

Introduction

Introduction to the Eighteenth Annual Report

It is our pleasure to provide the Eighteenth Annual Report for the College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources (CASNR). We believe in the importance of reflecting on the accomplishments of our faculty, staff and students. The annual report offers the opportunity to review the year, and serves as an archive of accomplishments for our College. This report primarily covers the period August 1, 2010 to July 31, 2011.

We can be very proud of your investment in UNL's undergraduate education. Seventy-three schools competed for recognition as innovators in undergraduate education. Only 16 were selected. UNL is one of the 16--the only one in our peer group as well as the only land-grant institution in the Big 10. In fact, UNL is one of only five major research universities to be named 'first tier' for our innovative programs for undergraduate students. The other universities are Duke University, the University of Michigan (non land-grant), the University of Southern California and the State University of New York at Stony Brook.

Over the past decade our UNL Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources (IANR) scientists are among the mostcited agricultural scientists in the world. *Science Watch* evaluated universities and research organizations based on the Essential Science Indicators, 1998-2008, tracking how often articles are cited by other authors (citations/paper). IANR is 17th in the world among all research organizations, 9th among American universities and 3rd in the Big Ten. Nebraska's Extension Division has the biggest participation of age-eligible 4-H students in the nation. In IANR, our faculty and staff so thoroughly integrate teaching, research and extension education that the success of each is the success of all.

And now, UNL has again been named the most popular public university in the country by *U.S. News and World Report* in its on-line rankings. We are ranked 4th among all Universities, private or public. The three private universities ranked ahead of us are Brigham Young, Harvard and Stanford. UNL is a very special place for undergraduate education.

• CASNR Mission Statement: Since the establishment of the University of Nebraska in 1869 and its commitment to the terms of the Land-Grant College Act calling for the instruction in agriculture and applied sciences, the College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources (CASNR) has provided opportunities for students to develop personally, intellectually and professionally, to meet the challenges of their era. CASNR fosters a student centered learning environment where diverse basic and applied natural, life, earth and social sciences are integrated into the context of a global society and environmental stewardship. Our goal is to prepare students as leaders for a future in which demands on food, energy and water systems will challenge sustainability. The areas of study are broad and span animal, plant, and human health and well-being, earth systems analysis, agricultural production and processing, global climate change, agricultural market structures, water resources, and land-use change. The College also has the responsibility for the coordination of all agricultural sciences and natural resources programs in higher education within the State of Nebraska.

The College enjoyed another successful and productive year as reflected in some selected highlights:

- The Professional Program in Veterinary Medicine Graduates (PPVM) graduated the first 23 students this spring at the Iowa State University College of Veterinary Medicine commencement. Three of the top four students in ISU's graduating class were from the PPVM program.
- Through May 2011, 54 percent of graduates plus PPVM students from 2009 and 2010 have participated in the Salute to Graduates ceremony. Beginning in 2011 PPVM students were not counted in the totals since many participated previously when they received an undergraduate degree and a spring banquet including families provides their promotion recognition. August graduates are invited to participate in the May Salute. Total audience attendance has been nearly 5,000.
- During the past six years (2005-2010) CASNR undergraduate enrollment [includes UNO/CASNR, excludes College of Arts and Sciences (Biochemistry) and College of Engineering (Agricultural Engineering and Biological Systems Engineering) undergraduate students] has grown 48.9%. During the same period UNL undergraduate enrollment grew 13.8% and if the CASNR data is removed from the data set, UNL (excluding CASNR) grew 11.0%.
- The vast majority of our students have a faculty adviser, and some students benefit from professional academic advisers complemented by faculty career mentors.
- Our College has the highest retention rate (90% freshman to sophomore) at UNL.
- We have 40 student organizations that enrich the undergraduate experience.
- During the 2010-2011 academic year, the College awarded 932 scholarships to 800 students amounting to over \$863,644.
- CASNR has a global campus with 69 students studying in 10 countries during the 2010-2011 academic year and summer 2011.
- Nearly 418 students participated in credentialed undergraduate research (56 in UCARE and the remainder in for-credit undergraduate research activities) and another 292 reported that they had a formal internship.
- We are the only College at UNL-and the only College among our peers-that has the "Ensuring Your Future" program which guarantees a job offer in their professional area within the first six months after graduation for those students fulfilling the requirements.
- Our college has one of the only satellite offices of Career Services dedicated to assisting CASNR students with finding internships and post-graduation employment. About 95% of our students (based on survey) find jobs in their fields or continue with their professional education. We routinely have one of the largest Career Fairs on campus with over 500 students visiting with representatives from 65 employing organizations about internships and full time positions last fall
- We are now on Facebook (<u>www.facebook.com/unlcasnr</u>) and currently have 1042 fans.
- Based on the Nebraska Foundation records (through May 2011 graduation), the College has 20,981 graduates.

This annual report is dedicated to Walt and Virginia Bagley in recognition of their generous gift of Prairie Pines to the University of Nebraska Foundation. The 145 acres of land just east of Lincoln will be a research arboretum that will also serve as an outdoor learning laboratory for our students.

The College has a tradition of wonderful students, innovative academic programming, exceptional faculty advising, and successful alumni. CASNR is truly a community of scholars where faculty and students are both teachers and learners.

Dedication



The Eighteenth Annual Report is dedicated to Walt and Virginia Bagley to honor their dedication and passion for resource stewardship and the role of education in sustainability. Walt is a retired forestry professor. Virginia passed away in 2007, but Walt continues the dream that they shared. Walt and Virginia created Prairie Pines for future generations to enjoy and learn about nature. It is a fascinating place of solitude and biological diversity that engages the mind in the importance of environmental stewardship - a lesson all CASNR students should experience.

We are now and forever grateful for the support of our emeriti faculty. The following is a wonderful article that captures the essence of Prairie Pines and its founders -Walt and Virginia:

The birds are loud this morning in May as Walt Bagley, 94, sits on a backyard bench. Virginia's Garden.

Those words are etched on the bench. The retired forestry professor at the University of Nebraska—Lincoln still lives here at Prairie Pines Arboretum, the 145 acres of land just east of Lincoln that he and his late wife,



Virginia, gave to the University of Nebraska in 1992. This was their labor of love, he says. For five decades together, they planted trees and shrubs and native grasses.

He smiles.

"I've told people I've traded in my spade for cane."

Bagley feels good knowing that the gift will continue to help University of Nebraska students and faculty do research long after he's gone. He feels good knowing that, down the road, school kids in the community can come out here and experience the native grasses and nature, the birds and the critters, the wind in the trees like it is this morning – strong enough to make the arboretum sound like the ocean.

He feels good knowing the end of their love story: When he dies, his ashes will be scattered here, too, like Virginia's.

And that their gift of this land to NU will lead to a new beginning for it.

Highlights from the 2010-2011 academic year:

- One of the priorities of the year was distance education. Guests throughout the year who spoke to the Council were Billie Strand from the Office of Extended Education and Outreach, and Kristin Grosskopf from Online Worldwide.
- The CASNR Bylaws were revised and approved by faculty.
- The residency requirements for correspondence and online courses were revised to state, "Students must complete at least 30 of the total hours for their degree using UNL credits."
- Funding was provided by the Dean's Office to have a graduate student work on a quantitative and qualitative summary of the "Image Survey" completed last year.

Monthly meeting agendas also included reports from the CASNR Dean's Office and the Enrollment Management Update Committee.

The Teaching and Learning Improvement Council (TLIC) hosted three workshops on "Moving Toward Systems Thinking." The CASNR 2011 Winter Interim Teaching and Learning Workshop, held January 7, focused on an introduction to systems-thinking, faculty perspectives on systems-thinking, and breakout sessions on how UNL faculty are using a systems-thinking approach in the classroom. The focused workshops highlighted the theoretical basis and practical experience of introducing systems-thinking in the classroom. The TLIC has selected Lisa Karr-Lilienthal from Animal Science as chair of the council for the 2011-2012 year.

Placement Guide for Internal Fracture Stabilization

Open fracture stabilization is an important concern for traumatic limb injury. Research efforts involving a novel material have shown promise which surpasses the performance of current stabilization methods and materials for open fracture stabilization. Testing of this novel material using mouse femur models has given rise to the need for a placement guide for the uniform application of the material around a fracture site. Uniformity of the material at the fracture site is necessary to ensure repeatability, reproducibility and equal distribution of mechanical strength. Therefore, the objective of this project is to design and test a removable placement guide that will contain the novel material and allow for the formation of a uniform, polymerized layer of the material around a fractured mouse femur.

Equipment Redesign

Biomass is considered to be any type of organic material that can be utilized as an energy source. Some common biomass materials are switchgrass, corn stover, wood, and corn cobs. Corn cobs have been used as a biomass feedstock over the past 30 years, but on a very limited scale. The large available quantities and feasibility of transporting corn cobs makes them an attractive option for biomass energy. The design includes a redevelopment of a system based upon a proprietary equipment platform. A prototype of the design was constructed and tested.

Automated Tissue Location and Acquisition System (ATLAS)

The goal of this project was to design an automated process for locating and acquiring images of muscle tissue biopsy samples mounted on microscope slides. The samples are used to better characterize and stage peripheral arterial disease. Utilizing ImagePro Plus software, an automated system was developed to locate and acquire hematoxylin and eosin stained tissue samples at 10X magnification with brightfield microscopy across eight slides. The implementation of this system will save the client both time and hard drive storage space.

Refining a Neck Model for Ultrasound-Guided Fine Needle Biopsy

Ultrasound-guided fine needle biopsy (UGFNB) is a procedure by which a physician directs a needle to the tissue of interest using a real-time ultrasound image. This procedure requires high technical ability and practicing physicians should have access to useful training models. Our project is to design and produce an affordable model that accurately mimics a human neck in an ultrasound image to train physicians for UGFNB. This training will aid the efforts of physicians for early detection of thyroid and lymph node cancers.

Monitoring Breathing While Playing a Stringed Instrument

The design objective is to develop a system that will record physiological responses of respiration and heart rate in real time for string instrument musicians. This system is nonintrusive and does not interfere with the musician's performance. A hot wire anemometer and ear lobe pulse oximeter were used in a head apparatus which displays the information in a Lab VIEW program.

Restoring and Improving Stream Condition Team Members: Kristen Cope, Stacey Joy, Loc Pham Faculty consultant: Dr. Dean Eisenhauer, Biological Systems Engineering Client: Marc Groff, The Flatwater Group

A conceptual design is developed for a small channel running through Camp-A-Way Park in northwest Lincoln. This stream has eroded beyond acceptable limits, and Lincoln Parks and Recreation has contracted with the Flatwater Group to correct the problem with assistance from Senior Design students. The conceptual design is based upon the research of historical and current hydrological data, current stream stabilization methods, and other alternative solutions. Several possible channel designs, from natural to hard armoring, were evaluated with the consideration of the constraints, criteria, and client's wants and needs.

Development of a Microbial Fuel Cell to Recharge Small Electronics

Microbial fuels cells (MFC) are novel low technology alternatives for electrical energy generation. MFC's generate electricity by oxidizing organic matter using exoelectrogenic microorganisms which produce electrons that are ultimately captured and stored or routed through circuits. The goal of this project is to develop a MFC design and prototype that is low cost and transportable around Mali, West Africa, to charge small electrical devices in rural hospitals and clinics. This project will be completed in conjunction with the *World Energy Project*. The target cost is \$300 and the target output is 950 mAh.

Device to Maintain a Sterile Environment in the Operating Room

Surgeons are unable to interact with surgical screens directly due to risk of compromising the sterile field. To circumvent this problem, work was done to develop a single device that a surgeon uses to interact with non-sterile surgical screens and sterile patients. The device is used as a marker and a stylus while maintaining sterility of the device as well as the operating room.

Integrated Energy and Production System

The team completed a feasibility study and initial design steps for an integrated energy and production system incorporating a swine finishing operation, anaerobic digesters, and energy conversion facilities, as well as a soybean crush facility and a biodiesel processing plant. The primary constraints were to limit interference with the existing 55,000-head hog facility located by Wolbach, Nebraska, and size all components to function together efficiently. We proposed constructing six anaerobic digesters and using a gas engine to burn biogas for electricity production, utilizing waste heat from the engine for heating of digesters. The electricity generated from this system would be sufficient to power the existing farm, and the soybean extraction/extrusion process, in addition to a 600,000 gallon/year biodiesel production facility.

Prairie Pines Water Retention Structure

Prairie Pines, a 145-acre property, has been transformed from farmland to an area of diverse woodland and grassland habitats. The purpose of Prairie Pines is to provide an environmental refuge, enhanced arboretum, and horticultural study area in northeast Lincoln, as well as to eventually integrate county extension services, community recreation, and wildlife research and education. The design objective is to specify a water retention structure, such as a pond or wetland, which will be used primarily for educational purposes, such as university research or field trips. It also needs to attract wildlife and construction, in addition to being cost effective. Constraints considered include the amount and quality of water available for the structure, soil types, and accessibility to the site.

Pediatric Breathing Circuit Improvement

This report presents design recommendations to improve an audible airflow byproduct in the Universal Pediatric F2 Breathing Circuit, an anesthesia device produced by King Systems. The purpose of the work presented herein was to identify the source of the excessive noise byproduct and to develop a practical solution to eliminate or reduce the noise in the breathing circuit. Though many approaches were considered, the final design was generated using comparative analysis of the existing King Systems circuit to purchased samples of corrugated tubing of varying length, diameter, corrugation pattern and physical configuration. A protocol for the measurement of sound output was developed for this purpose. Initial testing of the Pediatric F2 tubing suggested that the inspiratory tube of the circuit was responsible for the excessive noise byproduct. Generated data suggested that tubing with a smooth interior surface could greatly reduce sound output, and that the implementation of a coiled configuration into the physical setup of the tubing could help to filter the high-frequency waveforms that produce the high-pitched byproduct. Based on these findings, we recommend that King Systems manufacture a polyethylene inspiratory tube with exterior corrugation and a smooth interior surface, and that King Systems incorporate a coiled configuration into the practical use of the product in hospital settings.

Pilot Scale Purification of Plasamid DNA for Vaccines

Plasmid DNA (pDNA) is a potential alternative to using dead or weakened viruses as vaccines in order to remove any risk of the virus harming the individual. Plasmids have been shown to induce immunity in animals with no adverse responses. As a result there has been a push to begin human clinical trials of DNA plasmid vaccines. Before any trials can be initiated, a method for manufacturing large quantities of high quality plasmid needs to be developed. Nature Technology Corporation (NTC) has developed fermentation and autolytic extraction processes that produce high quality DNA at a bench top scale (10 L fermentation). The goal of this project is to scale up their plasmid DNA harvest and purification process to pilot plant scale (100 L fermentation) while also increasing the quality of plasmid to meet Food and Drug Administration standards for clinical grade. The design uses tangential flow

filtration to harvest the fermentation broth and extract the plasmid. Following harvest and lysis, the plasmid is purified by anion exchange and hydrophobic interaction chromatography. Finally plasmid is suspended in phosphate buffered saline using another tangential flow filtration to remove the elution buffer from chromatography. Recommended equipment, flow rates, and volumes are included in this report.

Small Scale Backflow and Cross-Contamination Educational Model Team Members: Scott Barker, Allison Potter

According to Nebraska Health and Human Services (NHHS), many municipal authorities in small towns across Nebraska are unaware of the detrimental health effects backflow and cross-contamination can have in a community. These towns operate on limited budgets and installation of proper backflow prevention devices to keep water systems updated often does not get sufficient funds or attention. The small-scale backflow and cross-contamination educational model is a tool designed to help visually aid an education program designed to instruct city-council members about the negative effects of backflow and backsiphonage. The goal of this model is to help cities make the correct decision when installing and updating their piping infrastructure.

Minimally Invasive Mitral Valve Surgical Heart Retractor

Heart Surgery has been transformed from the conventional sternum splitting method to a minimally invasive process. This practice is very appealing to patients and surgeons, due to the decreased recovery time and scarring. However, the technology for the surgical instrumentation has not caught up with these contemporary techniques. For a Minimally Invasive Mitral Valve Surgery (MIMVS) today, a simple outdated instrument is used to manipulate tissue in one range of motion. With a reduced incision **size, every millimeter of space impacts the surgeon's ability to safely replace the mitral valve. Through** utilization of past and present technology a novel device was developed allowing the surgeon to have a greater range of motion, while maintaining stability and an uncompromised view space. This device is designed to fit adult MIMVS patients and to be reusable via autoclave sterilization.

North Central Branch of the ESA Linnaean Games Champions

A team of UNL Entomology graduate students, Tim Husen, Jessica Jurzenski, Ken Miwa, and Sean Whipple, won the championship of the Linnaean Games at the ESA North Central Branch annual meeting in Minneapolis, MN, March 13-16, 2011. They received a travel grant to compete at the National ESA Meeting in Reno, NV later this year. The Linnaean Games are a college bowl-style competition on entomological facts played between university-sponsored student teams. Toss-up questions cover knowledge about apiculture, biological control, ecology, economic entomology, medical and veterinary entomology, physiology and biochemistry, taxonomy and toxicology. Bonus questions can come from any area of entomology including history and people. Team coaches were Drs. Ken Pruess and Bob Wright.

Insect science majors, Renee Berger, Jenny Freed, Stephen Losey, Andy Matz, Ginny Morgal, and Katie O'Brien, along with Drs. Fred Baxendale and Lance Meinke spent their March spring break on a study abroad trip in Costa Rica. The group stayed at the La Selva Biological Research Station operated by the Organization for Tropical Studies exploring the lowland tropical rainforest. The group focused on the tropical biodiversity of insects, animals, and plants present in various habitats. Students kept journals, some blogged, and all recorded observations through photography. Highlights were hikes into the jungle, including a night-walk in the rain, plus the sighting of many unusual insects, animals, and birds including large harlequin beetles, the large peanut-headed lanternfly, several species of toucans, and three venomous snakes. Side trips included a tour of a banana plantation and a commercial butterfly farm. The trip was a great learning experience for all and was filled with many stories that will be remembered for a long time.



ALUMNI PROJECTS

The College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources Alumni Association is a constituent society of the College. It is the only alumni association that provides support to the College.

The sixth Football Reunion since the Association became independent was attended by 125 alumni. Eighty tickets were made available for the Idaho game and an informative lunch and program included a silent auction which generated \$9200 for student scholarships. The Henry Beachell Distinguished Alumni Award was presented to LeRoy Thom.

The Salute to Graduates ceremony, a tradition established by Vice Chancellor John Owens and developed by CASNR Dean Steve Waller and his staff, continues to receive praise from attendees. Parents, family, friends, faculty, staff and graduates appreciate its personalized focus and individual recognition. Nearly 5,000 family members and friends have experienced this rich campus environment to attend Salute ceremonies each May and **December in the Nebraska East Union.** An abbreviated version of "Ag College Dreams" is shown during the Salute ceremony. It highlights an interesting 138-year evolution of the College and does a wonderful job of setting the stage for the Salute event. Participating graduates receive the complete 29-minute version as a gift. May 2011 participants were given a mobile app to allow them to access *life after school explained (the definitive reference guide)* as well as live news feeds and other interactive functions with the College.

The May 2011 Salute on East Campus was again well attended. A large graduating cohort of over 200 seniors plus a two-year class of 23 Professional Program in Veterinary Medicine students resulted in 122 students participating. Parents, relatives, faculty and staff brought the total number of people on hand for the ceremony to approximately 780. Closed-circuit TV was provided by Educational Media staff so that graduates, departmental representatives and some guests could watch from overflow seating in the Terrace Dining area.

The Listserv of members and friends of the College is maintained with new subscribers and address updates and provides cost-effective electronic communications. Three issues of <u>The Sower Online</u> were sent to over 1300 alumni and friends with e-mail addresses and two print editions of <u>The Sower</u>, the College alumni newsletter, were mailed to 2000 members with copies of the College news magazine <u>Class Acts</u>.

CASNR Emeriti Faculty are now Alumni Association Honorary Emeriti Life Members, creating an Emeriti Chapter of approximately 150 members.

The College alumni association participated in Salute to Graduates, Senior Send Off, the CASNR Career Fair, Cattlemen's Classic show in Kearney, CASNR Week Banquet and the annual football reunion and benefit silent auction.

The CASNRAA Board met three times: October in Lincoln and February and July in Kearney.



Substitutions and Waivers


The Substitutions-Waiver form gives students the opportunity to request a substitution or waiver of a CASNR core or departmental requirement. The form is initiated by the student, approved by the student's adviser and the department head, and then sent to the Dean's Office for review and final approval. Students must file a request for substitutions and waivers involving courses within the basic four-year curriculum in CASNR before the start of the fall semester for December graduates, before the start of the spring semester for May graduates and prior to the last day of classes spring semester for August graduates. The table below illustrates the number of individual course requests from each degree. Degrees in the "other" category include those degrees with fifty or fewer substitution requests. Those degrees consist of Agricultural Journalism, Environmental Restoration Science, Ecology and Management, Grazing Livestock Systems, Insect Science, Natural Resource and Environmental Economics, Plant Biology, Turf grass and Landscape Management, Veterinary Technology and Water Science.

CASNR Distance Education Programs

We now have several programs that permit students who do not live near UNL to pursue degree programs or certificates. The newest degree program is an on-line degree completion program in Applied Science. This BSAS permits students with two years of college training or an Associate Degree to finish the BS program. The second is a Master of Applied Science program. This program permits place-**bound students to pursue a Master's** Degree in traditional CASNR disciplines or to combine disciplines to create an interdisciplinary training. The MAS contains two specialized certificate programs, Science for Educators and Insect Biology for Educators, that offers training which includes a mix of science and pedagogy for K-12 science teachers. The third CASNR program is the Master of Entomology which currently contains approximately 80 students from the U.S. and abroad. Additionally, CASNR cooperates with two consortia of Universities on a national level, the Great Plains IDEA and the Ag*IDEA, to offer collaborative certificates in Agricultural Mechanization, Community Development, and Food Safety and Defense.

RECRUITMENT ACTIVITIES

The University of Nebraska-Lincoln (UNL) College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources (CASNR) attracts students with a wide range of interests. With 28 degree programs and two preprofessional programs, CASNR offers a variety of interest areas for both rural and urban students. While CASNR has traditionally had a population base that is largely from rural areas, demographic changes in the state have translated to a higher percentage of CASNR students from urban areas. With its mix of degree programs and a steady demand for its graduates, the education and experiences offered through CASNR provide exciting opportunities to all students.

In an effort to recruit students to our College, CASNR partners with UNL Admissions, Nebraska Extension, public and private schools, communities, alumni, stakeholders, business and industry.

CASNR Recruitment Efforts for the 2010-2011 Year Include the Following: *Experience the Power of Red* (November) – Nearly 300 prospective students and parents attended the annual CASNR open house. During the day, attendees had the opportunity to attend sessions to learn more about the degree programs, visit academic program presentations and ask current students questions during lunch. A parent session was also held and highlighted financial aid/scholarships and other programs and services. East Campus tours were also offered.

Contact Campaign - Beginning with invitations (sent in August) for Experience the Power of Red in November, the CASNR Dean's Office contacted more than 2,000 prospective students monthly by email and mail to connect with them, learn about their interests and concerns and answer questions they had regarding coming to UNL and CASNR.

For those students who expressed interests in specific programs, their letters were tailored to their interests.

Seniors interested in CASNR were contacted monthly by the Dean's Office. Academic programs were encouraged to follow up with students with email, mail and phone contacts on an individual basis with students.

Admitted students received a letter of congratulations from the Dean, holiday greetings (if admitted prior to December), admitted student event invitation, and a final mailing. Upon attending New Student Enrollment, students also received a letter inviting them to participate in Dean's Scholars in Experiential Leadership, as well as a mailing informing them on how to get involved on campus. Parents of admitted students received a letter from the Dean highlighting key aspects of CASNR.

In February, all of our admitted students were contacted by ambassadors and other current students who answered questions and gauged their interest in attending UNL.

Admitted Student Event (February) — CASNR hosted a dinner for admitted students and their parents. During the event, students had the opportunity to learn more about our academic programs and departments, meet with faculty and staff, as well as speak to current students.

Partnering with Admissions

Campus Visits – The majority of campus visits start at the UNL Admissions Office with an overview and tour followed by a visit to East Campus, a personal visit with faculty/staff in students' areas of interest and tours, if desired. CASNR hosted nearly 470 campus visits.

Admissions Office Updates – Each August, UNL college deans visit with UNL Admissions staff regarding college updates and programs.

Red Letter Days — UNL open house days had anywhere from 200-500 students and parents visiting campus and included a browsing session as well as general sessions in the morning. Students with interests in CASNR travel to East Campus to join the CASNR Deans, staff and ambassadors for lunch followed by a CASNR presentation, time to visit with faculty members in their areas of interest and a brief tour.

Transfer Workshops and Transfer College Visits – Hosted transfer students visiting UNL and coordinated visits to Nebraska community colleges.

Big Red Road Show – Numerous CASNR Units/Extension areas participated in the Big Red Road Show in Omaha (February). Our area featured a Nebraska snake exhibit, a master gardener to answer questions and a variety of other exhibits. For each activity in which guests participated, visitors were given a CASNR dollar that was exchanged at the CASNR booth for various CASNR prizes.

Business/Extension/Community (Outreach) Partnerships

State Fair (August-September) – Had a display in the Agriculture Exhibition Building. In addition, CASNR distributed candy bars to 4-H and FFA exhibitors and their parents during check-in. CASNR faculty, staff and students staffed the booth during key times. CASNR also hosted the CASNR Amazing Race for UNL students.

Husker Harvest Days (September) – Set-up a CASNR display and talked with visitors during the three-day trade show. Also gave away t-shirts to prospective students who registered for a CASNR scholarship drawing.

York Careers in Agriculture Day (September) – Students from surrounding schools were hosted by Cornerstone Bank; 150 students attended a career session presented by the CASNR Career Specialist.

*Nebraska Farm Bureau Annual Meetin*g (December) – A CASNR booth was on display at the Nebraska Farm Bureau Annual Meeting.

National Cattlemen's Beef Association Convention/Trade Show (February) - Worked with faculty to coordinate booth, personnel, materials and activities to represent CASNR at NCBA annual meeting.

Gudmundsen Field Day, Whitman, NE (April) – Over 200 youth attended an all-day event. CASNR presented information on academics in related areas, UNL and career opportunities.

Denver Stock Show (January) – CASNR was represented at this annual event in Denver. Several faculty, staff and students staffed the display.

World Ag Expo, Tulare, CA (February) — Had a display at the three-day trade show and talked with prospective students/guests.

FFA

National FFA Convention – CASNR hosted a display at this event in Indianapolis, IN, which attracts thousands of students from across the U.S.

State FFA Convention – CASNR had a booth on display at the Cornhusker Hotel, hosted an East Campus scavenger hunt, and provided ten \$500 scholarships to the Career Development Exam (CDE) winners. CASNR also offered East Campus tours and one-on-one visits with professors.

Kansas FFA Convention — Hosted a display at the convention trade show and spoke with prospective students.

UNL Academic Days

(Attracts students who may not be aware of possible CASNR degree programs)

Math Day (November) – CASNR set up a display/hosted an activity for high school students on campus for annual math competition.

Other Events

Science Olympiad (April) – East Campus served as the host for more than 500 Nebraska students who attended this annual event. Science competitions were held in various East Campus buildings and opening and closing ceremonies were held in the Nebraska East Union and Hardin Hall. Every high school first place team in each event was awarded a \$500 CASNR scholarship. Middle school first place teams received a \$100 scholarship for Advanced Scholars Classes. The first place school in the middle and high school division also received a \$1,000 travel voucher from CASNR and the Agricultural Research Division.

Nebraska Cattlemen Ads — In this publication, CASNR had ads featuring the Agricultural Economics, Agronomy and Horticulture, and Animal Science departments.

NEBRASKAland Ads — The School of Natural Resources programs of study are featured in ads in this publication.

EAST CAMPUS VISITORS CENTER

This year was a busy one for the East Campus Visitors Center (ECVC). Traffic has picked up due to the increase in Dairy Store customers. The ECVC is a welcoming place for students and campus visitors alike, as it is both a source of information as well as a starting point for campus visits for prospective students. Approximately 470 campus visits to East Campus have been coordinated through the ECVC, and well over 2,000 visitors have stopped into the Center. The majority of these needed directions to campus departments and attractions.

RETENTION ACTIVITIES CASNR Cares

The College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources (CASNR) developed the CASNR CARES Program – Caring Attitudes and Respect for Every Student in the fall of 2002. The CASNR CARES program provides a single contact for parents, students, faculty and staff seeking assistance in navigating the university's student services programs. The primary goal is to ensure that each student becomes acclimated to the campus environment, engages in his/her own education and has every opportunity to be successful. It also provides a significant resource for family and faculty/staff to identify students that may need assistance in enhancing their educational experience. Our college is committed to the welfare and academic success of each of our students.

The CASNR CARES program respects all standards of confidentiality when gathering and sharing information that may affect a student's academic or personal growth. The program works with the student to develop a course of action to help the student meet his or her academic and personal goals, as well as the goals of the University. Sue Voss, CASNR Student Development and Events Director, is the primary contact for the CASNR CARES program.

Faculty, staff, parents or students can initiate a referral by contacting Sue. She will contact the student, make an appointment to have them come to her office, and then meet with the student to determine if assistance is needed. Without identifying the sources of the concern, the student is encouraged to discuss how things are going, both in and out of the classroom. Students appreciate the attention that is provided to them plus they can learn more about the resources available across campus.

In cases where students must be away from campus due to health or family emergencies, Sue will gather information and can contact the instructors for the student's classes. Letting them know of the student's situations, she will also stay in contact with the student after hearing from the instructors and updating the faculty about the return of the student to classes. Both the student and the faculty members appreciate the information that is provided which helps the student stay current in class. For 2004-2005, Sue had 257 contacts regarding CASNR CARES. For 2005-2006, she had 461 contacts; for 2006-2007 there were 544 contacts; for 2007-2008 there were 422 contacts and for 2008-2009 there were 382; for 2010-2011there were 353 contacts.

Dean's Scholars in Experiential Leadership Program for 2010-2011

Fifty-one freshmen from Nebraska, Hawaii, Oklahoma, Nevada and Illinois participated in the Dean's Scholars in Experiential Leadership (DSEL) program for 2010-2011. This endeavor was created by CASNR in the fall of 2002 to bring students together in the college with an interest in further developing their leadership skills. The exciting program is a great way for students to become fully engaged in the college. It gives them the capacity and confidence to seek leadership positions now and in their professional careers.

Each week, students attend weekly sessions hosted by CASNR Dean Steve Waller and Sue Voss. Students took the testing instrument for StrengthsQuest, a program developed by the Gallup Organization to determine student's top five personal strengths. Other topics include career portfolio development, leadership on campus, study abroad and health and wellness. Teaching Assistants were Derek Dam, Boone McAfee, Julie Kreikemeier and Morgan Wrich. Our student worker who assisted in DSEL was Brooke Grossenbacher.

We were Pen Pals with 68 Hartley Elementary second graders, a neighborhood elementary school. We decorated sweatshirts for our Pen Pals; they keep their sweatshirts at their desk in case the second grader doesn't dress appropriately for the winter weather. We provided hats and mittens during the Holiday Break in December; we made homework kits in February and also sent special invitations to our Pen Pals to attend Community Night in April.

Blackboard

Sue Voss and Jill Brown send out weekly emails to all CASNR students using Blackboard. Emails consist of club meeting information, deadlines, events on campus and information vital to students. The CASNR Career Specialist sends out weekly career updates about companies that are interviewing on campus as well as job openings. Sue also made groups for New Freshmen students, Out-Of-State Students and Students of Color for MANRRS. Contacting these special interest groups throughout the year was extremely easy and quick to do.

TeamMates

Sue Voss was trained at the Mentor Training Program for TeamMates. Several meetings were held to find students who were interested in being a mentor for the TeamMates Program. Eight CASNR students were TeamMates Mentors during the 2010-2011 school year. They were placed at various schools in Lincoln. TeamMates is also a Recognized Service Organization (RSO) through Student Involvement. They hold meetings twice a month and the RSO is open to all students at UNL who are TeamMates. The President for the upcoming school year is Melissa Lein. Linda Major, Kris Baack and Sue Voss are advisers.

CASNR Career Fair

The 2010 CASNR Career Fair was held on Thursday, October 7, 2010 in the Nebraska East Union from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. The CASNR Career Fair was held in conjunction with Career Fair Week, which featured three days of Career Fairs with over 300 employers participating in whole. 518 students and alumni from the University and local community attended the CASNR Career Fair to visit with 64 employing organizations and graduate institutions. Representatives from local, state, and national organizations attended to connect with students as they seek full-time and internship opportunities.

First Annual Companion Animal and Wildlife Career Days

Two Companion Animal and Wildlife Career Days were held during the 2010-2011 school year sponsored by the Department of Animal Science and the School of Natural Resources. Each career day event hosted 50 Nebraska high school students who were interested in animal related careers. The students participated in hands-on activities including companion animal nutrition, anatomy and physiology, wildlife management, and conservation biology. They were also able to ask questions of career panelists which included professionals from pet food companies, zoos and state wildlife agencies. Students had lunch with current UNL Animal Science and Fisheries and Wildlife students to learn more about their internship experiences and other educational and career opportunities while in college. The next Companion Animal and Wildlife Career Day is set for Wednesday, September 28, 2011.

EMPLOYMENT CLASSES

Employment Seminar (AGRI/NRES 388)

Employment Seminar was held on Tuesday evenings from 6-8 p.m. for the first eight weeks of the fall semester and online the first eight weeks of the spring semester. Subjects covered included: Resume and cover letter development; job search strategies on the Internet/Husker Hire Link; job search ethics and job offer evaluation; interviewing and professional etiquette; preparing for a career fair; industry mock interviews; and etiquette dinner and discussion. Fifty-three students participated in the fall and fifteen students participated in the spring.

Job Survival (AGRI 496)

Job Survival was held on Tuesday evenings from 6-8 p.m. for the first eight weeks of the spring semester. Topics included Advice from Recently Employed Students; Effective Communication; Advancement; 401(k)'s, Benefits, Investments; Credit; Entrepreneurship, and Relocation and Housing. The class is team taught by fifteen employers from various industries. Thirty students participated.

High School Visits

"CASNR Career Bingo" and "CASNR 'N' It to Win It" were presented in 64 Nebraska high schools (over 4,427 students) during the 2010-2011 school year.

International Affairs

CASNR is committed to helping its students benefit from international study at UNL in four areas: study abroad, the CASNR International Minor, **Introduction to Global Agriculture and Natural Resources (AGRI 282)**, and Beyond Borders. These areas will enable students to explore the global aspects of their respective degree programs and gain new perspectives of the world so that they will be more competitive in an increasingly global marketplace.

For Study Abroad, CASNR provided \$6,650 in scholarships to 69 students to study in 9 countries last year. Twenty-five CASNR students qualified for \$1,500 each from Global Gateway funds to participate in the Study Abroad Program.

Short Term Study Abroad Opportunities (less than a semester) included group study in Australia, Argentina, Puerto Rico, England, France and Costa Rica, Namibia and Germany. In addition, long-term study abroad (semester or academic year) and internships (supervised work experience) were arranged. Increasingly students are organizing their own unique, long-term or internship experiences assisted by CASNR staff. For 2012 study abroad opportunities led by CASNR faculty will include:

Winter Break 2011-12 – short-term study in New Zealand; Spring Semester – short-term study in Puerto Rico and Argentina; Summer – short-term study in France, Namibia, England, Croatia, Costa Rica, West Africa, and Germany; and Winter Break 2012-2013 in Australia. Summer semester study will be available for individuals in Costa Rica and other countries chosen by students. Internships are planned for Croatia next summer.

The CASNR Minor in International Agriculture and Natural Resources allows students to build a concentration of courses to meet their individual needs within CASNR guidelines. We feel this flexible minor fits well with CASNR degree programs and helps prepare students more broadly for careers in agriculture and natural resources whether they plan for a career in other countries or in Nebraska. Advising for the minor is done by the CASNR Dean's staff and faculty volunteers in other Departments.

CASNR students are required to take at least one "internationally focused course." They may elect to meet this requirement from a long list of courses in languages, geography, political science, economics, anthropology and humanities. CASNR also offers Introduction to Global Agriculture and Natural Resources (AGRI 282). This course helps students learn about global issues and inter-relationships that affect Nebraska. It meets the new ACE requirements for global awareness and human diversity as well as providing some practice with basic skills in teamwork and problem solving.

Beyond Borders is a CASNR student organization. It allows U. S. students to mix with students from other countries, learn about study abroad from other students and faculty leaders, and to fund-raise for their own study abroad. Last year Beyond Borders hosted a "welcome back picnic" in September for students and faculty with international interests, a "holiday international social mixer" in January, information meetings on study abroad programs, and guest speakers on international topics from other universities, the Nebraska Department of Agriculture and a former employee of the United Nations. Beyond Borders was named the outstanding CASNR student organization for 2009-2010.

Graduate Student Enrollment


Graduate student data represents students enrolled on the sixth-day census (Fall 2010) and non-enrolled students actively pursuing graduate degrees. The graduate program in the Agricultural Research Division (College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources and the College of Education and Human Sciences) increased 4.5% from the Fall Semester 2009 to the Fall Semester 2010. Thirty-two percent of the graduate students in CASNR degree programs are supported by assistantships (state appropriated GRA and GTA, fellowships, and international agency or foreign country support). Twenty-five percent of the students in the College of Education and Human Sciences are supported. Twenty-seven percent of CASNR students were not enrolled in IANR graduate programs on the sixth day of the semester.


