WHEREAS, the State of Maine wishes to continue to support D.A.R.E. and to express appreciation to all those who diligently work to make the program a success in our communities,


NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOHN R. McKERNAN, JR., Governor of the State of Maine, do hereby proclaim October, 1990 as


