hand of Rev. Mr. Mordock. If you can
enroll the minimum for a Company
of Cavalry (79) for 3 years or during
the war. I will have you mustered
in and attached to the 9th Regt. Kansas
your will be stationed in Washburn
County. as long as there is necessity for
troops there. If you get your Company
full you had better report here in
person. And procure your outfit. And
the mustering officer can accompany you
back and muster the Company. They

will be mounted on Government horses
