PROCLAMATION

State of Maine

WHEREAS, Aviation is playing a large and increasing part in the Business and Industrial growth of our State; and

WHEREAS, Aviation is so closely associated with the solution of our transportation problems; and

WHEREAS, the economic needs of our State, require the development of our recreational potential, and the State of Maine can benefit by the continued growth of all phases of Aviation within our borders; and

WHEREAS, on Sunday September 10th, is open house at one of our Military establishments at Dow Air Force Base in Bangor, Maine; and

WHEREAS, the New England Council is meeting at Rockland, Maine, on September 14th and 15th, to discuss Air Transportation, and airport development; and

WHEREAS, the Aviation Council of Maine, with all General Aviation interests, along with New Hampshire and Vermont, are meeting at Rockland, Maine, on September 16th and 17th, to promote Aviation and discuss air safety;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, John H. Reed, Governor of the State of Maine, do hereby proclaim the week of September 10th, 1961, as Aviation Week in the State of Maine.
