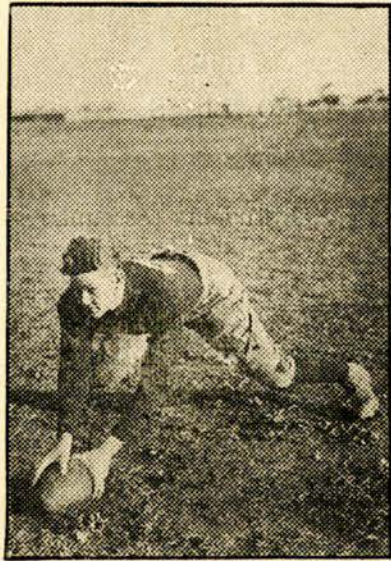


GENE SCHWARTZ
