Thiladellin June 2.1837 Dear Vir He have your forer dated Robins Met. Febr. 28.37. in which you which a Ineft on us for \$ 500. payable at sight at the Bank of W. Olates to the war of Mo. G. J. St. Neal. This Bry has not yet made its affermence and of course not yet find. But this day there was presented to us a Graft in your name for \$ 200 - et sight foror of we have no letter of advice from your, and which we heitated some time about having as the signature and hand writing generally differs considerably from the writing in your letter of the Febr. 28.37. We submitted the new braft to a number of experienced persons in hand writing and some decided that it was written in the same hand as your letter, and others were fa different ofinion. We however concluded to pay the Draft and we hope. You will inform us it was drown by you. Hereafter it is important for you to give us notice

of each braft as you draw it, so that there may a a certainty of our not paying any thing but what you really drow for The Balance of your Funds in our hands after deducting the two Drafts of \$500 f 200 will be \$ 2. 829. 53 which we will pay to your order in any manner you may direct. Indeed it would be a convenience if you would draw the funds out of our hands, provided it would not incommode you, as we have no occasion for the money. If not convenient to draw the money findally You will authorise us to invest it in some safe Stock in Trust former. We shall always be happy to serve you in any manner in our former, and remain, Dear Dir, with the greatest esteem of respect, Mour Obest. Gents. If Ruleton &C.
