FREF Funding Renewed

The Office of the Vice President for Research (OVPR) has announced two more years of funding for the UMN Morris Faculty Research Enhancement Funds (FREF) program. FREF funds are administered through the Dean's Office, with grants approved by a faculty committee. These investments by OVPR play an important role in advancing the research enterprise on this campus. We are extremely grateful to OVPR for their continued support of the Morris campus.

International Travel Grants

Deadline: December 15, 2021 (Additional deadlines: March 15 and August 15)

Global Programs and Strategy (GPS) Alliance provides international travel grants which are funded by the University of Minnesota central administration to support the internationalization of the University on all campuses through research, teaching, and outreach. Grants can be used for travel abroad or to bring international colleagues to Morris. The average award is \$1,500 with a maximum award up to \$2,000 for an individual and up to \$5,000 for group projects. Funding can be used for travel which has or will occur within one year before or after receiving the award. UMN faculty and P&A staff are eligible if they have not received an award in the last three years, with priority given to those who have never received travel grant funding from the GPS Alliance, in an effort to reach new faculty and staff and to provide grants in amounts that are impactful. http://global.umn.edu/funding/travelgrant/index.html
