My dear Friend, -

On yesterday I talked with the president in your behalf; and I write you very reluctantly for the reason that I received very little encouragement from him that you would be given a mission at this time. He says that there are a hundred men outside of the service who are begging him for diplomatic places, and that there are no vacancies, etc., etc.

I write you this because I think you should know the exact situation, as you had reason to expect something better from the encouragement given you personally by the President.
