

Q: Which of these 4 areas is a wetland?









A: All four.

An area doesn't need to have standing water to be considered a wetland. History of drainage, soil type and other factors are considered. To stay eligible for USDA programs, know the status of wetlands on your land.

The bottom line: Check with SCS before you drain.
