the Company I have rote to
the first lieutenant and to
the chaplain of the company
and the doctor and I cant get no
return from them and I thot you
would know if he was dead or
a live I should be very glad to
know if he lives he may be impriso

as in the hospital if you be so kind
as to write and let me know i shall
be much oblig'd to you for your kindnes
to me and mine pleas Direct to Enfield
if you write for i shall
get it sooner
