She chronicles the famous Pulitzer Prize poetic aspirations through life with an air that is truly, well, exquisite. Little Gwendolyn Brooks has a passion for poetry, and even as she struggles through the hardships of the Great Depression, can't seem to fit in high school, and faces poverty all through her adult life, she keeps writing. *Exquisite* incorporates real life quotes from Brooks and others, which provide elementary students with their first exposure to citations. The historical note and timeline the author includes give students a glimpse at historical context. Illustrator Cozbi A.
