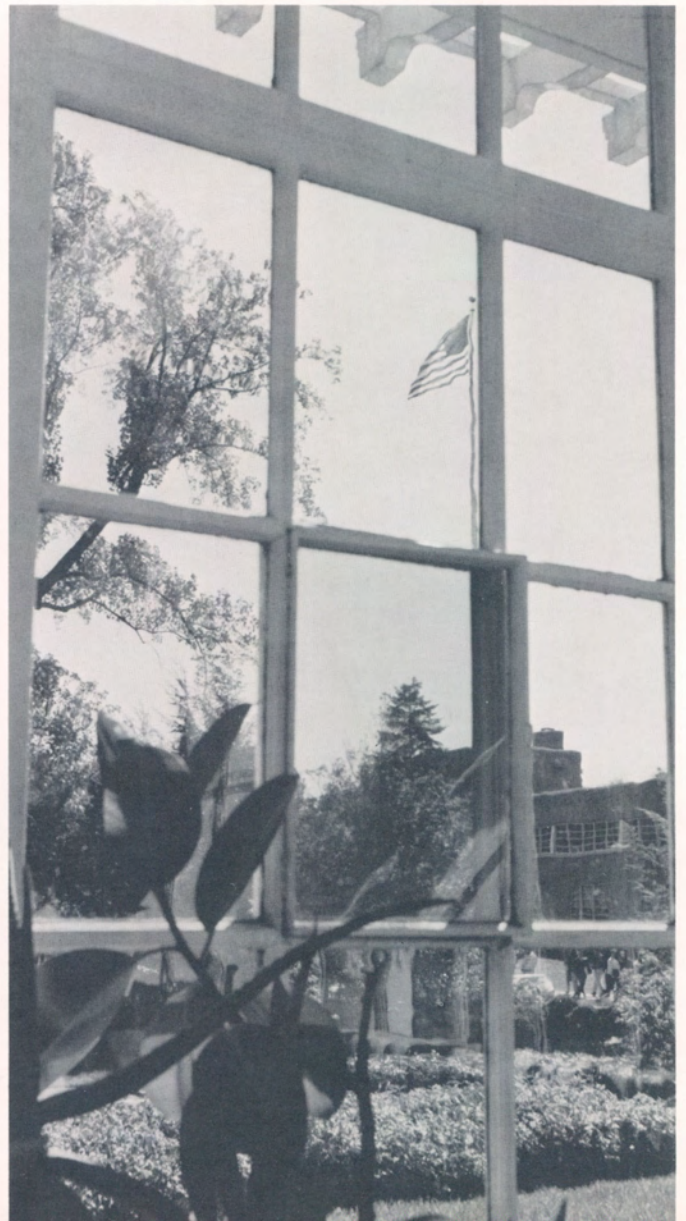












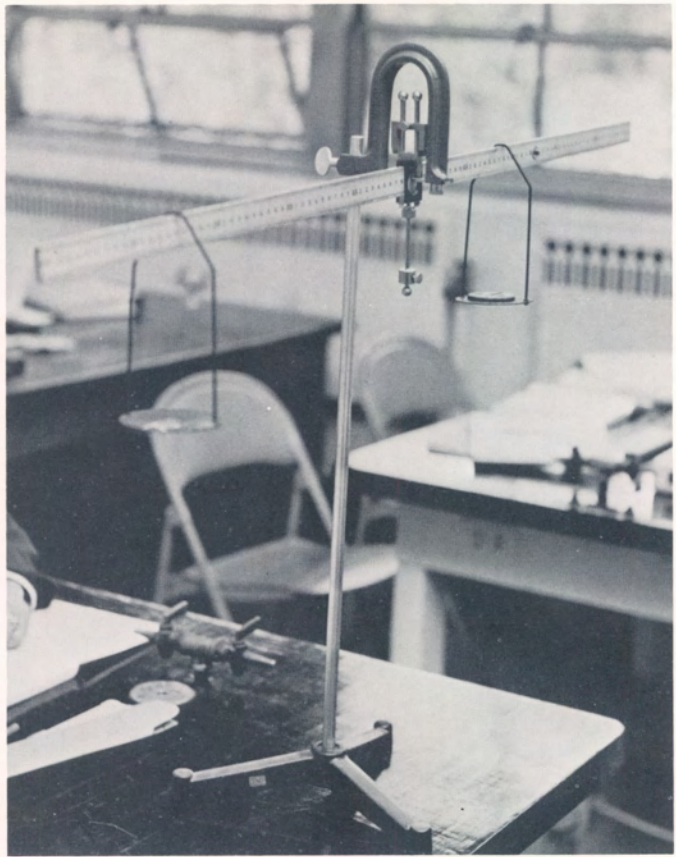






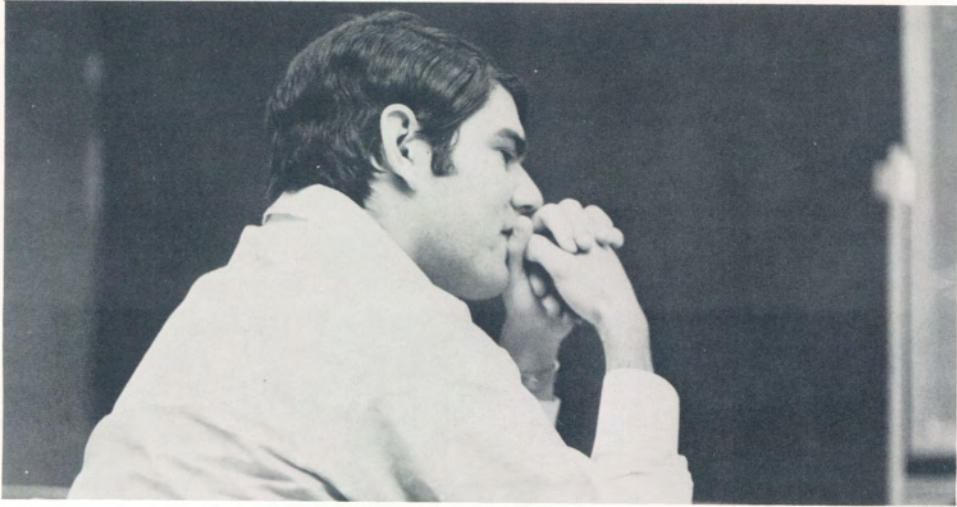
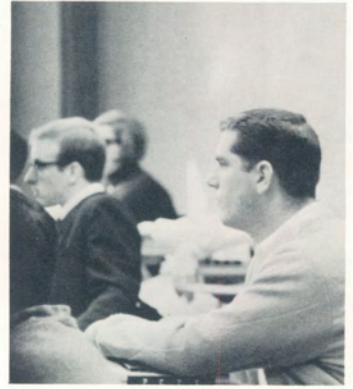


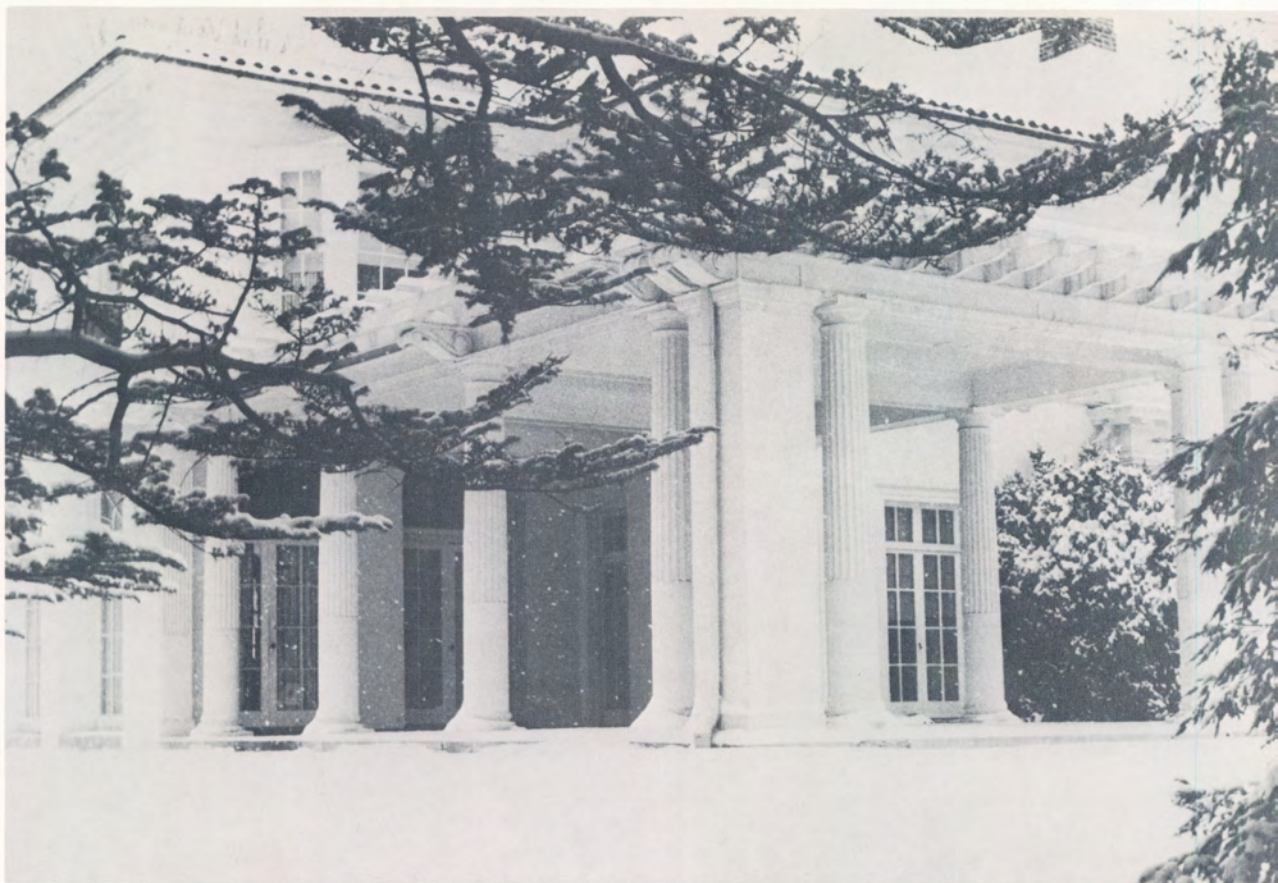




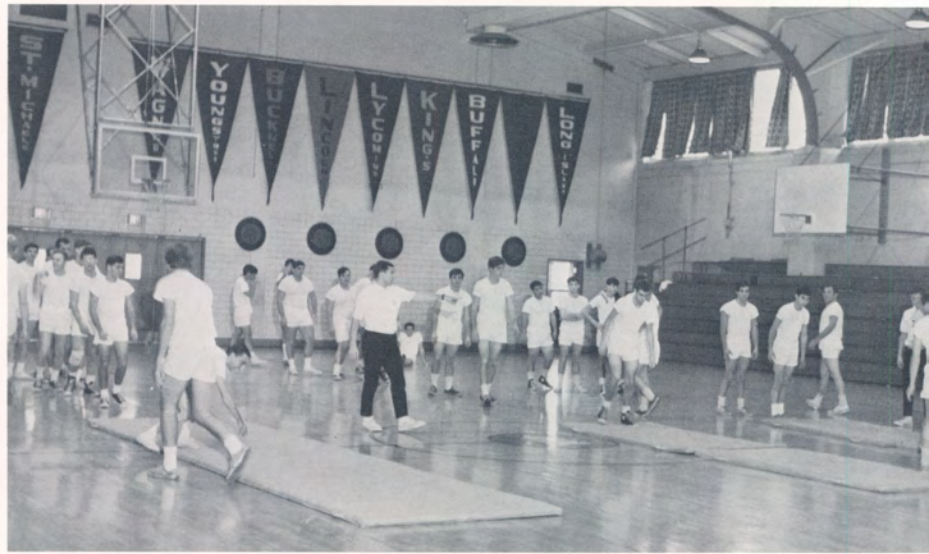


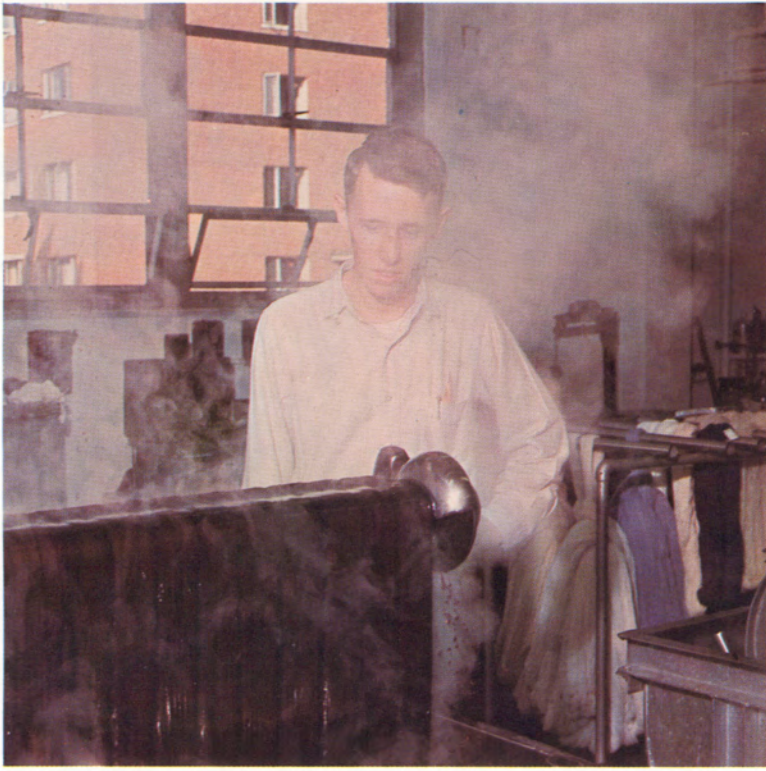


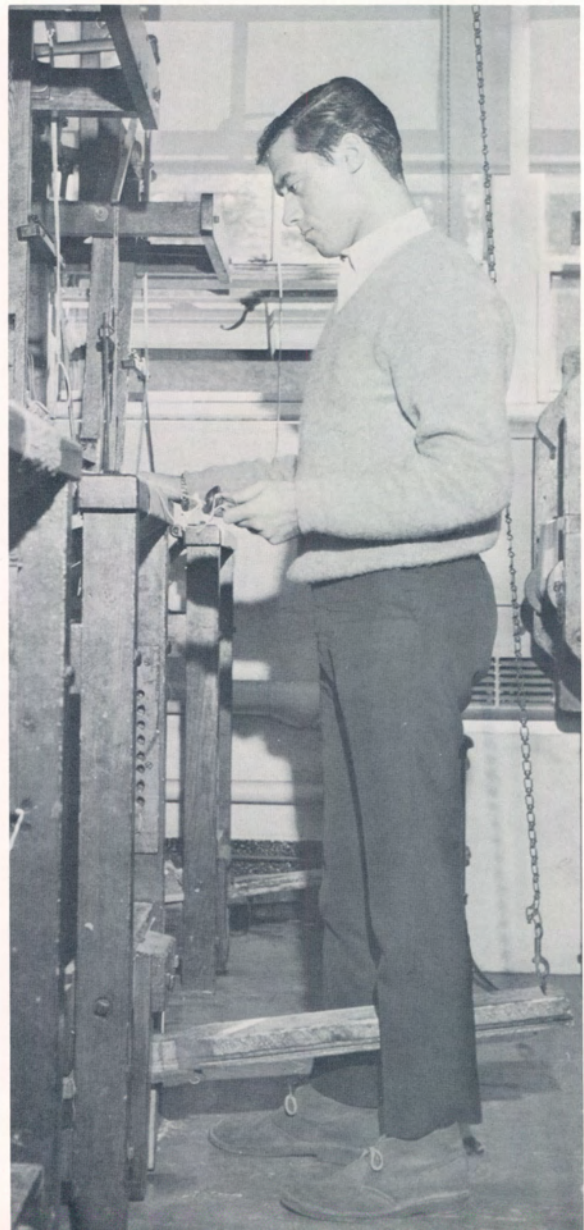






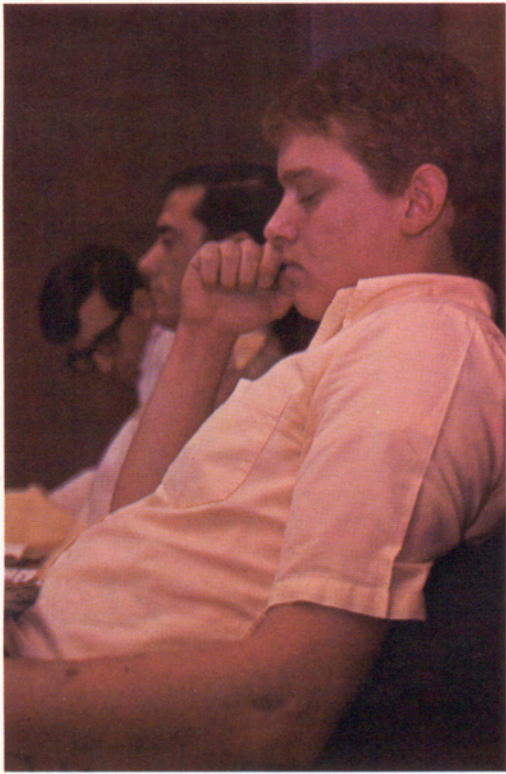














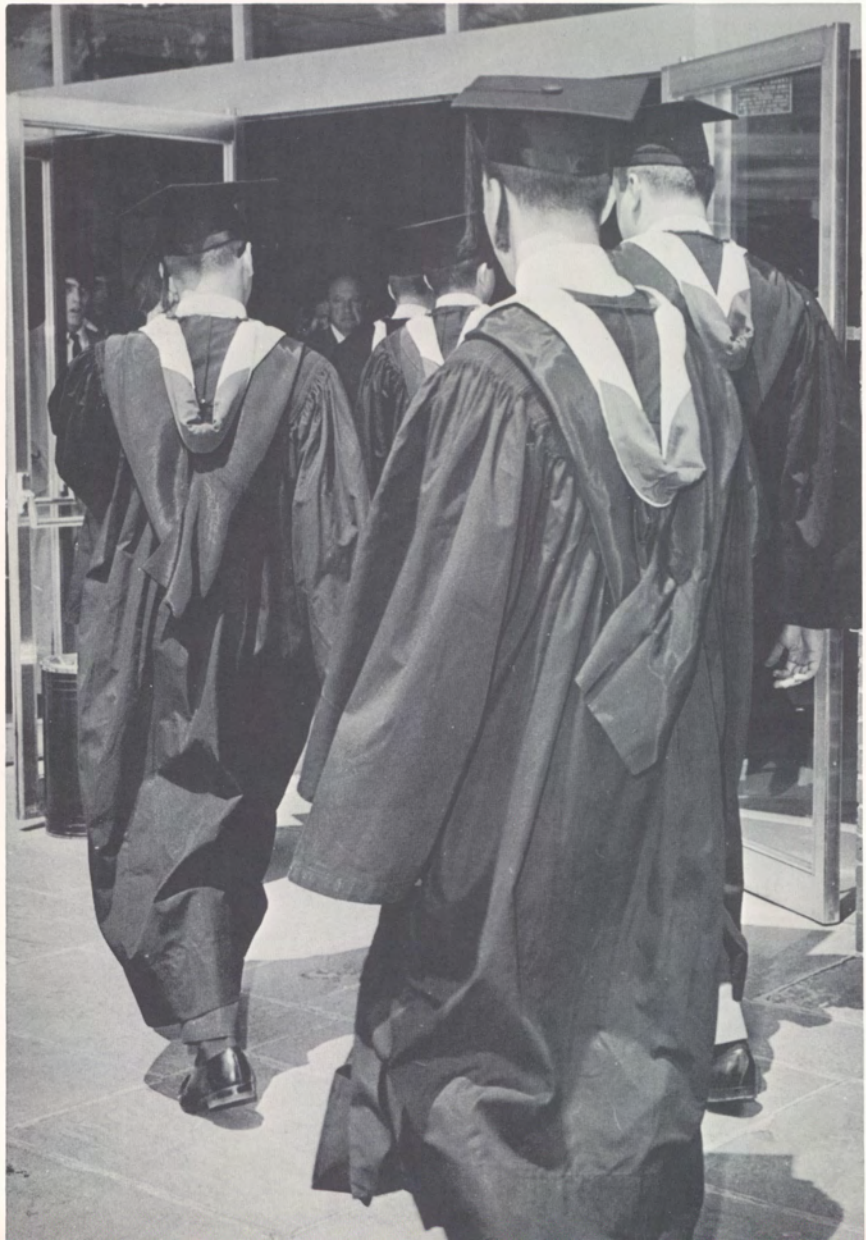














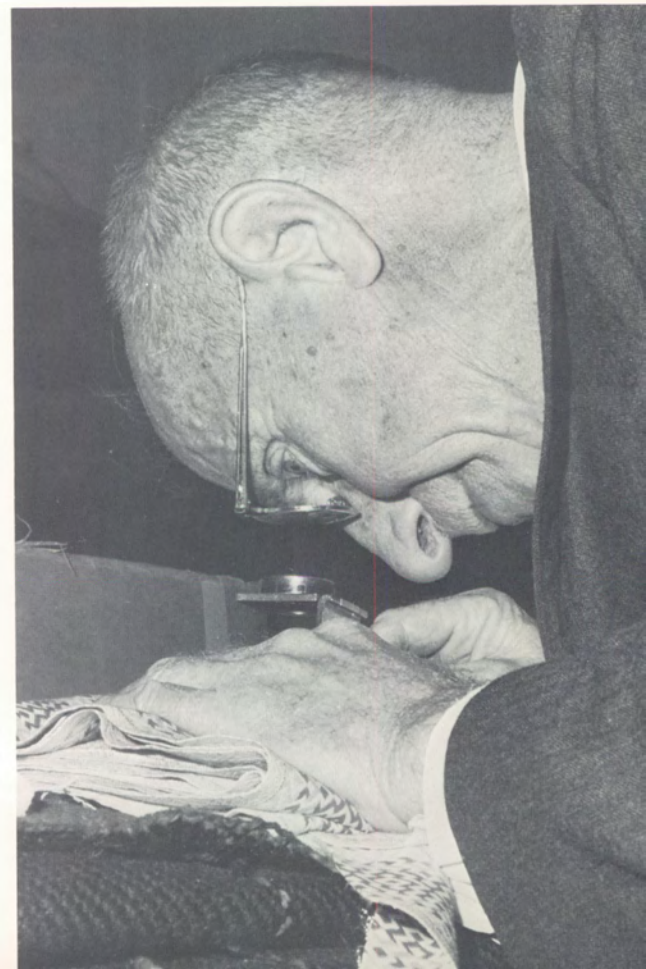
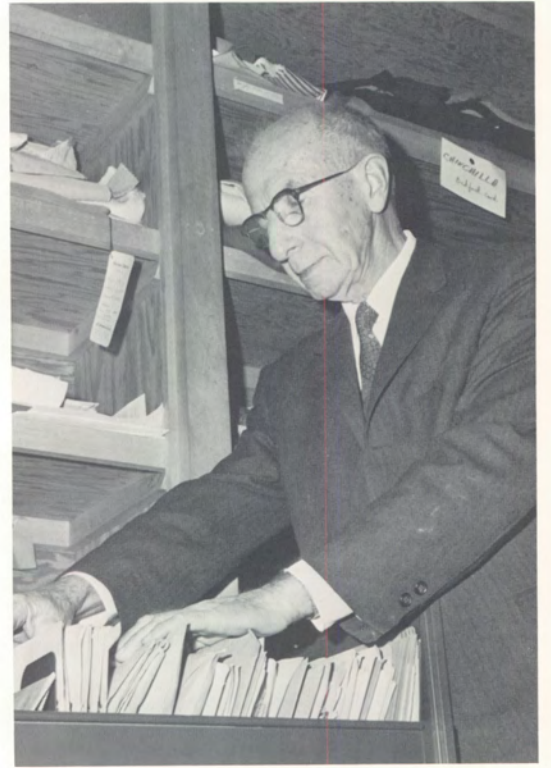


DR. FRANK L. GEISE

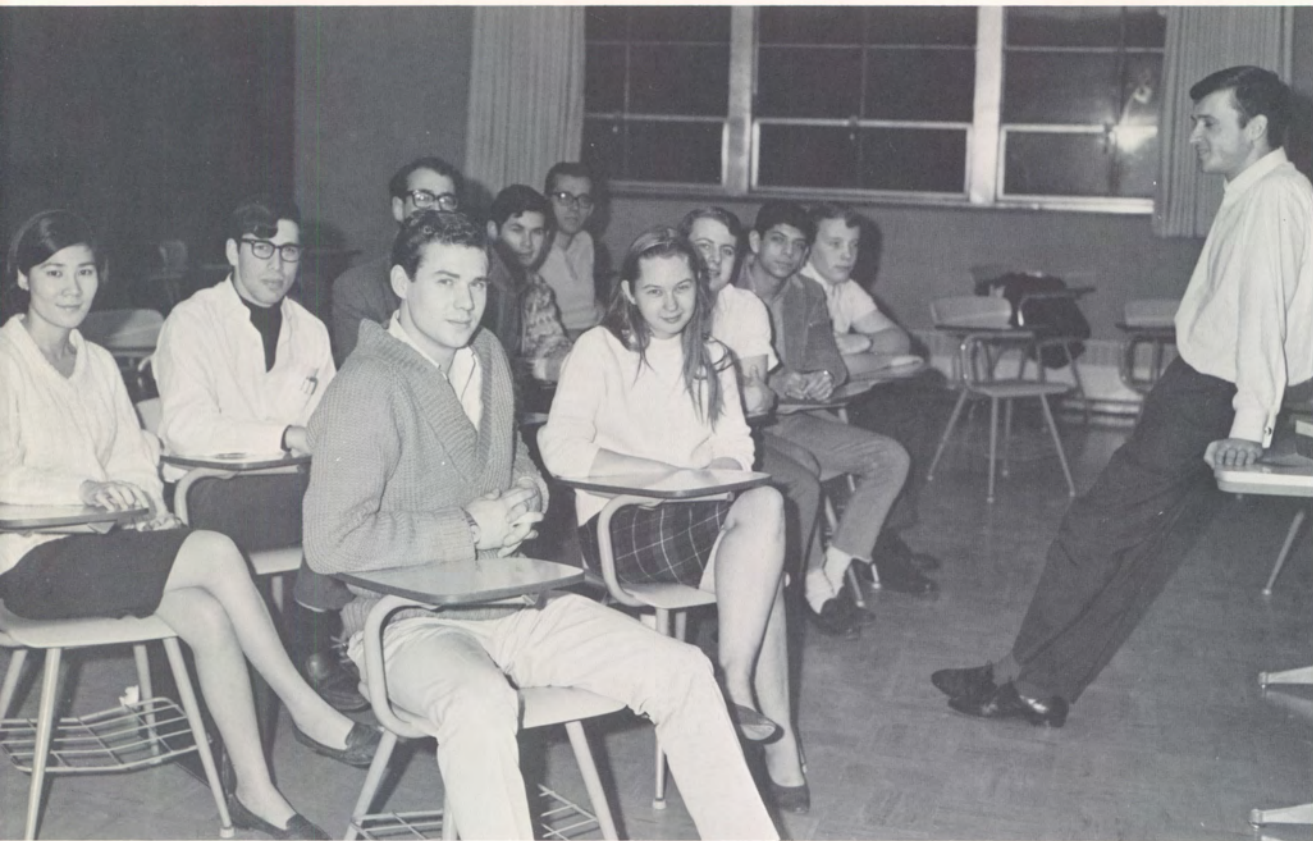

The brothers of Phi Epsilon Pi hope to go further in advancing their fraternal feelings to their fellow brothers and to help in their assistance to the community.



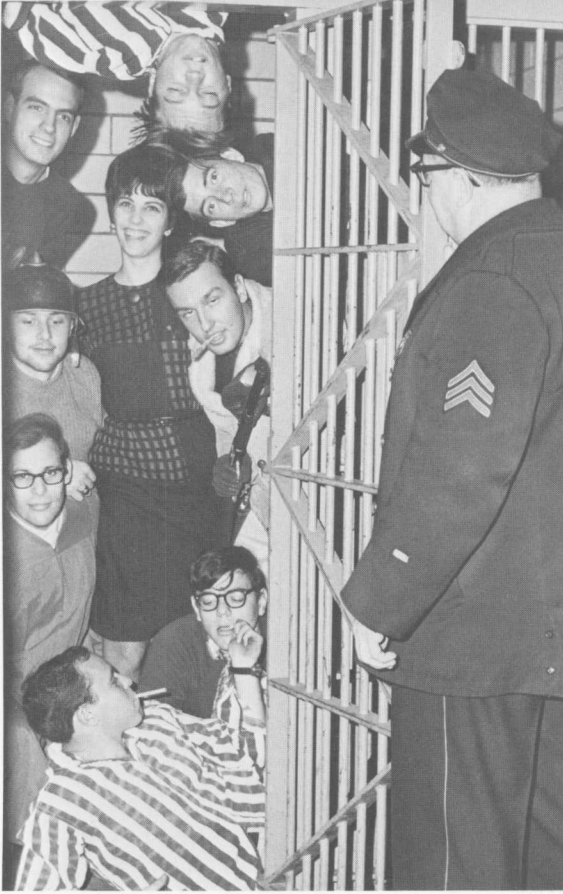

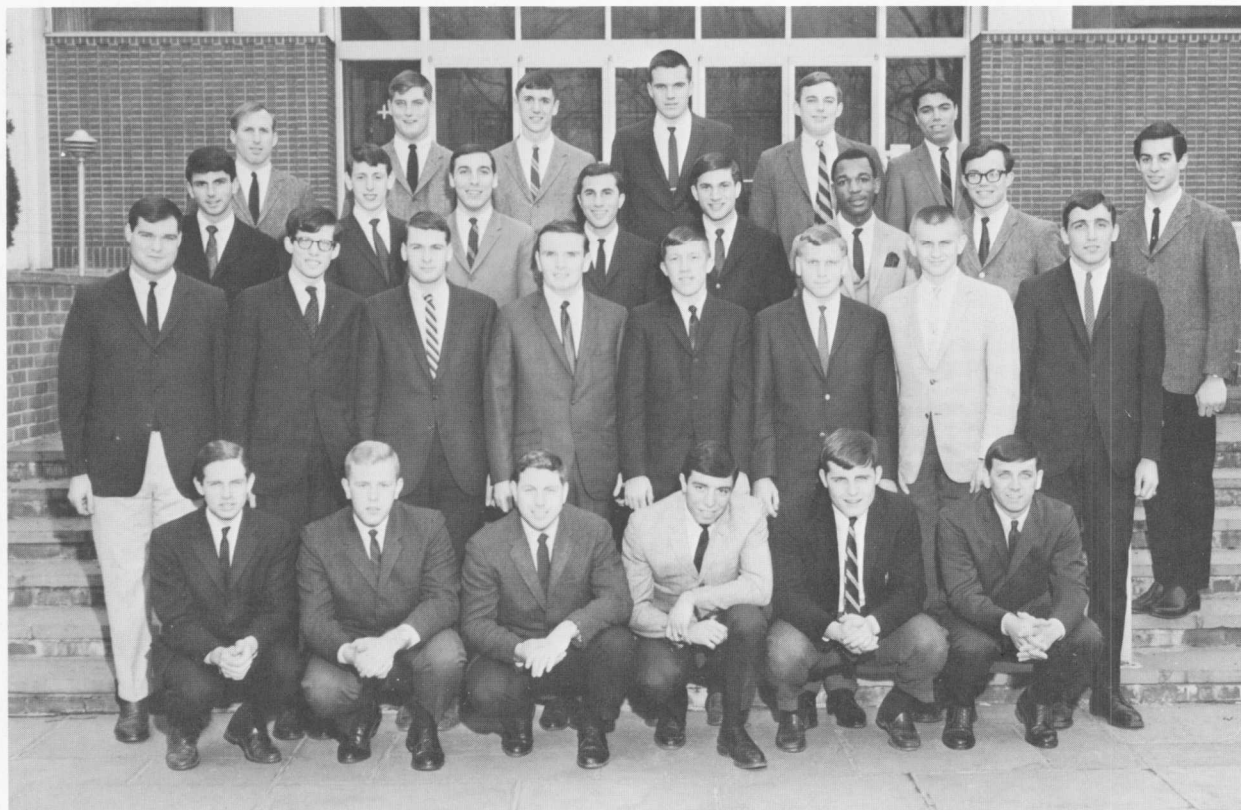


BASEBALL
