Social Justice, what is it all about? Is it about rights? About opportunity? Treatment? We have heard it a lot lately as our nation continues to face issues of inequity that shake our consciousness as an American community and beyond.

The term evokes many understandings. The United Nations states "Social justice may be broadly understood as the fair and compassionate distribution of the fruits of economic growth". Other leading organizations use terms like equal economic, political, social rights, and opportunities. Still others focus on personal responsibility and advocate for members of society to improve organizations and institutions by ensuring that fairness is established.

This class offers reflective thought, selfexploration, and interactive dialogue to explore ways in which we can live through our everyday lens to "get in where we fit in" as positive community members concerned about others. By looking at our belief systems, acknowledging how our ideas confer and differ, seeking to incorporate our understandings of justice, and activating our efforts, we can make changes that improve our society for all. BEHIND THE BEAUTIFUL DRESS

It is hard to overstate the role of textiles in early American life. For families, the making of textiles and clothing required countless hours of labor, and the purchase of textiles could consume a large portion of the household budget. For the nation, textiles drove the American pre-Civil War economy. They provided a money-making opportunity for a few and exploited the labor of countless others. This presentation will explore cloth and clothing production in the 19th century and textiles' impact on pre-Civil War life in Illinois.

The audience will learn the following:

- How the cotton economy impacted the home production of textiles
- How the cotton economy involved the entire United States
- How the ready-made clothing industry grew out of the American textile industry
- The labor involved in making and caring for 9th-century clothing

The presentation will highlight examples of garments and artifacts from the Illinois State Museum's collections. After the presentation, the audience will have the opportunity to ask questions and draw parallels between the 19th-century garment industry and today.



The Southern Illinois Art Workshop, with the Mattoon Arts Council, is coming to Mattoon with 3 workshops for area artists. SIAW has been offering quality art retreats for almost 50 years!

Art Express includes Thursday evening to meet instructors & peers, two days of instruction (with catered lunches) and a guaranteed seat at the Friday night lecture "Marketing Your Art" with artist Kirby Pringle. Pringle will talk about how to use social media like Facebook, Twitter, and YouTube, as well as ways to sell your artwork using an online presence like Etsy, eBay and Square.

WORKSHOP 1: SOFT PASTELS WITH REBECCA MARCUSSEN

Day one will concentrate on Illinois landscapes/townscapes on sanded paper with alcohol underpaintings. Day two, students will work on a Clairfontaine Pastel Mat as a substrate to produce still life works with fine detail. Class size limited to 12.

WORKSHOP 2: PRINTMAKING WITHOUT A PRESS: FOLK ANIMALS WITH JAMIE WILLIS

Students will cut relief blocks from linoleum and Soft Cut material to print one-color prints suitable for artists' books, art quilts, art prints, etc. A brief history of printmaking, techniques for image transfers, and a discussion of non-toxic supplies are included. Class size limited to 12.

WORKSHOP 3: NO FEAR PAINTING BY JAN VONBOKEL



BOB SHEPPARD

For more than four decades, the multi-instrumentalist, Bob Sheppard, has played on countless sessions with an astounding crop of A-list-jazz giants - among them Chick Corea, Freddie Hubbard, Michael and Randy Brecker, Mike Stern, Herbie Hancock, Kurt Elling, Dianne Reeves, Lyle Mays, John Beasley, and Steps Ahead - and artists within several other genres. He's also recorded and toured as a leader, contributed to hundreds of movie and TV soundtracks, and served as an educator.


TALISK

One of Scotland's most popular folk-based groups to emerge in the last decade, Talisk has toured the world stacking up major awards for their energetic, yet artfully woven sound, including Folk Band of the Year at the BBC Alba Scots Trad Music Awards, a BBC Radio 2 Folk Award, and the Belhaven Bursary for Innovation. Mohsen Amini (BBC Radio 2 Folk Awards' Musician of the Year 2018), Hayley Keenan and Graeme Armstrong fuse concertina, fiddle and guitar to produce a groundbreaking, multi-layered and instantly enthralling signature sound that has captivated audiences around the globe.

THE VISITOR

This collaborative performance by a composer and a visual artist is a reactive dialogue between body, sound, and space. Aleatory music composed for the bass clarinet and marimba creates sound that is unique to the present moment and dependent on chance and spontaneity. Inspired by the Japanese Butoh dance tradition, a performer's body becomes a vessel for motion and form. The slow and unsettling unfolding - which is informed as much by empty space and silence as Marquez-Barrios's and Vera's identities as immigrants in a lineage of immigrants - positions the human condition as one of futility, impermanence, and beauty.


