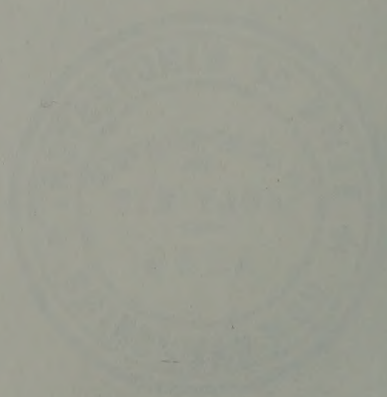

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Winchester on Tuesday the tenth day of March next, 1953 at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects: the polls not to close at an earlier hour than six of the clock in the afternoon.

ARTICLE 1.

To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 2.

To receive reports of the Selectmen, Town Treasurer and other Town Officers including agents and committees and act thereon.

ARTICLE 3.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following sums for the following purposes, or take any action thereon.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,300.00 for activated traffic signals to be erected at the intersection of Routes No. 10 and No. 119. This is one half of the total cost. The other half is to be paid for by the state.

ARTICLE 5.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) for the purpose of preserving public records by microfilm process, or act thereon.

ARTICLE 6.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to be spent under the direction of Mr. Edward Ford for recreational purposes.

ARTICLE 7.

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. This article to remain in effect until rescinded by vote of the Town.

ARTICLE 8.

To see if the Town will vote to accept from the Ada S. Godfrey Estate the sum of \$1,000.00 to be held in trust and the income only to be used to provide flowers for Memorial Day and other occasions on Lot 27, section F, in Evergreen Cemetery in Winchester, New Hampshire, and to use the balance of the income, if any for the perpetual care of said lot.

ARTICLE 9.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for the purchase of an incinerator to be erected at the Town Dump. Two Thousand of this sum to be raised and appropriated at this meeting and the Selectmen to be authorized to borrow a sum not exceeding \$2,000.00, payable in 1954.

ARTICLE 10.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or direct the Selectmen to borrow repayable \$2,000.00

annually, a sum not to exceed \$8,000.00 for the purpose of extending the Town Water System from the Wood Flour Plant on Howard Street to the home of Steven Kossokoski, a distance of approximately 2,540 feet.

ARTICLE 11.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or direct the Selectmen to borrow a sum not to exceed \$3,285.00 for the purpose of extending the water system in Ashuelot from a point near the Library to the late Frank Dominick residence (650 ft.) and to the Frank Freeman residence, (270 ft.) Total distance 920 ft.

ARTICLE 12.

To see if the Town will vote to direct the Selectmen to borrow the sum not to exceed \$17,750.00, repayable \$2,000.00 annually for the purpose of extending the water line down route No. 78 from Coombs' Corner to the Gately property. A distance of approximately one and two tenths miles.

ARTICLE 13.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or direct the Selectmen to borrow a sum not to exceed \$675.00 for the purpose of extending the water system from a point on the Ashuelot Road to the residence of Katherine Sosnoski, a distance of approximately 450 feet.

ARTICLE 14.

To see if the Town will vote to raise or appropriate a sum not to exceed \$550.00 for the purpose of extending the Town Water System from the Edward S. Fairbanks' residence on Old Ashuelot Road to the Leary residence on Old Ashuelot Road in the village of Ashuelot, a distance of approximately 350 feet.

ARTICLE 15.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or direct the Selectmen to borrow the sum of \$3,250.00 for extending the Water System in Ashuelot from a point near the school to the Adonias Roy residence. (Approximately 1,050 feet).

ARTICLE 16.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or direct the Selectmen to borrow, the sum of \$315.00 for extending the Water System in Ashuelot from a point near the Simineau residence to the Wheaton residence. (Approximately 200 feet).

ARTICLE 17.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or direct the Selectmen to borrow, the sum not to exceed \$4,000.00 for the purpose of constructing a sewer beginning at the garage formerly owned by Clifford Zitzow to a point near the Henry Wheeler residence.

ARTICLE 18.

To see if the Town will not to raise and appropriate the sum of \$47.52 for the purpose of installing two street lights. One near the residences of Mr. Hutchins and Mr. Kossakoski on Howard Street and the other at the Junction of Howard Street, Estey Road and Old Westport Road so called.

ARTICLE 19.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for a cement curbing around the Common. Also to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to keep the surplus snow from being dumped on the Common.

ARTICLE 20.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$13,250 to replace the old town grader, which was purchased in 1938.

ARTICLE 21.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,400.00 to purchase a new motor for the town truck, or act thereon.

ARTICLE 22.

To see if the town will vote to direct the Water Commissioners to install Flouridation in the Town Water System.

ARTICLE 23.

To see if the Town will vote to abolish the Budget Committee by rescinding Article No. 47, voted at Town Meeting March 12, 1935, adopting the Municipal Budget Act. Their duties to be performed by the Selectmen.

ARTICLE 24.

To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen, Town Representatives, State Senator and District Councilor to take the necessary steps to establish a State Liquor Store in Winchester, N. H. and instruct the Town Clerk to forward to each of the officials named above and the State Liquor Commission a transcript of the action and votes taken at this and last year's town meetings in reference to this question and a record of the votes for the last ten years on the State Stores biennial balloting on this question.

Further to instruct the Town Clerk to forward a copy of the above records to the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of New Hampshire, and to His Honor the Governor of New Hampshire, together with the following petition.

Whereas,

We, the people of Winchester, N. H. naturally wish our town to progress and grow and develop, and

Whereas,

We have constantly voted for the Establishment of a State Liquor Store in Winchester and

Whereas,

Our public officials have shown neither the inclination, disposition nor ability to carry out our peaceful intentions.

Therefore,

We, the people of Winchester, under the First Amendment to the Constitution, which holds,

“Congress shall make no law — abridging the right of the people peaceable to assemble and to petition the Government for a redress of their grievances”

Do hereby forward this petition and humbly pray for appropriate action.

ARTICLE 25.

To see if the Town will vote to direct the Selectmen, the Library Trustees and the School Board, to employ counsel to take the necessary legal steps to determine the use of the Town Library Building.

ARTICLE 26.

To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following By-Laws.

A. Building Permits—

No person shall erect a building, house or other structure, make any addition to existing structures nor move a building or structure in the Town of Winchester, unless a license in writing be granted therefor by the Selectmen. Applications for such license shall be accompanied by a fee of one dollar and the Water Department and Sewer Department shall make no connections to any structure as outlined above unless a license as provided herein has been granted by the Selectmen.

C. Town Meetings—

Except for the election of officers and voting at the polls all other business to be transacted at town meeting shall be considered and acted upon at an adjourned business meeting at 7:30 p. m. on the Wednesday following town meeting day effective 1954 and thereafter.

Whoever shall offend, or fail to comply with any of the provisions of these by-laws, shall, unless some other penalties provided by law, for each and every offense forfeit and pay a penalty of not less than \$2.00 and not more than \$20.00.

ARTICLE 27.

To see if the Town will vote to abolish the office of Water Commissioners, and transfer this department to the Selectmen with authority for said Selectmen, to appoint a superintendent to have charge of the Water Department. This article to take effect upon passage.

ARTICLE 28.

To see if the Town will vote to accept as town road that portion of the discontinued Jackson Road (so called), running from Elm Street to the Rose White residence, approximately 200 feet.

ARTICLE 29.

To see if the Town will vote to direct the Water Commissioners and Selectmen to advertise for bids for all Water Extensions and other major expenditures.

Inserted by Selectmen

ARTICLE 30.

To see if the Town will vote to direct the Water Commissioners to pay over to the Town Treasurer all funds in excess of \$4,000.00 at the end of the year.

ARTICLE 31.

To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Fiddle Hill extension as voted at the Town Meeting of 1951 was completed in April of this year at a cost of \$1,993.32.

The new pump mentioned in last year's report has been installed and has increased our pumping capacity from 250 to 370 gallons per minute. This new pump has enabled us to keep up with the increased demand, and has decreased the operating time of the large pump.

With our present consumption of approximately 95,630,000 gallons per year it is evident that the installation of the additional pump was a necessity.

The two hydrants which were below the road level have been equipped with extensions and are now at the proper level.

In answer to many inquiries the Board wishes to assure the consumers that the water is not being treated in any way. Water samples submitted to the State Department of Health each month continue to show the water to be of excellent quality.

FOREST WARDEN REPORT

TEAM WORK WILL DO THE JOB

Team work has won victories from time immemorial — for families, towns, cities, states and nations. Team work is the highest form and most democratic example of cooperation. Without team work, America and Americans would never have achieved the greatness that is theirs. We are all aware of its power and appeal. It is no less needed now than in the past.

Team work among those who live, work and recreate in and near the woodlands, is vital. There never was a time when our woodlands as a whole were in such precarious condition as they are now.

Since the hurricane, nearly 900,000 acres of slash have been added to our already sizeable slash problem. If we are to avoid unnecessary trouble with fire in our woodland areas everyone must cooperate — we must have team work.

I attended a Red Cross Meeting in Keene on January 31 where the new method of artificial respiration was demonstrated.

The well baby clinics did not have a large enough attendance to warrant the Nurses time, so I discontinued them for the time being, especially as many of the young mothers have a regular checkup for their babies by their own private physician, I did not feel that they were a necessity when the nursing work was more urgent. During the year a quantity of used clothing was distributed to needy families.

In several other ways assistance was given to provide glasses, operations and advice to both children and adults, through the aid of local and State organizations.

In the summer the N. H. Public Health Service visited Winchester with the Mobile X-Ray unit, for the purpose of checking Tuberculosis. The cooperation of all societies in town made this venture a success. I wish to thank all who aided in any way.

Mrs. Nellie Blicher, R. N. substituted during the month of August.

At Christmas time a large amount of gifts were distributed, also clothing to families of need. I wish to thank every organization which so willingly helped me in this task. I feel certain many a child had a happier holiday because of your kindness and generosity.

The year for me has been a busy one, and may I say that I have enjoyed working for the people of Winchester. The cooperation given me by the Council of the D. N. A. is deeply appreciated, and helped me greatly.

The New Hampshire Law reads that all children entering school in September must be vaccinated. During the past two years the time has been extended to January 1, of the school year, and yet 8 pupils had to be excluded because of non-vaccination. I believe all parents should realize this, it is a safety measure and therefore, should have the child ready for school.

Several short health talks were given to the grade classes, with suggestions for improving hygiene and personal appearance. I am sorry to say some children come to school without proper attention to their cleanliness, for which I feel the parents are responsible — let us strive for a more attractive and healthful school appearance.

In February the School Nurse met with Mr. C. Lees, Superintendent of Schools, Miss Annette Evelieth, R. N. Director of School Health Service, State of New Hampshire, Miss Catherine Nappey — Swanzey, and Miss Grace Churchill of Hinsdale. We discussed school health problems and how to deal with them. I feel there is a great deal of work to be done in the Winchester schools, but time does not afford the necessary. All the health records of the Grammar Schools were changed into a new filing system during the summer vacation.

I attended a School Nurse Conference in Concord on September 10. The meeting was very interesting and informative, with a question and answer period.

The fall inspection work has been slow, but is nearing completion.

I wish to thank Mr. Chester Lees, Mr. Paul McNamara and all the teachers for their cooperation and assistance.

The American Legion and Auxiliary of Winchester is furnishing Cod Liver Oil Supplement to the children who need it — This is a grand service and is greatly appreciated.

1952 PLAYGROUND

The summer playground project was held at the Ellen Lambert Murphy Memorial, July 1 to August 22. Eighty four children were registered in the 3-10 age group. They met each morning from 9:30 to 12:00, and those who wished to enjoy the wading-pool in the afternoon were super-

vised by Mr. Thompson. Their morning activities included singing for a half hour, directed by Mrs. Stephen Johnson, handcrafts, organized games, free play, hikes, a gala time in the wading pool-first lessons in swimming were part of the fun. This program concluded with a picnic at Mt. Grace Park.

I wish to thank the volunteers, from the older girls' group, who assisted with the supervision of this 3-10 age group. Without the help of Donna MacNamara, Jane Thompson, Pat Barden, Peggy Sullivan, Maryln Pratt, Nancy Nash, Stella Holm, Joyce Miner, Joan Zabielski, Cynthia Jackson, and Nancy Grenda, our program would have been extremely hampered, because the children in the wading pool had to be watched constantly. These girls helped supervise the hikes and outings. This was valuable experience for them; now is the time to train our future leaders.

Twenty six girls registered in the 10-16 group, and met every afternoon 1:30-4:30. Mondays and Thursdays they had swimming at Forest Lake, Tuesdays, embroidery class was directed by Mrs. Florence Costello; Wednesdays, a photography class was directed by Fred Gateley; for one week Mrs. Eileen Little directed classes in metal craft; Fridays, the program included leather craft, wood craft, gimp craft, glass painting, papermache work, and sports. The girls prepared a play for the Golden Jubilee, directed by Miss Davis and Mrs. Frost. Two trips were made to Laurel Lake, and a bicycle jaunt to Pulpit Falls.

We wish to express our appreciation for the assistance of those volunteers who contributed much to the above hand craft program, and also to Edward Garmalo, Sophie Kulick, Richard Bean, Edith Atkins, Rev. Flory, and Leonard Tacy who furnished transportation for outings. Our thanks goes to all who helped make the playground a success.

The older boys and girls enjoyed a last good time at Benson's Animal Farm. Transportation was furnished by Mrs. Elizabeth Bullard, Mrs. Priscilla Putnam, Mrs. Mary Johnson, Mrs. Frost.

Swimming, Bowling, Boxing, Table tennis, and hand crafts were favorites with the thirty five boys who attended, more or less regularly. Interest in ball games and track was lacking. The age range was too great to make good competition which is necessary in athletics.

AUDITORS' REPORT

Board of Selectmen
Winchester, New Hampshire
Gentlemen:

The Auditors are pleased to submit herewith the report of their audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Winchester for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1952.

The scope of our audit included the accounts of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Highway Commissioner, Water Department, Fire Department, Forest Fire Department, Overseer of the Poor, Library Treasurer, Trustees of Trust Funds, Municipal Court, and Summer Playground.

Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls, as well as entries in the books of records, to determine whether all payments had been properly authorized and were in settlement of legitimate accounts.

Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible to determine whether all revenues to which the Town was entitled had been collected and turned into the Treasury.

Book balances at the close of the year were verified by comparison with Bank statements and uncollected taxes were verified by mailing notices to a majority of delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the collector's records.

The accounts of all Town officials which we examined were found to be in good condition except as the following remarks indicate.

We call attention to the instructions from the State Tax Commission that the fiscal year of all towns ends on December 31st of each year, and that the books and accounts of all Town officials must be closed as of that date. We find instances in several departments of these instructions not being followed.

In regard to the Tax Collector's accounts we found small differences as shown in the following figures.

As we have previously stated we feel that the uncollected and unredeemed tax lists of prior years should be carefully examined for the purpose of removing by abatements and issuance of tax deeds to the Town all possible uncollected and unredeemed taxes two years or more in arrears.

The audit of the records pertaining to motor vehicle permits and dog licenses disclosed an over-payment to the Treasurer of \$1.63 on one permit and an under-payment of \$3.00 on one dog license, making a net difference due the Town of \$1.37. This difference has been corrected.

The examination of the Highway Commissioner's accounts disclosed one check made out incorrectly by 40 cents, the sum of \$3.00 drawn twice from the selectmen, and a reimbursement of \$186.00 credited to the commissioner's account instead of the Treasurer. This has been corrected by reimbursing the Town \$189.00, and 40 cents to the employee concerned.

We wish to commend the Highway Commissioner for paying all his department's bills as well as payrolls, therefore keeping a much better control over his department.

In regard to the Fire Department we wish to suggest that either the Selectmen or the Clerk of the department pay all invoices, therefore keeping all records under one control.

The records of the clerk of the Municipal Court show an underpayment of \$1.00, which amount is due to the State of New Hampshire, a/c Motor Vehicle Department.

We suggest to the Summer Playground Committee that if in the future any gift of money is received from sources other than the Town appropriation, it should be kept in a separate account, in so much as any unexpended balance of the funds obtained from the Town should be refunded to the Treasurer at the close of the year.

We strongly recommend that steps be taken by the Selectmen to insure that all bills and necessary information from the Cemetery committee be turned over to the Trustees of Trust funds not later than December 1st of each year, in order that the records of the Trustees can be completed immediately after the close of the fiscal year.

We wish to thank the officials of the Town of Winchester for their assistance and cooperation during the course of the audit.

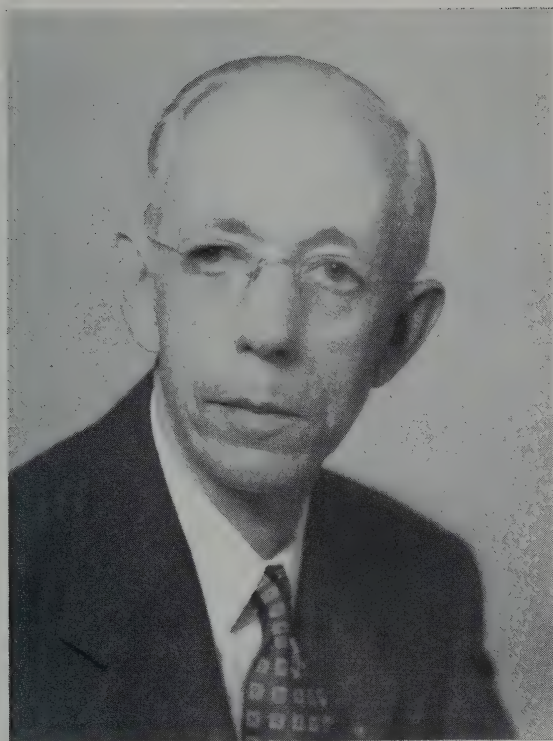

The new addition to the school solves the difficult problems of class arrangement and overcrowding. It is now possible for us to enjoy a separate music room where the woodworking shop was previously located. Many pupils are taking advantage of the opportunities offered in the new industrial arts course under the direction of Mr. Harold Thomas. New equipment and tools are gradually being added to the shop along with generous contributions of the late Mr. Bert Woods.

The band continues to make great progress under the direction of Mr. William C. Heck. The band is also inspired by the loyal backing of the Band Boosters Club and many followers. There are several new members in the band and a junior band has been started consisting of approximately 28 members who meet Saturday mornings for rehearsals. The school and band fund have recently purchased a baritone saxophone and a new tuning bar. The Band Boosters have purchased for the band a slide trombone. Music for the seventh and eighth grades has been added to the curriculum.

Report of SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Winchester:

I have the honor to submit my sixth annual report.

Teachers: There was one minor change in the assignments of our elementary school personnel. Miss Mary White, who taught at the Ashuelot School last year, is now teaching the overflow portion of the third grade at the Community Center.

At Thayer High School, the turnover in teachers was the largest in recent years. Mr. Carl D. Grupe, principal of the high school in Winchester since 1918, retired at the end of the school year in 1952. The imprint of his work here will be felt for generations. It is to be hoped that he will long enjoy a rich and well earned retirement.

Mr. Paul C. McNamara, assistant principal for many years, was elected principal of Thayer High School upon the retirement of Mr. Grupe. Mr. McNamara has taught at Thayer High School since 1936 and merited the promotion to the principalship. Mrs. Geraldine D. Dickinson was appointed assistant principal.

Mrs. Agnes Grupe resigned at the time of her husband's retirement. Her presence at the high school is sorely missed as is that of Mr. Grupe. Miss Florence E. Flint, a graduate of the University of New Hampshire, was elected Commercial teacher. Miss Flint has had teaching experience in Belleville, New York, and in Woodsville, New Hampshire.

Mr. J. Gerard Provost replaced Mr. Nicola Carello in the language department. Mr. Provost is a graduate of Marist College, Framingham, Massachusetts. He has done graduate work also at Boston College and Boston University. He has had teaching experience at Van Buren, Maine, and Plainville, Massachusetts.

Mr. Harold Thomas, Jr. was elected to the Industrial Arts position. Mr. Thomas is a graduate of the University of New Hampshire and has had graduate study at Cornell University.

Mr. Philip S. Hyde, Jr. was elected teacher of Mathematics and Science. He is a graduate of Keene Teachers College. Mr. Hyde has assumed the coaching duties formerly performed by Mr. McNamara.

Buildings and Grounds: The townspeople of Winchester can be justly proud of the new addition to the high school. The two ample classrooms and spacious shop have improved the facilities to a

marked degree. Your attention is respectfully called to Principal McNamara's comments in his report.

All three buildings, Center, Ashuelot and Thayer, received the usual cleaning and repairing during the summer months. The chimneys at the Center School have been repaired, eliminating the hazard of falling bricks into the school yard. The lavatories were thoroughly cleaned and painted.

At Thayer High School, the old shop has been converted into a pleasing music room. Mr. Heck formerly taught instrumental lessons in the Chemistry laboratory or any other available place. He now has a room of his own where lessons may be given and band and chorus rehearsals held.

The lighting was improved in the music room, the basement corridor, the chemistry room and the home economics room.

At the Ashuelot School, a sewage problem was solved by installing new drains. At this school, also, a new flag pole was installed and the front walk graded.

It must be re-emphasized that the above figures are merely indicative and in no way to be considered factual. As was stated in last year's report, they assume that all the pupils will be promoted from year to year and that all will remain in school from grade 1 through grade 12. They assume also that all the pupils will continue to live in Winchester, none will drop out of school and no newcomers will be added.

We all know that this will not be the case. This is particularly true of the high school where the figures in the upper grades are undoubtedly too high.

The average mortality rate between the eighth grade and the twelfth at Thayer over a span of the last five years is 35%. The smallest projected enrollment in the eighth grade in the next eleven years is 44. With a 35% drop out, 28 of the 44 would be expected to complete the twelfth grade. The largest projected enrollment in the eighth grade in the next eleven years is 60. With a 35% drop-out, 39 of the 60 would be expected to complete the twelfth grade. The percentage of drop-outs for grades eleven, ten and nine would be progressively smaller. Thus, it is apparent that even though mortality be considered, the high school enrollment will increase substantially, though not to the extent indicated in the above table.

The holding power of 65% is low for a high school such as Thayer. With the increased shop facilities it should be possible to raise this figure to at least 75%.

State Aid to Education: During the past two years, Winchester has been helped materially through state aid. It is to be hoped that the present legislature will provide the funds asked for by the State Board of Education. The present state aid in New Hampshire amounts to \$600,000 a year. The amount requested is \$1,200.00. If the latter figure is realized, Winchester should receive a much larger amount than at present. This will be of significant aid to the beleaguered property tax payer.

In conclusion, I wish to express my appreciation to the teachers, pupils and parents, the School Board and to the patrons of our schools for their cooperation.
