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# Create Narrated PowerPoint Videos for your Students with Adobe Captivate

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# PowerPoint to Captivate Conversion

Open Captivate 3. You do not need to open PowerPoint 2003. Please note: Captivate 3 does not support PowerPoint 2007's .pptx file format. If you use PowerPoint 2007, you need to save your file in the PowerPoint 2003 file format (.ppt or .pps).



Select **Record or Create New Project**.

In the popup window that appears, select *Other* from the column on the left, select **Import from Microsoft PowerPoint**, then click **OK**.



In the next popup window that appears, browse to the PowerPoint 2003 file that you want to import and click **Open**.

In the next popup window that appears, set the following options. When finished, click **OK** to begin recording your project:

- *Name*: the title of your Captivate project file (you will be able to name your narrated video later)
- *Width and Height*: by default, this is set to the size of a typical 720 x 540 browser window, recommended for use by the largest audience
- *Slide Preview*: by default, all slides are imported; uncheck the box next to any slides that you want to exclude
- *Import slides as*: by default, slides are imported as *Animations* and transitions are included; it is recommended to select *Background Images*
- *Advance slide*: by default, slides are advanced *On mouse click*, which is recommended

*Note*: Make sure that your USB microphone is plugged in and has been recognized by Captivate.

# PowerPoint to Captivate Conversion

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Adding narration to a single slide:

- Click on the slide in the storyboard window
- Select *Record this slide* from the **Audio** drop down menu in the toolbar across the top of the window, this will pop up a window
- Be prepared to begin speaking immediately, then push the **Record** button in the popup window (If you have not configured your microphone, you will next see a popup window that asks if you would like to test audio levels, select **Yes**. Follow the on-screen prompt, then push the **OK** button once you are prepared to begin speaking immediately)
- When you are finished speaking, push the **OK** button at the bottom of the window

Adding narration across all of your slides:

- Click on a slide in the storyboard window
- Select *Record project* from the **Audio** drop down menu in the toolbar across the top of the window, this will pop up a window
- Uncheck *Continuous Play* at the top of the window
- Be prepared to begin speaking immediately, then push the **Record** button in the popup window (If you have not configured your microphone, you will next see a popup window that asks if you would like to test audio levels, select **Yes**. Follow the on-screen prompt, then push the **OK** button once you are prepared to begin speaking immediately)
- When you are finished speaking on this slide, push the blue square button in the middle of the window
- To advance to the next slide, push the blue arrow button on the right side of the window
- Repeat the previous three steps until all slides have been recorded, then push the **OK** button at the bottom of the window

Finalizing your narrated movie:

- Click **Publish** in the toolbar across the top of the window
- Select **Flash (SWF)** from the column on the left
- Give your exported movie a title, this is different than the Captivate project that you have been working on
- Select the **Browse** button in the middle of the window, navigate to the location where you want to save your exported movie
- Check off **Zip files** and **Export HTML** under *Output Options*
- Click the **Publish** button
- Click the **Close** button

*Note:* This process will create a zipped folder in the location you chose containing four files: a .js file, a .htm file, and two .swf flash movie files. Do not alter these files.



# PowerPoint to Captivate Conversion

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To load your narrated movie into Blackboard, log in and enter one of your course sites:

- Click on the **Control Panel** link
- Click on one of your Content Areas, such as **Course Documents**
- Click the **+Item** button
- Fill out the *Name* field
- Click the **Browse** button, locate the zipped folder you created, click **Open**
- Select *Unpackage this file* from the **Special Actions** drop down menu
- Click **Submit**
- On the next screen, select the file with the *.htm* extension from the menu, click **Submit**
