New York D.^t April 1795-

My dear Sir -

I yesterday received two Letters from Mr. K. & one from you, inclosing you two notes to me for £. 5000, each. To renew two others for the same amount on joint account, which will fall due, on Saturday & payable on Tuesday next -

I observe what you say respecting the aid, you could furnish me, in case the Banks cut me down, on our joint notes, here as yet, they have not done it, my disappointments, proceeded from some other arrangements - I shall not think of using any of the money on Fox's Note, nor the £. 2,500, he has received of Jackson, at present, but wait untill Tuesday next, & see what the Banks will do. & then acquaint you with the result,

I yesterday renewed a note of yours to me, for £. 5000. - at the New York Bank, for at 27 days wh. will be payable the 7.th of May - by discounting another note of yours to me, for the same amount, and now inclose your note, which I took up - I have written several Letters, to Mr. Otto, & am surprized he has not received them, I shall write again to him - I have spoken to Mr. Ludlow about the practice of our insurers - he says, when the policy is done, & delivered up the Brokers receive the premium in Cash - but he is in no hurry - I cannot get well - but -

but am better than I was, I feel infinitely, for you & My sister
on account of your health, & pray constantly for the restoration of
it, which God grant, & give you spirits, to support yourselves, under
it.

This moment I rec^d Susan's Letter of yesterday. The news of
the rise of Bank shares, in London, had reached this, some days since
& has given them a great rise here - but there are very few for
sale - Mr. & Mrs. R. left us on Monday - I am yr^s affectionately
