

WHO IS THE GIBBON SURGICAL SOCIETY NAMED FOR?

DR. JOHN H. GIBBON FORMER CHAIRMAN OF SURGERY

John H. Gibbon Jr., M.D., Jefferson professor and chairman of the Department of Surgery (1956-1967), is renowned in medical history as the inventor of the heart-lung machine, which made possible the world's first successful open-heart operation at Jefferson in 1953. Dr. Gibbon focused international attention on Jefferson by ushering in a new era of cardiac surgery.



FACULTY LEADERS

DR. CHARLES YEO

Dr. Charles Yeo graduated from Princeton University in 1975 and attended medical school at Johns Hopkins University, where he was elected to the Alpha Omega Alpha and Phi Beta Kappa honor societies. He completed his residency at Johns Hopkins before pursuing a research fellowship at SUNY Downstate. He joined the faculty at Johns Hopkins in 1985. In 2005, he was named the Samuel D. Gross Professor and Chairman of Surgery at Jefferson. Dr. Yeo's major accomplishments have been in the fields of surgical education, clinical care of patients with complex hepatobiliary diseases, and pancreatic cancer research. Dr. Yeo is well-acclaimed for the Whipple procedure, and was the first to develop the mini-Whipple. He also serves on the Board of Trustees at Jefferson. 
RYAN NACHWALTER




BRIGITTE ANDERSON
