## Report On AMS

AMS: the American Musicological Society, www.ams-net.org, founded in 1934.

- Non-Profit
- 3,500 individual members, and 1,000 institutional subscribers from forty nations.
  - (i) 15 regional chapters encompass the U.S. and Canada.
  - (ii) Other countries subscribe to the society and contribute, but chapters and annual meetings are mostly held in the U.S. and Canada.

#### Mission:

- "To advance research in the various fields of music as a branch of learning and scholarship, including teaching and learning about music."<sup>1</sup>
- · Emphasis on transdisciplinary studies.
- Constituent member of the American Council of Learned Societies in 1951.
- · Affiliated with numerous other societies:
  - International Musicological Society, the Music Library Association, the Society for Music Theory, the Society for Ethnomusicology, the Society for American Music, and the College Music Society.
- Publish an online index of Doctoral Dissertations in Musicology.
- Hold annual meetings.
- Chapters hold their own meetings throughout the year, the national AMS meeting happens once a year in November.

### Conferences:

- AMS holds an annual conference/meeting once a year in November.
  - I. The next AMS conference is in Louisville, KT, Nov 12-15.
  - II. Over 200 papers on various topics: Blackface lagacies, gender studies, film music.
  - **III.** Chapters hold their own conferences:
    - **a.** The American Musicological Society Southwest Chapter will hold a conference at Texas State University, San Marcos, on October 10, 2015.
  - IV. Many opportunities every year to attend conferences.
