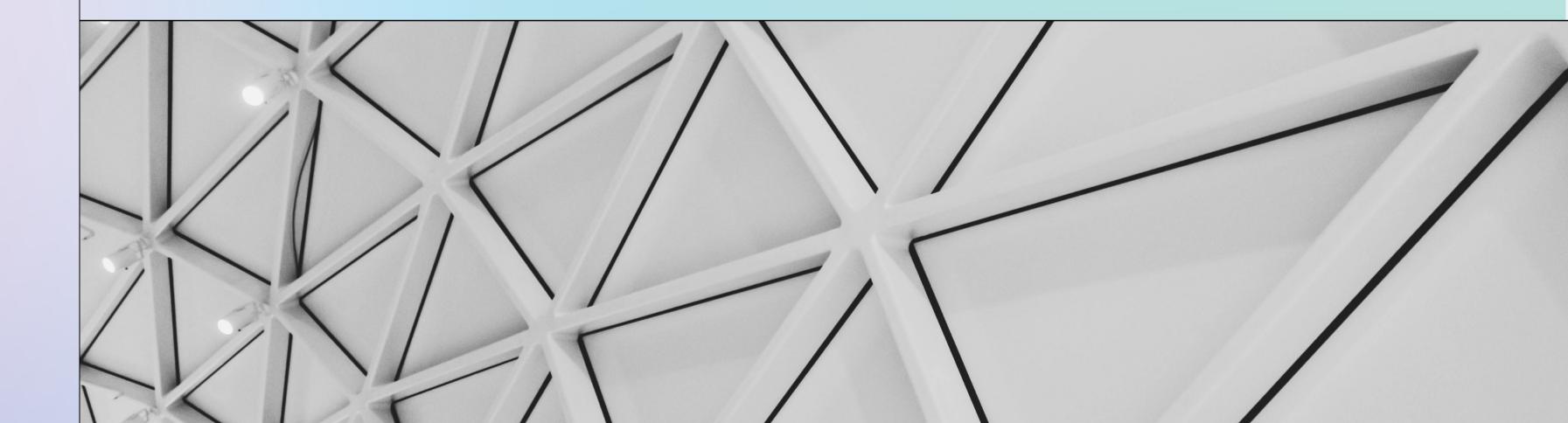

"At the most basic and fundamental level, an institutional repository is a recognition that the intellectual life and scholarship of our universities will increasingly be represented, documented, and shared in digital form, and that a primary responsibility of our universities is to exercise stewardship over these riches: both to make them available and to preserve them." Clifford Lynch, 2003

Colby College holds an annual research symposium to showcase student projects. A student research catalog is deposited into the IR

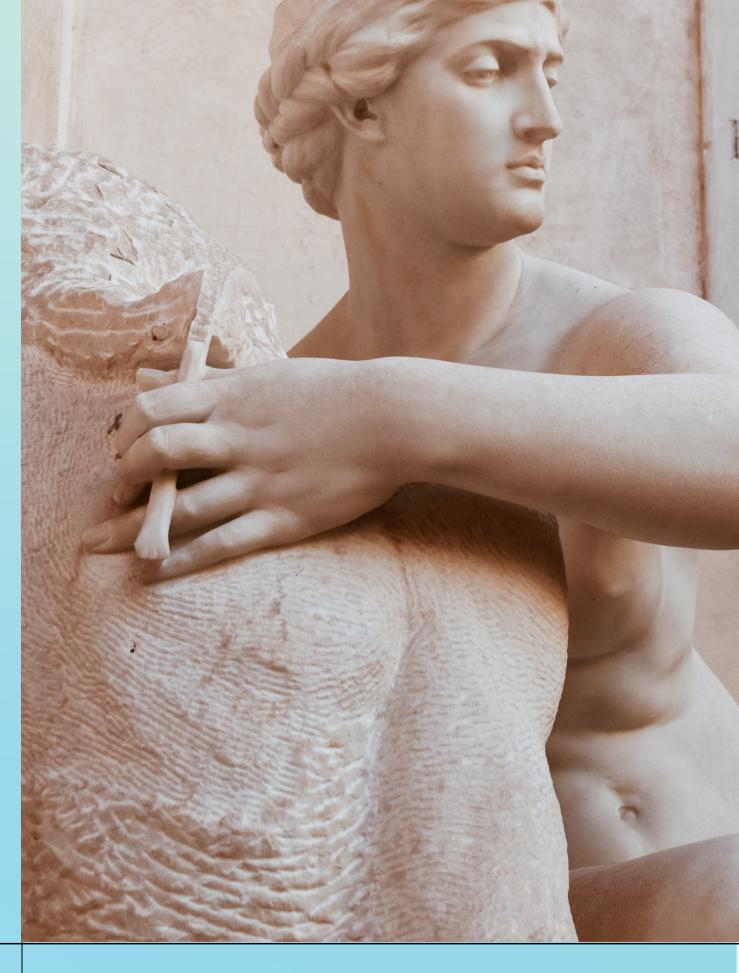


Art Faculty IR Project
