

PREFACE

IT WAS in April 1969 that Dr. Kenneth P. Emory and I were greeted by Dr. Mulloy at the airport on Easter Island. This was my only meeting with Dr. Mulloy, although we had corresponded before that time and continued to do so thereafter. In particular, we shared an interest in restoration projects. He invited me to participate in his project on Easter Island, but unfortunately this was never realized. I admired his thorough and meticulous work, which gave me useful suggestions and models for my own work in the Society Islands.

One night on Easter Island while we were talking, I was drinking tea. Dr. Mulloy handed me a piece of paper, and I saw "This is a Japanese tea bag" written in perfect Japanese characters. I was astonished that he understood Japanese, and I asked when he had learned it. He told me that soon after he was drafted into the army, his superior officer had noticed him flipping through a special edition of *Life* magazine on Japan. In no time he was sent to the army's Japanese language school, where he studied the language night and day. That training was so intense, he said, that when he was released from military service he was "sick and tired" of looking at Japanese characters. I shall always remember this incident and I am sorry that this was the only occasion of our meeting.

For this memorial volume, Dr. Mulloy's colleagues, students, and other followers of Easter Island studies have contributed papers. In serving as coordinator, I have been pleased to receive positive responses. I believe that this volume is representative of the research stimulated by Dr. Mulloy's devotion to Easter Island culture and history.
