I William Flamagen of Banger in the County of Penobust and state of Maine hereby on outh certify and say that on a about the 17 he day of June AD 1861 I Marted under contract with Gen Berry Then Colonel of the 4th moune Regement to take change of the bayging ham of theat Required when that regiment first left maine for the feeled - I look churge of a feest-of the brain at Bungor & The whole at Nockland I was with suiv Regiment in the above - named Capacity in its murch from mane to Mendeun Hell near washington and so continued do my duty as reforesand with said Regiment & under the aforesaid contract with gen Berry I mider his direction as bol aforked until about the 9th day of Olelober AD 1861.

before forcon the sun ghi day of Actober aforesun I was notified by Ju Berry Then Colonel as afore Tued that he had been instructed by some officer whose name & ruch I now do not remember but whom I understood at the time had authority - that men not regularly enlisted would not be further emplayed by the U.S. Government or their Mere would not be purther need of men who in the pressing need atthe time, of the Government, had been hired, and were not in the regular service of the U.S. - Gen Berry Then said he might find office employment for me I gave me a regular voucher approved by Gen. Howard upon which to obtain my pay and directed me to present it to a certain officer in the Quarter masters defeastment at washington who sent me to unother officer the receive my pury This record officer sent me to thill a theret officer who it seemed was oblidged to make some further ingring and being out of exploy & short of funds I returned to Gueral Berry who assured me he would set the officers aforeseed at mushington and seeure & forwereled to me my peux - There left for home and soon afterwards of am informed & believe The duties of Gen Beng were of meh pressing nature
