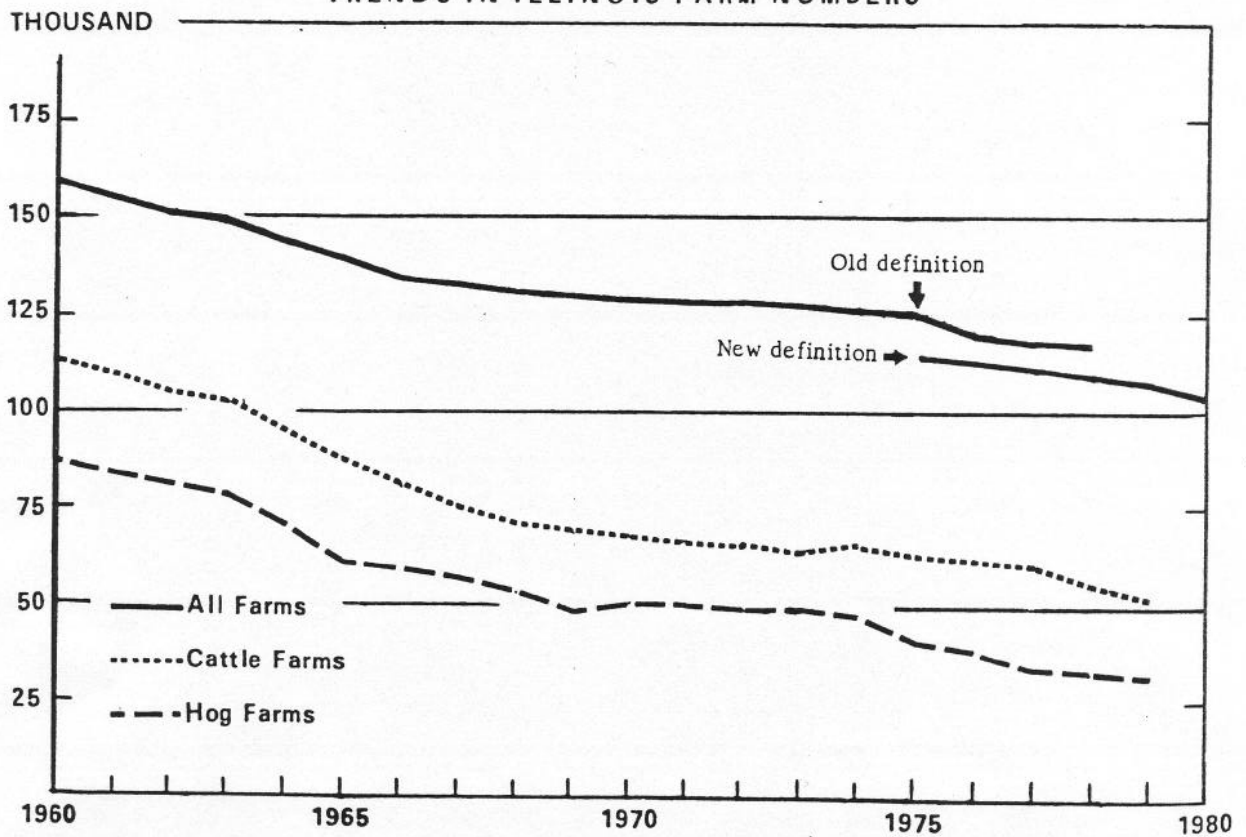
