Applied Geriatric Practice is an in-depth course focused on geriatric physical therapy practice. Instructor wants to locate an open educational resource that is available to students, and ideally one that has a teacher's manual that accompanies the text that is not available to students. The OER will be used to supplement current course materials, but may or may not replace the presently used text.

Search Notes

This search focused on finding a suitable open textbook on physical therapy for geriatric patients. Additionally, the instructor specified that they would prefer to have a teacher's manual that accompanies the OER and is not available to students. The OER search consulted OpenStax, OER Commons, BCcampus, Open Textbook Library, Merlot, Galileo and Rebus for suitable OER options. We extended the search to other education platforms for open resources and considered alternative formats to textbooks. However, the search did not find a specific OER textbook ideal for this course, or a teacher's manual. The OER options listed below may prove useful for adaption and creation of course-specific OER.



Gap Analysis

There are significant gaps in this search. There are few physical therapy OER and many health care related OER that include geriatric care, but no solid OER specifically on physical therapy for geriatric patients. Due to the gap in current OER there is a clear need for creating such an open resource. Since the instructor contributed to the currently used textbook and is an expert, there may be an opportunity to create a high-quality OER that would benefit themselves, their students, and other physical therapy educators. The existing resources listed in this search may provide a base for the OER, or certain chapters be suitable for adaption as supplemental material in the class - but a specific OER is needed to cover this subject.

Although the resource is not specifically written for geriatric patients, it covers topics including interventions and assessment for patients with Guillain-Barre and spinal cord injury, respiratory assessment and interventions, and proprioceptive neuromuscular facilitation. It is a candidate for a resource that could be adapted for this course context.

 nurses to feel confident in caring for dying patients and their families. The text is entirely
 focused on end-of-life care, and will only be useful if the course wants to address
 palliative and end-of-life under geriartic care. It is not ideal for physical therapy, but
 perhaps Part 1, Section 5 "Initiating conversations about goals of care" make an an OER
 chapter fit for adaption.
