In addition, the quintet performs concerts and master classes throughout the region. Tours are undertaken annually. Concert programs include repertoire from Renaissance brass to contemporary brass quintet compositions and jazz.

BIOGRAPHIES

NICHOLAS LIEBL recently graduated with his Master's Degree from the University of Arkansas and currently instructs the tuba studio for Fall 2018. He actively works with high schools and junior highs in the NWA. He has performed with the SoNA ImagiBrass Quintet, Arkansas Philharmonic, ClearWater Brass Quintet, and the Chippewa Valley Symphony Orchestra. He has studied with Dr. Jerry A. Young, Dr. Jeff Hodapp, Mr. Donald Little, and Dr. Benjamin Pierce.

CORY MIXDORF is thrilled to be a part of the distinguished faculty at the University of Arkansas. He holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Northern Iowa as well as Master of Music and Doctor of Music degrees in trombone performance from Indiana University.

While maintaining a strong studio, Dr. Mixdorf sustains a regular schedule as a guest artist and clinician on the national and international levels. TIMOTHY F. THOMPSON is Professor of Music at the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville, where he has served on the faculty since 1979. He is hornist with the Lyrique Quintette, a woodwind quintet in residence at the university, as well as the Arkansas Brassworks.

Dr. Thompson earned the degree of Doctor of Musical Arts, as well as Master of Music, from the University of Wisconsin. He earned a Bachelor of Music degree from the University of North Carolina. Principal horn teachers were Douglas Hill and Boris Rybka. Additional studies included work with Dale Clevenger, Roland Pandolfi, Wayne Amick, and Jack Masarie.
