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Syllabus for M 300: Undergraduate Mathematics Seminar (Fall 2021)

Course Description

The Undergraduate Mathematics Seminar is a discussion seminar focused on topics and issues of interest to students in the Mathematical Sciences. The weekly seminar series aims to give students an opportunity to explore various areas of mathematics that might not otherwise be encountered in traditional course work. In addition, the lecture seminars provide students with a broader background in their discipline and acquaint them with a variety of professors, alumni and other professionals.
