SOME RECENT BIOLOGICAL DISCOVERIES IN HAWAI'I, PHOTOGRAPHED ALIVE

Featured in color photographs are such undescribed Hawaiian animals as a flightless, carnivorous "seed bug" (Lygaeidae) from the near-14,000 foot summit of Mauna Kea, and a wingless, songless, salt-water adapted cricket (Gryllidae) from splash-zone rocks at Kaimu Beach, Big Island. Featured plants include members of two endemic genera of Hawaiian mintless mints (Labiatae), photographed in flower in 'Ola'a forest, Big Island.
