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- Current Holdings
 - Monographs (print and ebook)
 - > Databases and journals (# of full-text articles, # of peer-reviewed full-text, # of peer-reviewed full-text last 10 years)
 - > Journal titles, database holdings, date ranges
 - Borrowing agreements with other libraries: Network of Alabama Academic Libraries (NAAL)
- Additional Collection Needs
 - Approximate monograph budget for program
 - Possible journal/ebook collection/database subscriptions to add





Campus

- Basic Formula
 - > # of books allocated x average price per book = program allocation
- Program Level Allotments
 - Certificate programs 4 books
 - Minor programs 4 books
 - ➤ Major programs 8 books
 - Graduate programs 12 books
- Exceptions
 - ➤ New programs level allotment + 3 books
 - Covered by O'Reilly Higher Education level allotment / 2

 - Covered by O'Reilly: 12 books / 2 = 6 books
 - ➤ New Programs: + 3 books
 - Year 1: 6 books + 3 books = 9 books
 - Year 2: 6 books


