To the inhabitants of the Town of Winchester, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet in the town hall in said Winchester on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To receive reports of the selectmen, town treasurer and other town officers, including agents and committees, and act thereon.

Art. 2. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Town Officers' Salaries the ensuing year.

Art. 4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Town Officers' Expenses the ensuing year.

Art. 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Election and Registration Expenses the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Municipal Court expenses the ensuing year.

Art. 7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Expenses of Town Hall the ensuing year.

Art. 8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Police Department the ensuing year.

Art. 9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the Fire Department the ensuing year.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to pay the firemen anything in excess of the amount allowed by law.

Art. 11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise to defray the expense of Forest Fires.

Art. 12. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the Health Department the ensuing year.

Art. 13. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the purpose of aiding the Winchester District Nurse Association the ensuing year.

Art. 14. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for obtaining and recording Vital Statistics the ensuing year.

Art. 15. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Sewer Maintenance the ensuing year.

Art. 16. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Town Highway Maintenance the ensuing year.

Art. 17. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Oiling Streets and applying Chloride.

Art. 18. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Snow Removal and Sanding.

Art. 19. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for General Expense of Highway Department.

Art. 20. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Street Lighting.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to accept Town Road Aid for construction of Class V roads and raise the sum of \$792.05.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$300.00 for the Winchester Public Library or act thereon.

Art. 23. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the Support of Town Poor the ensuing year.

Art. 24. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance the ensuing year.

Art. 25. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day.

Art. 26. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the Care of the Common.

Art. 27. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the Care of Cemeteries the ensuing year.

Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$190.00 to the Monadnock Region Association of Scenic New Hampshire for issuance and distribution of printed matter newspaper and magazine advertising, calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town in cooperation with the other 37 towns in the Monadnock Region.

Art. 29. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Damage and Legal Expense the ensuing year.

Art. 30. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes for 1941.

Art. 31. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for payment of Interest on temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 32. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for payment of interest on Long Term notes.

Art. 33. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to reimburse the State of New Hampshire for the town's share of the over run on the cost of the construction of the State Aid Bridge on Route 10.

Art. 34. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Cement Bridges or Culverts and Railings the ensuing year.

Art. 35. To see how much money the town will vote to raise to properly drain and resurface Chapel Street or act thereon.

Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$5,000.00 to be applied in payment of Long Term Notes.

Art. 37. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to acquire bulldozer equipment for use with the caterpillar tractor.

Art. 38. To see if the town will vote to grant the Fire Department, the American Legion and the School District the free use of the town hall as was granted last year.

Art. 39. To see if the town will vote to grant the High and Center Schools or any auxiliary organizations thereof the same use of the town hall as was granted last year.

Art. 40. To see if the town will vote to raise \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust in cooperation with the State Forestry and Recreation Department.

Art. 41. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for playground, skating rink and other recreational activities at the Community Center.

Art. 42. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$350.00 to install a drain and repair and oil the road on Hildreth Street.

Art. 43. To see if the town will vote to raise \$1,000.00 to continue the work on the Rabbit Hollow road, beginning at the Cemetery and continuing north as far as the money will go.

Art. 44. To see if the town will vote to remove the snow left next to the Center School grounds from plowing Main and Parker Streets from entrance to Thayer Library to school gate

on Parker Street and including the triangle at the end of Parker Street, raise money therefor, or act thereon.

Art. 45. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to build a cement sidewalk on Richmond Street beginning at the Prentice Grocery and extending to the cross street by Dwight Holton's house.

Art. 46. To see if the town will vote to authorize the appointment of a Town Water Committee of three persons to further the investigation of a town water supply, said committee to submit a formal report on August 5, 1941.

Art. 47. To see if the town will vote to hold an adjourned town meeting on August 5, 1941 to receive the report of the Town Water Committee and to take such action, including the raising and appropriating of money, as may be desired.

Art. 48. To see if the town will vote to establish a Town Planning Board, the members to consist of one Selectman and four citizens the board members to be appointed by the Selectmen.

Art. 49. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

WHITE PINE BLISTER RUST CONTROL

White Pine Blister rust control as conducted in this town during 1940 by the State Forestry & Recreation Department and the Federal Bureau of Entomology was a part of a nation-wide program of protecting white pine growth from a bark disease, which, though not spectacular, represents a very serious menace to this tree if not controlled. Throughout the north-eastern states, where white pine is especially important, counties, towns, cities, and individual owners have cooperated with State and Federal agencies. In the Far West, upon the National Forests and holdings of large lumber companies, Blister Rust control is recognized as a necessary practice in growing white pine. Recently, the Federal Government reaffirmed and emphasized the need of White Pine Blister Rust control by the passage of an act authorizing financial assistance to such states as are carrying on control measures. All towns and their citizens are strongly urged to cooperate with the State and Federal governments in their efforts to maintain control of this destructive disease.

This last year has been an unusually busy one, with a greater number of visits being made in the behalf of patients. This winter, the community suffered an epidemic of the grippe, which necessitated the closing of schools for a few days, but the people, in general, were very cooperative in attempting to prevent the spread of this epidemic.

The annual Pre-School Clinic was held in May this last year and was a big success, more than 60 children attended this clinic and of this number, 42 received toxoid for diphtheria. The children were examined either by Dr. Fox or Dr. Daniels, and the results of those examinations were discussed with the individual parents.

In April, I attended a regular monthly meeting in Concord of public health nurses.

Miss Winifred Bonham, Red Cross field supervisor, visited this service in March and again in November.

Miss Priscilla Putnam, R. N., substituted on the district during the month of August.

Last year, a community welfare committee was formed, with representations from various organizations; this committee is again doing a fine piece of work this year, collecting and repairing old clothing, as well as making new articles, which have been distributed among the needy children and families.

The community also responded very well to the raising of a Milk Fund last year for undernourished and needy children, so that it was possible for 100 children to receive milk daily in school; 50 of these children paid 15 cents a week, and the other 50 received it without charge. It was also possible for all elementary school children who deserved and needed cod liver oil to receive it through the winter months, and two pair of glasses were also paid for through this fund.

The headquarters, or office, of the District Nursing Association was changed from the former residence on Main St. to the Community House. The present location is a much more desirable one with all conveniences. The Well-Baby Conferences are held here once a week and still continue to be popular with the mothers.

REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD

To the Citizens:

One of our major and most important problems at this time is the heating system in the Center School at Winchester.

The present system is made up of four separate units consisting of one small steam boiler and three hot air heaters. The steam boiler is in fair condition but of very limited capacity. The hot air heaters are all in very poor condition, constantly in need of repairs, inefficient, and excessively expensive to operate. They have never been adequate in severe weather and, because they have to be over-fired in order to heat the building, are now in serious condition.

Also, the foundation under one of the immense brick hot air flues has settled and is pulling the south end of the building down with it. Emergency repairs have been made on the heaters and the brick flue has been cribbed up to prevent further collapse of the building.

To repair and renew the present system would cost about \$1,800 and we would still have an inefficient heating plant. Your school committee feels it would be better to eliminate the present system entirely and install one steam boiler with radiation distributed throughout the building to heat it easily

and properly. A boiler large enough to do this would consume 30% less fuel annually than the present heaters require and would also eliminate repair bills of from \$75 to \$100 per year now necessary to keep them operating.

After careful study and survey by competent engineers, we are advised such a system, with a sufficient number of radiators to efficiently heat the entire building, can be installed at a cost not to exceed \$2,600.

Accordingly, for your consideration, we are inserting an article in the school warrant relative to this question and respectfully suggest to citizens interested that they visit the Center School and inspect the heating plant now in use in that building.

I hereby submit to the Superintendent of Schools my annual report for Thayer High School.

Four junior high boys do not appear in the above classification. Pupils in high school number 140, in the junior high 91, making for the building a total population of 231. High school enrollment decreased by about 15 from that of last year. This was due to a smaller entering class. The junior high enrollment increased nearly one-third. This is accounted for by the transfer of the grades 7 and 8 from Ashuelot to this building. With a 7th grade numbering 51 it has been necessary to divide the class into two sections for many of their classes.

The resignation of Miss Mary Connor to accept a position in the Newburyport high school was the only break in the faculty from the previous year. Miss Eileene Carlson of Springfield a graduate of Wheaton and Cornell, was secured to fill this vacancy in the Latin and French department. An additional member was added to the faculty this year. Miss Marie Donahoe of Natick, Massachusetts, a graduate of Regis

college, is the additional teacher. She has taken over some Social Science and English classes.

One addition has been made this year to the list of the extra school activities. A Camera Club was organized late in the fall and considerable interest is evident. One of the supply closets has been made over into a work room and members are now doing developing and printing.

In addition to the regular work of the Home Economics department, the classes assisted various organizations in town at luncheons, and dinners, working both in the dining rooms as waitresses, and in the kitchen. In one case, they took full charge of the kitchen so that all members of the organization could be present at the meeting. They served a luncheon to the Supervisory Union in the spring, and in the fall they made the place cards and favors for the dinner held by the teachers of Supervisory Union No. 25.

In the fall two of the girls were in charge of the canned goods and needleworks displays at the fair.

At the baby clinic held by the State Department of Health a group of the Junior and Senior girls assisted the doctors and nurses in charge. This was a help to the officials, and also gave the girls a chance for some actual experience, in the field of child care, of a type which they would not otherwise have had.

Seven boys were graduated from the Vocational Agriculture department in 1940. Of these, two are employed in permanent agricultural occupations, three are enlisted in the U. S. army, and two are employed locally in related agricultural occupations.

Supervised farming activities provide opportunity for boys to assume responsibility, develop planning and managing ability, and acquire a gradually increasing equity in the business of farming. Livestock projects of poultry and dairy cattle and potato crop projects represented the most successful programs.

Exhibits of farm products raised by Thayer F. F. A. boys won the local chapter a five dollar prize at the Cheshire County Fair and various individual prizes for the exhibitors.

The Future Farmers staged their fifth annual and most successful F. F. A. Fair in October with fine cooperation of local farmers, industries, and other individuals.

Regular instruction in crop and livestock production and management, making use of field trips, local case studies, supervised study and class discussion, have formed the basis of most of our class work.

Farm mechanics and shop work, which should constitute about a fourth of our work, is carried on under difficulties and with considerable restriction due to lack of essential equipment and housing space required for major farm repair and construction jobs.

REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSEYear of 1940

I hereby submit my third annual report on school nursing.

There were 345 visits made to the various schools during the past year. The number of visits is greatly increased over that of the previous year because it was found that it was much easier to control epidemics, or other illnesses, that might occur in the schools by more frequent check-up of the children. With the exception of assisting the school physician in his annual examination of the children, these visits include classroom and individual inspection of the students, treatment of minor injuries, skin diseases, health supervision and a close check on the attendance.

The annual physical examination of the school children was conducted soon after the opening of school in the Fall. The result of these examinations again showed that the outstanding defects among the students are vision and teeth. The majority of cases of defective vision have been corrected, and it is hoped that a dental clinic can be arranged this spring. Last year, it was necessary to cancel the school dental clinic due to the inability to obtain a dentist.

Last year, through funds raised in the community by private contributions and donations from various organizations, it was possible to give undernourished and needy children cod liver oil and milk. One hundred school children received milk during the winter and spring months; fifty per cent of these children paid for the milk.

Also, a community welfare committee was organized with representatives from various organizations. They collected, and made new clothing for needy children.

There were several cases of impetigo, scabies, and pediculosis among the school children during the year. These children were excluded from school until the condition cleared up.

Last winter there was an epidemic of whooping cough which made it necessary for many children to remain out of school for several weeks. Thus far this year, there has been no epidemic of communicable disease except for two cases of chicken pox and one of mumps. It was necessary to close the schools for four days in January due to the prevalence of the grippe. The attendance at school has been normal since then.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Winchester:

I have the honor to submit my third annual report.

Teachers: The following changes occurred in the Winchester teaching staff during the past summer. Miss Mary Connor resigned to accept a more lucrative position in Newburyport. Miss Bertha Raines accepted a position in Lebanon, and Miss Marion Fairbanks was granted a leave of absence.

The vacancy in the Thayer High School was filled by the appointment of Miss Eileen Carlson, a graduate of Wheaton and Cornell. Miss Mary Coll was transferred from the Ashuelot school to the sixth grade in the Center school. No replacement was made for Miss Raines as the Scotland school was closed and the pupils transported to the Center school. Miss Marie Donahoe, a graduate of Regis College, was appointed to teach English and History in the junior and senior high school. This appointment was for a full-time position rather than for a half-time position as of last year. It was made necessary by the large enrollments in the junior high school grades.

The work of all of these teachers has been successful and the results secured commendable.

Buildings and Grounds: The repairs during the year consisted of cleaning, painting in and about all buildings in use.

Center School: The girls' basement was completely remodelled and painted. The policy of redecorating a classroom each year was continued. The desk tops in several of the rooms were sanded and refinished, thus making smooth surfaces. Temporary repairs were made on two of the hot air furnaces. During the late Fall, numerous loads of earth have been dump-

ed in the hollow spaces in the rear of the school. These loads should serve as a foundation for a more level playground in the future.

Thayer High School: The sheathing of the walls in the corridors was continued. The building was partially insulated during the Spring term. This action should bring about a considerable saving in the fuel expense as well as more uniformity in heat distribution throughout the building.

Heating plant at Center School: The heating equipment in the Center school is in very bad condition. Two of the hot air furnaces should be completely replaced in the near future if the present method of heating the building is to be continued. It would seem a matter of economy as well as of efficiency to install a more simple type of heating arrangement rather than to spend more money on the present one. The School Board has made a study of this situation and a special article has been inserted in the school warrant for your consideration.

Instructional Activities: This report does not permit a detailed discussion of instructional activities throughout the year. There are some, however, which are worthy of brief mention, namely,

1. Introduction of the Palmer Method of handwriting.
2. More emphasis on both oral and silent reading.
3. Increased attention on the part of teachers to the unit or contract plan of instruction.

Transportation of pupils: New rules and regulations were issued by the State Motor Vehicle Department concerning school transportation facilities during the past year. These regulations had to do with condition of equipment and with the capacity of the school busses. As a result, many of our school busses had to be remodelled or exchanged for others. This change has caused a considerable increase in the item of transportation cost in the district.

A new route was established between Ashuelot and the Thayer High school in order to transport all seventh and eighth grade pupils from Ashuelot Village. The Scotland district route, Mr. Gilbert Nelson, conveyor, was enlarged in order to care for all the Scotland school children now in attendance at the village school because of the closing of the Scotland school last June.

The transportation service has been very satisfactory on all routes and Winchester has now one of the best equipped bus services in the state.

Membership: The following table gives the number of pupils in attendance in the various grades as of January 31, 1941.

This table shows a total membership of 454 pupils. There are fourteen tuition pupils in the senior high school enrolled as follows: Freshmen, five; sophomores, four; juniors, one, and seniors, four. These pupils come from Swanzey, Richmond and Warwick, Massachusetts.

School costs: The average cost per pupil for public senior high schools, grades 9-12, was \$79.56 for the entire state. For Thayer High school, the per pupil cost was only \$55.67. Of the 86 high schools in the state, the cost in Winchester was fourth from the lowest. Only Pelham, Epping, and Newmarket schools were lower in their per pupil costs of \$52.30, \$52.28, and \$46.02, respectively. These per pupil costs were based on instructional items, such as teachers' salaries, text books, scholars' supplies, flags and other expenses of instruction.

The median per pupil cost of elementary schools in 1939-1940 was \$81.85 for the entire state. The cost in Winchester was \$74.99. This average is made up of two amounts, the cost of elementary school items spread over the average elementary school membership plus the cost of administration, fixed charges, and per capita tax spread over the entire membership, high school and elementary. This cost in Winchester is \$6.86 below the median for the state.

In conclusion, I wish to express my appreciation to the teachers and pupils, to the School Board, and to the parents and patrons of our schools for their loyalty and cooperation.
