My dear Sir -

I wrote to you, on Wednesday. informing you of my safe arrival, & having found all well - Yesterday was employed in paying visits, - & attending the discount - The prep for Money continues here, as great as ever, very little doing in Stocks - The best notes are offering here at a discount of 2, & 1/2 p. 6^t pr Month - there was no discount yesterday at the New York Bank - it being with them a Holy day, of course it increased the prep for money - I think I shall offer one of your notes for \$5000, at the New York Bank on Tuesday for discount, & endeavour to employ it on joint account, if I can get 2 & 1/2 p. 6^t pr Month - most of our direction, have already given their proxy; to Mr Wm Henderson, who sets out to day, I understand for Philadelphia - I shall leave the forms of proxy; to day with a notary, & get such of my friends as have not given Henderson their proxy; to give them to you -

you & send them on by to morrows post.
