STUDIES IN THE LIFE HISTORY OF THE 'ALALA IN CAPTIVITY*

This illustrated report describes observations on behavior of hand-reared 'Alala (<u>Corvus tropicus</u>) maintained as captive breeding stock at the State of Hawaii's Endangered Species Project, Pohakuloa, Hawai'i. The development of husbandry techniques and the problems and experiences related to establishing and maintaining a breeding population of 'Alala in captivity will be briefly discussed as well as the objective study of social, instinctive, and reproductive activities of the only six 'Alala in captivity.
