

# What's New for 2013-2014?

Many changes are being made to our Academy, which we hope will improve your experience as a lifelong learner. In addition, we've implemented icons on each listing for special details about each listing, i.e. whether the listing is for a one-day workshop, a multiple-meeting course, a travel opportunity, etc. The legend on p. 2 will help you decipher the icons on each listing.

# Legend

Multi-Meeting Courses A multi-meeting course is a series of meetings scheduled for multiple dates, and is designed to investigate an in-depth topic. Each lesson builds upon the previous meeting's content, with the end goal of developing a knowledge base or skill set regarding the topic of study. A one-time registration fee covers all meeting dates in the series, and participants should plan to attend all meetings to receive the full benefit of the course.

Workshops A workshop is a single-meeting event lasting one to three hours, which serves as an introduction to a topic of interest. A workshop topic may be offered multiple times on the Academy schedule. Participants pay a per-meeting registration fee and may attend a single meeting, or may register to attend multiple times.



Member-Only Social Events A Member-Only social event is reserved for Academy members only (and their guests in the case of Intergenerational Opportunities). A registration fee covers the cost of your ticket and event coordination.



Lunch & Learn Lunch & Learn Lectures are free events scheduled monthly during lunch hours. These events are special opportunities for Academy members to socialize and to learn about services and resources in the Coles County community or to be entertained or informed on a topic of interest. Introduce a friend to the Academy by bringing them along to a Lunch & Learn lecture. No pre-registration is required; bring your lunch and receive your green Academy lunch bag for your next visit!

Field Trip Remember school days, taking field trips to area attractions and businesses to learn what goes on around us? A Field Trip is a short-term (1–3 hours) visit to a local business or establishment for an introduction to the location and how it impacts the community we live in. We will meet at the location identified for an educational introduction. Dining out before or after the event will enhance the learning with lively discussions. Transportation and meals are NOT included for field trips.

**Travel Opportunity** A Travel Opportunity is a day-long or multi-day, extended travel event that explores a topic or area in-depth. Transportation and, in the event of multi-day events, lodging and some meals are included in the cost of these events.



Intergenerational Opportunity Look for our Intergenerational Opportunity icon next to some of our event listings. This icon signifies that an event is appropriate for pint-sized guests. Bring your child, grandchild, or favorite young friend for some intergenerational fun!



# **Audit Courses for Fall 2013**

Academy members have the unique opportunity to take select traditional college courses without the burdens of tuition, homework or grades. #### **Elementary French I**

In addition, this course examines a variety of contemporary moral problems such as abortion, euthanasia, animal rights, and capital punishment.

Emphasis on human impacts on the environment and the necessity of conservation. Discussion of sustainability and resources as potential factors limiting society's development. Focus on humans as agents of environmental change.

# Impacts of Conscious and Unconscious Stereotyping

Many decisions and conclusions are formed outside our conscious awareness. Of particular concern are the associated health effects of implicit age stereotyping. Age stereotyping (a negative attitude toward older adults) is robust and widespread, and no society seems exempt. Computer research methods make it possible to distinguish our conscious and subconscious attitudes toward broad social categories. This 2-part course presents an overview of implicit and explicit stereotyping with a focus on age stereotypes. Participants will complete an online research test on their own time before returning to the second part of the course for discussion.


