FOREWARD



Sanford High School 1936

In 1936, the Sanford High School yearbook was first named the Distaff, a tradition which has spanned fifty years. For this anniversary, we thought it appropriate to define the title Distaff and its significance as it was explained fifty years ago.

"Webster defines distaff as a staff from which flax is drawn in spinning. Seeking further, we find that a Bible dictionary states that the distaff was the first instrument employed in spinning and was the ancient emblem of female diligence. It consisted of a staff, on one end of which was rolled the wool. It was supported on the left hand of the spinner, while the right hand was occupied in drawing out the fibers of the wool and at the same time twisting them.

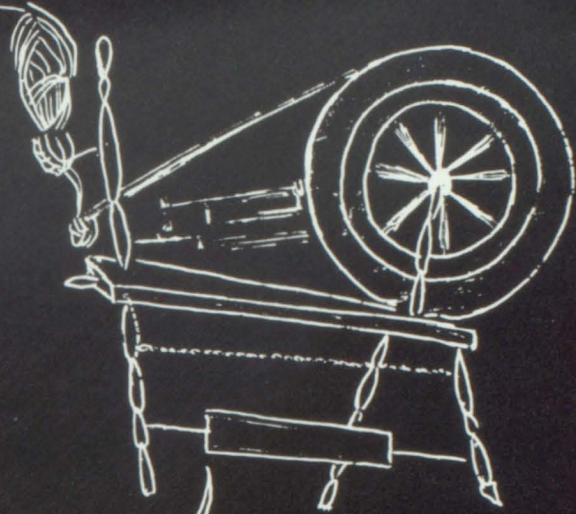
The ancient Greeks represented life by the three Fates, Clotho, Lachesis, and Atropos. Michelangelo in his painting "The Three Fates" makes Clotho spin the thread of youth upon her distaff — a thread later to be taken up by Lachesis and cut by Atropos. Like Clotho, we are spinning the thread of youth upon the distaff of life.

Although it is a far step from the ancient distaff to the modern machinery employed in our own local industry, the basic idea is the same. Sanford has built up a wide reputation in the art of spinning, weaving, and other textile processes; therefore it seems very appropriate that the Sanford High School yearbook should be known as The Distaff."

A Look Into the Past: 1936 Seniors



Ruth Gray 1936 Salutatorian

In 1936, the senior class of Sanford High School graduated seventy-six members. The salutatorian, with a 91.01 grade point average, was Ruth Gray. Following graduation from Sanford High School, she moved to Massachusetts where she attended several colleges including Yale and received her nursing degree. From that time she has spent most of her adult life nursing. Now, after fifty years, she is sharing the memories of her senior year with us.

"My senior year was similar to that which seniors experience today in that we were all very excited about graduation. Of course, not so many of us went on to college since that was during the Depression and many people just couldn't afford it. At that time the mills played a very prominent role in life in Sanford; therefore many that graduated went on to jobs prepared for them in the mills. As seniors, we had responsibilities, one of which was the Homeroom Congress. This activity had certain seniors setting a few of the school's regulations such as the dress code and other rules. As seniors, we didn't initiate the freshmen. I'm sure there were a few incidents, but as a whole it just wasn't done.

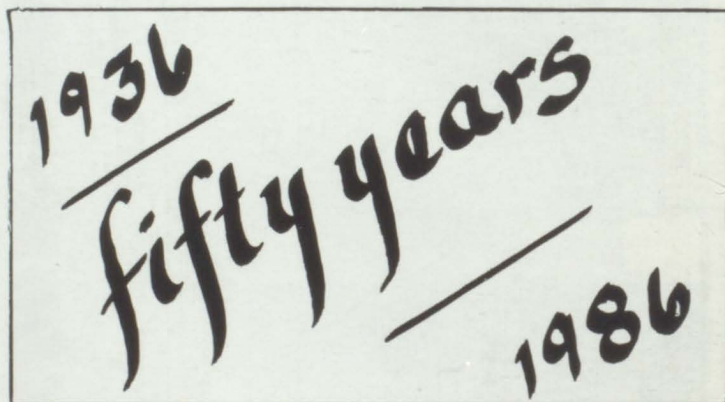
I'm sure the classes that I took were similar to the ones seniors are taking now. The courses were divided into four major categories — Commercial, Scientific, General and Classical. I took Classical which was the same as the college prep courses today. I received instruction in Latin, history, English, math and French but no science which hurt when I got to nursing school.

I put in quite a few hours a week studying, not necessarily because I had to, but because I wanted to. But I still had time for socializing. Much of what we did may seem dull or unexciting to the children of the eighties, but you have to remember that we didn't know anything else. We had our school activities: socials, formals, plays and sports. Also since it was during the Depression, the money just wasn't to be had for the traveling or socializing that many young people do today. We also didn't drive to school. On sunny days we walked and on rainy days we took the trolley car. At a time when many families still didn't own automobiles, it would have been unheard of for a senior to own his own car.

Also the generation gap wasn't as noticeable. We knew our places, and we respected our parents and other authority figures. We agreed with our elders on most issues, particularly music. I think music has been the biggest cause of the generation gap. When I was a senior, the big bands and jazz were starting to get really popular. We used to go to Old Orchard Beach evenings and dance to the big bands that used to play there. The music was sweet and sentimental. My favorite song was "Star Dust" by Hogie Carmichael. I really enjoyed listening to him.

The thirties were a comfortable time to grow up in. We didn't have the problems that are associated with today's teens. Drugs and alcohol were not used because of strict supervision, not only by parents but also by neighbors and friends. However, today there are also many more opportunities, especially for women. Also in Sanford there isn't the distrust and prejudice that I experienced between the Catholics and the Protestants. We mingled in school, but we didn't see each other socially; it was like a wall between us. Today, because differences in religion are no longer a problem, Sanford is a better place to live."

Seniors and students in general have changed much in the past fifty years. Styles, music, classes and society have made our world different from that of Ruth Gray's when she was a senior. But we still share a common bond with the seniors in her class in that we both have that kinship in knowing that we are leaving the life of high school behind and are going on to face the challenges that await us.

As you go through high school, have you ever wondered what school was like 50 years ago? In order to find out, the Distaff interviewed Mr. Ward Hanscom, who graduated in 1937.

WHAT ACTIVITIES WERE YOU IN AND WHICH ONES DID YOU ENJOY THE MOST?

"Let's see, I know I was in Latin Club, a couple of years. I was also in yearbook as a staff editor my junior and senior years. I enjoyed that. I was also in a couple of one act plays in Drama Club. I believe Ms. Vallyley was the director of the Drama Club. However the activity which I enjoyed the most was the Red and White, I was editor-in-chief my Senior year. The staff used to go to Boston to the presses for a field trip."

WHAT WERE DANCES LIKE?

"Each class had its own formal dance, called a social. The Freshman's social was called the Freshman Reception. Each social had a grand march, in which, each couple would march past the school board, who was chaperoning the dance."

WERE ALL DANCES FORMAL?

"No, just a couple. There were, I think, about six to ten dances a year."

WHAT OTHER SOCIAL ACTIVITIES WERE THERE?

"My chums and I used to take the trolley to the basketball games, or go to the movies."

We used to watch the football games, too."

HOW WERE THE TEACHERS? WHO WERE YOUR TEACHERS?

"I had Ms. Vallyley for English, Mrs. Clarke for geometry, Ms. Edith Lenfest as my Latin teacher my freshman and sophomore years, and Mr. Wilson as my Latin teacher my junior and senior years. They were all nice. Ms. Grace Earle, my history teacher, was tough but funny. She used to give a ten-question quiz everyday, then joke with the students. I think my favorite teacher was Ms. Annie Bailey, who taught French. She was a great guidance counselor, too. If you had a problem you'd usually go to her."

WHAT WAS A TYPICAL SCHEDULE?

"It was mainly languages — four years of English, four years of Latin, three years of French, two years of history, and three years of math."

WAS THERE SEGREGATION BETWEEN BOYS AND GIRLS?

"Not really, they just had to take separate gym classes. Also girls could take sewing while the boys took machine trades."

COULD THE GIRLS TAKE A VOCATIONAL COURSE OR THE BOYS TAKE SEWING?

"I don't think anyone wanted to, but I think they could have."

DID YOU FIND THAT AFTER YOU GRADUATED, YOU LOST TOUCH WITH

SCHOOLMATES?

"Yes, I went off to college for four years, then law school for one year, then into the Army for three years, and then back to law school for an accelerated course. When I came back I did see some of my classmates. I wrote to some, too."

HOW MANY OUT OF YOUR CLASS WENT TO COLLEGE?

"Out of 89 or 90 students in my class, I believe ten or twenty went to college to become teachers, engineers, or mathematicians. I enjoyed high school, but it went by all too fast!"

Have you ever wondered what teaching was like when your grandparents attended school? The yearbook did and therefore decided to interview Mrs. Doris Reando who was a teacher at Sanford High School fifty years ago. She received her degree from Nasson, and during her time there vowed she would never teach. However, when an opening appeared at S.H.S. the year she graduated, she took it. She fell in love with the profession and taught here for nineteen years, although many of those were as a substitute since in the Thirties married women weren't allowed to work full time. When asked about students and teaching fifty years ago, she recollected that much had changed, but much was also the same.

"Teaching fifty years ago was a much more respected profession. It was something good to get into. You were expected to get involved with the students' lives outside of the classroom as well as inside. There was no extra pay for this — we enjoyed being an important part of our students' lives. We would be hurt if we weren't asked to chaperone or to be an advisor. I'm still friends with many of my former students."

"Students were more respectful then. Authority figures made more of an impact on them. The students were always well-mannered. Because they respected authority, authority figures respected the rights of the students. Students then were like the students of today in that they liked to have fun. They did drink, though smoking was really frowned upon. But drinking was not the peer pressure issue that it is today, it was more controlled."

"I taught during the Depression. I made nine dollars a week, which wasn't bad money. I took a cut in pay however, when I married, since a married woman wasn't allowed to work full time. During the Depression, there were so few jobs that there could only be one breadwinner per family and of course that had to be the man, whether he had a job or not. This concept didn't change until after the second World War."

Mrs. Reando's reminisces have given us new insight into what life was like many years ago. It seems to prove the fact that people do stay the same, no matter how much times change. By remembering this, it can help us to be more tolerant of past and future generations.

The team's strong comeback is a tribute to the hard work of both Doug Roberts and the whole team. S.H.S. has a team they should be proud of.

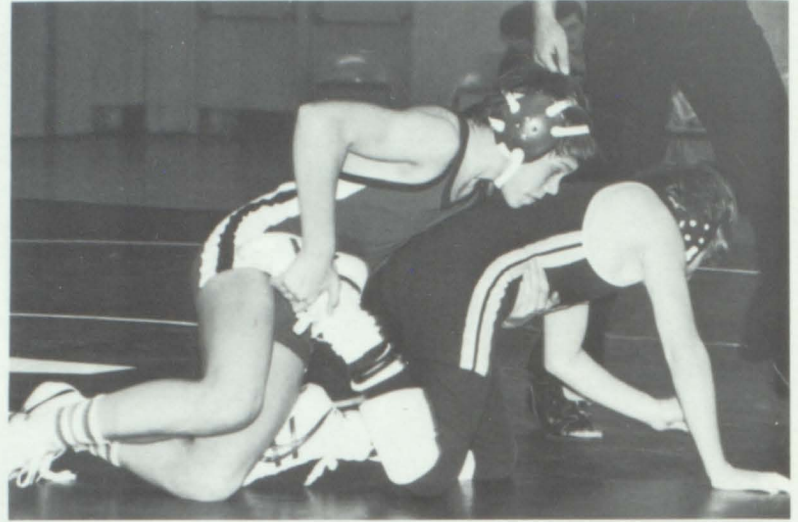
