

Mrs. Caldwell Passes At Home Here Saturday

Mrs. Sarah Forney Caldwell, member of one of the most prominent families in Northeast Alabama and a pioneer resident of Jacksonville, died at her home on Argyle Circle at 6 o'clock Saturday night, following a brief illness.

The funeral will be held at the home at 2:30 o'clock Monday afternoon with Rev. C. Morton Murray, rector of the Church of the Holy Comforter, conducting the services. The burial will follow in the Forney family plot in the Jacksonville Cemetery.

The pallbearers will be D. Holloway, Jule Greene, J. G. DuBose, A. P. Reich, Orville Lay, Gary Jordan, Frank Cobbs, Harry Disque, Gordon Hoed, Alston Green, F. R. Thompson, Paul Moffett, John S. Paden and H. J. Savage.

Surviving are one son, John Caldwell, New York City, and six daughters, Mrs. Knox Fleming, New York City; Mrs. Carl Lay, Gadsden; Mrs. Wm. Heindell, Philadelphia; Mrs. Hugh Alken, Philadelphia; Mrs. Cary Elliott, Gadsden, and Mrs. Eugene Cleary, New York.

Mrs. Caldwell was the daughter of the late Joseph Forney and Mary Whittaker, coming from a long line of Huguenot ancestors on both sides. She was a niece of the late Congressman Henry Forney.

The family settled in Jacksonville in the early days of its history, coming to Alabama from South Carolina. Its members have long been prominent in the civic, religious and political affairs of Alabama.

Mrs. Caldwell was a highly cultured woman and was admired and loved by everybody who knew her well. News of her death will cause widespread sorrow in North Alabama.
