Gen Thos, M. Bowen Dear Sir Dear Sir

Permit me to suggest that no prindships are more lasting than those formed between Soldiers who have shared dangers Battles and notories. This having been our relation I assure you that I hear with regret That you have been "dishoninably dismised the service of the United States Now yew when I remember that you methe first to enter the service at The breaking out of the rebellion. That you served during the entire war-That you have held official position and have visen rapidly in rank. That you have had the confidence and esteem of your several commands

That you have had commands of danger where you rigilance and shill have enabled you to acquit yourly with hnow and to the good of the service that you have invariably maintained good discipline in your commands and laboured to secure for your commands all the benefits of the service. That you have been generous and courteous to your fellow officers although ambitions and aspring I conclude that erroneous presentations must have been made to the wow dphat alike unfust to jourself and dangerous to your bother offices. Permit me Gen to express a since hope that an investigation of your card will obtain a reversal of the order and accired to you the hundre which you desene Sincuck you friends Sate bol Ind Kan bar
