A 1972 MS graduate of GSLIS, Ms. Lamont is a native of Wilmette, Illinois. She began her career at the Wilmette Public Library, and continued her work with children's library programs in the Evanston and Champaign Public Libraries. After joining the staff of the Illinois State Library in 1972, she was promoted as a library consultant specializing in children's services, and later in library systems and multitype library cooperation. She was appointed Associate Director for Library Development in 1979, Deputy Director in 1981 and named Director of the Illinois State Library in June 1983.

Ms. Lamont's contributions to the field of librarianship have been recognized by numerous awards. These include a 1994 Honorary Doctorate from Rosary College, the 1991 ILA Librarian of the Year award, the 1990 ALA Outstanding Achievement Award, and the 1990 Illinois Public Humanities Award from the Illinois Humanities Council.

Ms. Lamont will be the Commencement Speaker at the May 14, 1995 GSLIS Graduation in Smith Hall.

THE LATE PEGGY HARRIS RECIPIENT OF THE 1995 LSAA DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

The late Peggy Harris, former GSLIS liaison to the LSAA Board of Directors, was chosen to receive the 1995 LSAA Distinguished Service

A native of Jackson, MS, Peggy graduated Magna Cum Laude, from Millsaps College, in 1960. Although she was awarded a Woodrow Wilson Graduate Fellowship there, she attended the Graduate School of the University

of Chicago.

In 1962, she moved to Champaign with her family and began her long career at the University of Illinois. She first worked in the Coordinated Science Laboratory. In 1968, while working under Daniel Alpert, dean of the Graduate College, she was appointed staff assistant, an academic professional position. She followed him to the Center for Advanced Study, where she became the acting director from August 1978 to January 1979. From 1982 to 1984, she was the coordinator of the Medical Scholars Program in the College of Medicine. She then became the



assistant to the director in the College of Medicine until 1990. After two years in the office of the Board of Trustees, Peggy became assistant to the dean for development and

public affairs in GSLIS. Peggy was active in many community organizations. She served on the Board of Directors of the United Way of Champaign County, and on the UIUC Advisory Council. She was also a member of the Board of Directors of the University YWCA. It was during her tenure there that she organized the Champaign-Urbana Women's Network. She was also a member of the campus Professional Advisory Committee and a member and past president of P.E.O., Chapter KD.

Peggy's talents included decorating many offices, such as the GSLIS students' lounge, and hosting elegant dinner parties. Her natural warmth touched many lives and gained her many

friends.

By awarding Peggy Harris the Distinguished Service Award, LSAA wishes to recognize all these achievements, and to express its gratitude for the work she did so gracefully for the Board.

DIANE KOVACS IS THE FIRST RECIPIENT OF THE NEWLY CREATED LEADERSHIP AWARD

Diane Kovacs, a 1989 graduate of GSLIS, a leader in Internet applications, founder of GovDoc-L and LIBREF-L listservs, owner of Kovacs Consulting, and adjunct Assistant Professor at the Kent State University School of Library and Information Science since January, is the first recipient of the LSAA Leadership Award.

The award was created last year to recognize U of I graduates who have earned a MS degree within the past 10 years and have made significant contributions in the field of library and information science. Diane's accomplishments since her graduation exemplify the very purpose of the award. After graduation, she started her career as a Reference Librarian and Government Documents Coordinator at Bucknell University. In the fall of 1990, she went to Kent State University. Within a five-year span, Diane produced a large number of

MARY DEMPSEY, COMMISSIONER OF THE CHICAGO PUBLIC LIBRARY IS 1996 DISTINGUISHED ALUMNA

Mary A. Dempsey, (MsS '76) who was appointed Commissioner of the Chicago Public Library by Mayor Richard M. Daley in 1994, is the recipient of the LSAA Distinguished Alumna Award.

Dempsey's training at GSLIS, her experience as chief librarian at Hillside, as legal librarian at Kirkland and Ellis, and as legal counsel for organizations involved with government policy on health care and education have given her a rare vision as well as the means to affect that vision through practical application. Dempsey has faced down attempts to limit CPL's budget and has inventively raised foundation and corporate support for books and building maintenance funding crucial to keeping a huge library system healthy.

As Commissioner of the Chicago Public Library, Mary Dempsey oversees the daily administration of over 80




