in the State of Maine, and urge all citizens to participate in projects and activities which will enhance the beauty of our State.



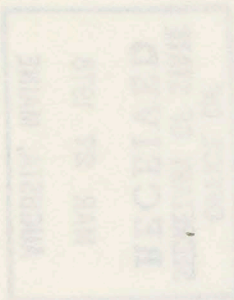
