Propositions belonging to the thesis

MINIMALLY INVASIVE PANCREATIC SURGERY: A STEPWISE NATIONWIDE INTRODUCTION

- 1. Minimally invasive distal pancreatectomy can be safely introduced using detailed technique description, video training, and proctoring for surgeons with experience in both pancreatic and minimally invasive surgery (*This thesis*)
- 2. In patients with an indication for distal pancreatectomy for lesions confined to the pancreas, the minimally invasive approach is preferred over the open approach (*This thesis*)
- 3. Additional research on minimally invasive pancreatic surgery for pancreatic ductal adenocarcinoma is warranted (*This thesis*)
- 4. A minimally invasive approach to pancreatic surgery is unlikely to improve oncological outcomes (*This thesis*)
- 5. Minimally invasive pancreatoduodenectomy should only be performed by trained surgeons in centers with an adequate annual case load (*This thesis*)
- Only after a multicenter randomized controlled trial, conclusions can be drawn on the superiority and generalizability of minimally invasive vs. open pancreatoduodenectomy (*This thesis*)
- 7. Patient-blinding in surgical trials comparing minimally invasive and open surgery is feasible (*This thesis*)
- 8. The roots of education are bitter, but the fruit is sweet (*Aristotle*)
- 9. If you want to go fast, go alone. If you want to go far, go together (Ancient African proverb)
- 10. The best view comes after the hardest climb (Anonymous patient)
