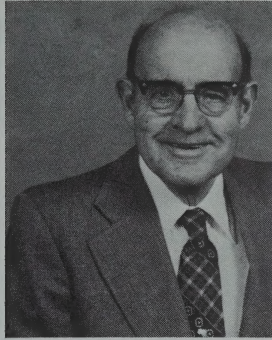

Fred W. Baker

Born in Winchester in 1909, Fred Baker lived in our town all his 76 years. He grew up, and then brought up his own family, on the farm atop the first summit of the Chesterfield Road--the farm now owned by Raymond Talbot. Fred's retirement years were lived on Melvin Bridge Road.

But he didn't just "live" in Winchester in the sense of existing here--he lived here in the sense of serving. In earlier years he was a loyal employee of local industries, while still carrying out the work on the farm. Later he held a position at Kingsbury Machine Tool Corp., until retirement in 1974. His service extended to his church including serving as a deacon; and it especially extended to his, and our, town.

Four times was Fred Baker elected a selectman of Winchester. He served first in 1965, was re-elected in 1968, and ran successfully for a one-year term in 1971. 1972 brought re-election to another three year term, but he found it best to resign after one year. In recognition of these eight years of loyal commitment as a Selectman of our town, and for his record of dedication to the good things of community life, the present Board of Selectmen take special pleasure in dedicating this year's Winchester Town Report to the memory of Fred W. Baker.

## SELECTMEN'S REPORT - 1987

The Board of Selectmen wish to thank all the taxpayers and Town Officers for their cooperation during the past year. Selectmen hold regular hours on Monday 9 AM to 12 Noon, and meet Wednesday 7 PM to 9 PM. Other times may be arranged by calling 239-4951 if these hours are not convenient. The Selectmen's Office is now open Monday through Friday from 7:30 AM to 5 PM.

We again call your attention to the numerous forms available in the Selectmen's Office to be used by the taxpayers for property taxation. The only form that is mailed out is the Inventory of Taxable Property. All other forms must be obtained at the Selectmen's Office. The law states that an Inventory Form must be filled in, signed and returned to the Selectmen's Office on or before April 15th. If an Inventory Form is not filed, there is no legal basis for the Board of Land and Tax Appeals or the Court to consider an application for abatement. Also a late return of the Inventory Form will be assessed a penalty.

### VETERAN'S EXEMPTION

Permanent applications are available in the Selectmen's Office. We call to your attention that, if a person eligible for exemption changes his domicile, or a veteran's wife becomes a widow during the year, a new permanent application must be filed with the assessing officials.

### EXEMPTIONS FOR CERTAIN ELDERLY PEOPLE (C.E.P.)

These forms are for persons who qualify for reduction in their tax bills. These forms must be completed and in the Selectmen's Office on or before April 15, 1987. If there is no completed form on file, we cannot grant the Elderly Exemption. As of April 1, 1987, the three categories of exemptions are from ages 65 to 74, 75 to 79, and age 80 and over. It is your responsibility to complete a new exemption form if you change categories.

### INTENT TO CUT TIMBER

Every owner, including State, County or municipality or public agency, shall, prior to each cutting operation, file with the Selectmen a notice of intent to cut.

### ASSESSMENT OF OPEN SPACE

No owner of land shall be entitled to have a particular parcel of his land classified for any tax year under the provisions of this chapter unless he shall have applied to the assessing officials on the form approved by the Board and provided by the Tax Commission.

## PERMITS

Any person, firm, corporation, municipality, public agency or institution desiring to operate, maintain, offer for rent, lease or tenancy a site, lot, field, tract of ground for location of any new building, trailer park, trailers or mobile homes or other similar conveyance, or place of abode for shelter shall obtain a written operating permit from the Board of Selectmen. Where applicable, it would be necessary to have received and to show proof of having received approval for construction granted by the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission for construction of any septic tank system before a building permit or permit to park a trailer or mobile home shall be issued.

## HOUSE TRAILERS

Whenever a person moves a house trailer or mobile home into a city or town for the purpose of establishing a residence in said city, or town, or whenever a person purchases an existing house trailer or mobile home with the intent residing in the same at the existing location, he shall within fifteen (15) days of placement of the trailer register with the Assessors of the city or the Selectmen of the town where he shall reside. Whoever fails to comply with the provisions of this section shall be guilty of violation 72:7B (1973:152)

## SELECTMEN'S REPORT

One of the chief problems facing Winchester today is that of rapid growth. Based on the experiences of other communities in the state, there are no easy solutions. State and Federal laws are very restrictive in this area and we are closely watching the progress of other communities in meeting this challenge. The final outcome is highly unpredictable. Your town officers and boards are working together in monitoring the situation very closely, with a view toward the best resolution possible.

Two problems which we must face are solid waste disposal and wastewater disposal. The Federal Government has mandated that we must do something about the sewage problem in Ashuelot, and the State is concerned about our landfill. We are working very closely with State and Federal officials on these problems and we are sure that the press will keep you informed as to the progress.

We are in the process of revitalizing our Town Hall. We have installed a new access ramp for the handicapped, we have installed a new set of rest rooms on the main floor, we are re-slating the west roof, replacing all the electric wiring in the building with a new 400 AMP service, we have a completely new heating system, and we are installing new fire retarding ceilings in the basement. The electrical work, as well as the ceilings, have been mandated by the State Fire Marshall's office. The new heating system has already saved us a noticeable amount of fuel costs. We invite you all to come in and see your new facilities. We will again, have a Town Hall which we can be proud of.

Our Town Common is sporting a new sign which tells passers through that they are indeed in the Town of Winchester. We also have signs indicating to tourists that they are entering the Town of Winchester.

Several of our buildings have undergone "facelifting" due to the efforts of the Community Development Office.

We would like to commend and thank all Town Officials and Department Heads, as well as the public at large for their cooperation during the past year.

TOWN OF WINCHESTER

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TO THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF WINCHESTER, IN THE COUNTY OF CHESHIRE IN SAID STATE, QUALIFIED TO VOTE IN TOWN AFFAIRS:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Town Hall in said Winchester on Tuesday, the 12th day of May next, 1987, at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects. The polls not to close at an earlier hour than six of the clock in the afternoon.

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. Are you in favor of adoption of Amendment No. 1 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows: (Amend Article VII, Flood Plain District Uses, to conform to federal guidelines)?

Article 3. Are you in favor of adoption of Amendment No. 2 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows: (Amend Article II, to create a fourth zoning district, Rural Residential, to a 1,000 feet along each side Chesterfield Road, Old Spofford Road, Bolton Road, and Schofield Road)?

Article 4. Are you in favor of adoption of Amendment No. 3 as proposed by a petition article but recommended by the Planning Board for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows: (Amend Article V-B to increase the lot size in the Residential District to 30,000 square feet)?

Also you are notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Winchester on Saturday, the 16th day of May next, 1987, at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects.

Article 5. To receive reports of the Selectmen, Town Treasurer, and other Town Officers including Agents and Committees, and act thereon.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) for the purpose of an engineering design study for the Ashuelot sewer project, and to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to issue long term notes and bonds not to exceed \$150,000.00 for that purpose. This requires a two-thirds ballot vote.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate Sixty-Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$63,500.00) for the purpose of Town Hall renovations, and to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to issue long term notes and bonds not to exceed \$63,500.00 for that purpose. This requires a two-thirds ballot vote.

Budget Committee recommends Fifty Thousand Dollars for Town Hall roof repair and does not recommend the Thirteen Thousand Five Hundred Dollar balance of article.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000.00) for the purpose of removing the Town Hall stage and constructing two new offices and storage area for records where stage is presently located, and to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to issue long term notes and bonds not to exceed \$35,000.00 for that purpose. This requires a two-thirds ballot vote.

The Town of Winchester Ordains:

Section 1: Authority: This ordinance is enacted under the authority of RSA 31:39.

Section 2: Purposes: To provide for the control, containment, and clean up of hazardous materials which are a threat to the health and safety of people, animals, wildlife, vegetation, property, and the environment; and to require the users of any hazardous materials to pay for all services provided by the Town of Winchester in relation to the control, containment or clean up of hazardous materials.

Section 3: Application: This ordinance applies to all users of hazardous materials, as defined herein, but specifically excepting hazardous waste as defined and regulated by RSA 147-A; the transporting of hazardous materials to the extent such activities are regulated by RSA 265:115 - 118; and, oil spillage in public waters to the extent such activities are regulated by RSA 146-A.

Section 4: Definitions: For purposes of this ordinance, the following definitions apply:

- A. Hazardous Materials - Those substances or materials in such quantity and form which may pose an unreasonable risk to health and safety or property, which may include but are not limited to, explosives, radioactive materials, etiologic agents, flammable liquids or solids, combustible liquids or solids, poisons, oxidizing or corrosive materials, and compressed gases which are listed by the Materials Transportation Bureau of the United States Department of Transportation in Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations and any amendment thereto.
- B. Person - Any individual, corporation, partnership, trust or other legal entity.
- C. User - Any person who owns, uses, handles, stores, or has the legal authority to control hazardous materials, specifically including their officers, directors, employees and agents.

Section 5: Duty to Report: Any person who causes or has knowledge of any discharge or release of hazardous materials from their safe container, in any manner which poses an actual or potential threat to people, animals, wildlife, vegetation, property or the environment, shall immediately report the incident to the Town of Winchester Fire Chief.



Section 6: Control, Containment and Clean Up: The Town of Winchester Fire Department shall promptly respond to each reported incident and take such action as is necessary to protect public health, safety, property and the environment.

Section 7: Costs: The user of the hazardous material, which was discharged or released, shall be strictly liable to the Town of Winchester for all costs incurred in the control, containment, and clean up of the hazardous materials. For this purpose, all of the users shall be jointly and severally liable and the costs may be recovered from any of them by a suit in any court with jurisdiction over the parties and the amount claimed.

Section 8: Penalties: Any person who fails to report, as required by Section 5 above, shall be assessed a civil forfeiture not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00). Any person who intentionally discharges or releases, or causes another to discharge or release, any hazardous materials from their safe container, in any manner which poses an actual or potential threat to people, animals, wild-life, vegetation, property, or the environment, shall be assessed a civil forfeiture not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).

Section 9: Use of Costs and Civil Forfeiture Collected: All costs and civil forfeitures collected under this ordinance shall be placed in a special hazardous materials account and expended by the Chief of the Town of Winchester Fire Department to equip, maintain, and train a hazardous materials response unit.

Section 10: Enforcement: The Chief of the Town of Winchester Fire Department shall be responsible for enforcing this ordinance.

Section 11: Repeal: Any provision of any ordinance which is inconsistent with this ordinance is hereby repealed.

Section 12: Severability: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or part of this ordinance should be held invalid for any reason whatsoever, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions, which shall remain in full force and effect; and, to this end, the provisions of this ordinance are severable.

Section 13: Effective Date: This ordinance shall become effective upon passage by the Town Meeting of May 16, 1987.

We have examined the general purpose financial statements of the Town of Winchester, New Hampshire for the year ended June 30, 1986 and have issued our report thereon dated September 24, 1986. As part of our examination, we made a study and evaluation of internal accounting control of the Town of Winchester, New Hampshire to the extent we considered necessary to evaluate the system as required by generally accepted auditing standards and standards for financial compliance audits contained in the U.S. General Accounting Office Standards for Audit of Governmental Organizations, Programs, Activities and Functions. For the purpose of this report we have classified the significant internal accounting controls in the following categories:

#### ACCOUNTING APPLICATIONS

- Billing
- Receivables
- Purchasing and Receiving
- Accounts Payable
- Cash Disbursements
- Payroll

The purpose of our study and evaluation was to determine the nature, timing, and extent of the auditing procedures necessary for expressing an opinion on the entity's financial statements. Our study and evaluation was more limited than would be necessary to express an opinion on the system of internal accounting control taken as a whole.

The management of the Town of Winchester, New Hampshire is responsible for establishing and maintaining a system of internal accounting control. In fulfilling this responsibility, estimates and judgments by management are required to assess the expected benefits and related costs of control procedures. The objectives of a system are to provide management with reasonable, but not absolute, assurance that assets are safeguarded against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, and that transactions are executed in accordance with management's authorization and recorded properly to permit the preparation of financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Because of the inherent limitations in any system of

internal accounting control, errors or irregularities may nevertheless occur and not be detected. Also, projection of any evaluation of the system to future periods is subject to the risk that procedures may become inadequate because of changes in conditions or that the degree of compliance with procedures may deteriorate.

Our study and evaluation made for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph would not necessarily disclose all material weaknesses in the system. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the system of internal accounting control of the Town of Winchester, New Hampshire taken as a whole. However, our study and evaluation disclosed the following conditions that we believe result in more than a relatively low risk that errors or irregularities in amounts that would be material in relation to the financial statements of the Town of Winchester, New Hampshire may occur and not be detected within a timely period.

## WATER DEPARTMENT

### SEGREGATION OF DUTIES

As mentioned in our prior letter of comments and recommendations the Superintendent of the Water Department is responsible for both the billing and collection of water user fees. Proper internal control over the billing and collection functions require that these responsibilities be properly segregated to adequately safeguard assets. We again recommend that the collection of water bills could be transferred to either the selectmen's office or tax collector for proper separation of duties.

### COLLECTION OF PAST DUE ACCOUNTS

Our examination of the Water Department accounts receivable detail brought to our attention the fact that several accounts are past due for a excessive period of time. The water department does not have a formal policy relative to follow up procedures for overdue water bills. We recommend that the Board of Selectmen adopt a uniform policy regarding the collection of overdue water bills including possible termination of water service with due notice. We suggest that the Board consult with a surrounding community such as Hinsdale for a copy of their collection policy.

## METERED BILLINGS

Our examination of water department revenues revealed that there was a 7% decrease in user fees revenues based on a comparison with the prior year user fee revenues. Further examination revealed that several of the metered customers were not billed for services rendered for the last quarter of the year. The result of not billing these customers in the proper period is that revenues for the year ending June 30, 1986 are understated and not properly matched with the expenditures for that period. Every effort must be made to bill all customers on a timely basis.

These conditions were considered in determining the nature and timing and extent of the audit tests to be applied in our examination of the 1986 general purpose financial statements, and this report does not affect our report on the financial statements dated September 24, 1986.

## DIRECTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT 1986

On April 19, 1986 the Board of Trustees asked me to be the Interim Director at the Community Center. Since November of 1986 I have been the full time Director. I am discovering that this is a full time position in order to keep ahead of the various tasks asked of the Director. He is the chief custodian, administrator of the office, program coordinator and program supervisor. These tasks take easily 40 to 60 hours per week!

The same question was asked of me as was asked others at the Center, "What is going on at the Center?" If you have asked that question, when I invite you to visit the Center on a Wednesday evening. The parking lot is full of vehicles, the buildings are full of people, busy at activities from ceramics class to arts and crafts class, to women's bowling league, to the teen center in the auditorium.

The list of programs and activities keeps one busy with just scheduling different groups:

As I see it, the function of the Community Center is to serve the needs of the community for recreation. To this end the above mentioned programs are reaching a goodly number of our citizens. I would like to see a lot more activity for the adult population. Any ideas or suggestions are most welcome.

Perhaps some in our town do not really know what is available to them at the E.L.M. Community Center. A quick overview of the facilities reveals we have fourteen acres of land. The grounds provide areas for our flea markets, two tennis courts, two large ball fields, basketball court, skating rink and playground for the young set.

Two buildings house the inside activities -- the main house has on the first floor the Senior Citizens' room, used also for various other meetings, the parlor and office. Upstairs is the office of the Star, complete with dark room, and two more parlors for group meetings. There is also an apartment attached to the main house.

The auditorium has a 4-lane bowling alley, with the rifle range under the alleys, on one end. On the other end is the main hall (37' x 50') with a stage, for wedding receptions, family reunions, gatherings, auctions, etc. At the present time the teens also have their arcade games there, complete with pool table, juke box, and 10-11 video games. Between the two ends of the building is a modern kitchen. Below the auditorium is the Scout room where the Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts and Cadet Scouts meet.

The second greatest block of time for the Director is in the area of maintenance -- the upkeep of the facilities does take quite a bit of time. Improvements are always needed and being worked on. The past 10 months have seen some improvements:

- Electrical work in the Senior Citizens' room and front parlor was completed; some electrical work done in the apartment.
- Kitchen floor has been restored.
- The auditorium floor was sanded and three coats poly applied.
- The shutters were returned to the main house.
- New doors to entrance of auditorium.
- New door to Senior Citizens' room installed.



There is always a need for work to be done. Some priorities are:

The bowling alleys are over 40 years old and need much work to get them improved.

The auditorium and alleys need painting on the outside very badly.

The exterior fire exit steps from the stage need to be replaced.

The parking lot needs to be resurfaced.

The Board of Trustees and the Board of Incorporators are working together on future projects and improvements. The biggest project for the near future is the work being done under the auditorium. In the next few months one should see work being done to expand the use of this part of the building.

A word about Day Camp. Last summer was my first day camp experience. We were very late in trying to get a swim instructor for lessons at Forest Lake. At the eleventh hour, Camp Takodah in Richmond came to our rescue.

I have no way to compare the swim lessons of previous summers, but what happened at Camp Takodah needs to be shared. The quality and the quantity of learning was right at the top of the scale. There were four different classes going at the same time. Some days there were as many as 12 instructors teaching your children lessons in the water. I am pleased to say that we have worked out an agreement with Camp Takodah to return next season for swimming lessons.

Thanks to a grant, the Community Center now has a large screen TV (55") and VCR unit. The teens have been enjoying free movies on Wednesday nights (thanks to the generosity of Sisters Video). However, the VCR and screen are available to any group in town. The only requirement is that the equipment must remain at the Center. Feel free to schedule a training film, or just have a movie for your club. Call the office to schedule a time.

A note about our second annual Flea Market season: All involved felt this was a huge success. All signs for the third big season lead us to believe things will be even better in 1987.

As I finish my first year working at the Community Center, I can honestly say that there are a great many wonderful people out there helping us out. Whether you give of your time to help run an arts and crafts class, or supervise the teens in the arcades, or get on your hands and knees to patch the courts, all you volunteers deserve a great big "THANKS."

The door to the office is always open - if not, give me a call. This is your Community Center; if you have an idea for a program, let me know. I will be most happy to talk with you.

REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN  
AND  
STATE FOREST RANGER

Between July 1985 and June 1986, we experienced fewer fires than normal. The two leading causes of forest fires wer again children and fires kindled without written permission of a Forest Fire Warden. Both causes are preventable, but only with your help.

Please help our town and state forest fire officials with forest fire prevention. Contact your Forest Fire Warden for more information.

Enforcement of a state timber harvest regulation is the responsibility of State Forestry officials. Our state has excellent timber harvest regulations; however, your assistance is needed.

If you know of a logging operation and suspect a state timber harvest law may be violated, call your Forest Fire Warden.

If you own forest land, you became responsible for the timber tax payment starting April 1, 1986. This is a change in the Timber Tax Law that will impact all forest landowners. Contact your Board of Selectmen for timber tax forms.

WINCHESTER POLICE DEPARTMENT  
ANNUAL REPORT - 1986

1986 brought many changes to our Town, your Police Department and its ever increasing responsibility.

Increased traffic on our streets and on the State Highways crossing our Town has resulted in a significantly heavier demand for traffic patrol and accident investigation time. Accidents in Winchester showed an increase of 35%. Your Police Department has, as you should expect, launched a more aggressive Traffic Safety Patrol. In addition, an increased police visibility has been designed to deter carelessness or recklessness...all in the interests of decreasing the injury rates and cut back on the damages resulting from accidents. The only way to slow the increase of accidents and injuries is to increase patrol time and the apprehension of motor vehicle law violators. This is a common sense as well as professional approach to a serious problem.

But there is a bright spot in this report! As in years past, our Homes and Businesses have remained among the safest in the State. Our Burglary rate has remained low. Thefts have been held to a rate lower than in nearby communities. We are proud of that because we see your safety and the sanctity of your Home or Business as primary responsibilities of a modern police force. Thanks to your support for our budget requests, we have had additional manpower for the patrol time needed to deter crime but we will not rest until we can reduce the incidents of criminal activity, however petty, to an even lower level. You are entitled to that effort on our part. Control of crime has also been helped by you through your cooperation in criminal investigations.

Members of your Police Department have travelled to Massachusetts, Vermont, Tennessee, Florida and even as far away as Arizona to extradite persons who committed felonies in Winchester. With Cooperation from the Cheshire County Attorney's Office, we are sending out the message that if a person commits a crime in Winchester, he can expect to go to Court.

One of the sadder reports your Police Department must give is that there has been a significant increase in our Juvenile Case Load over the past year. Juvenile Crime is increasing along with cases involving physical, mental, and sexual abuse as well as child neglect which, according to County Statistics, is increasing everywhere at an alarming rate. But, just because it is increasing everywhere, we do not intend to tolerate it. To Combat the problem, and to better serve your families and our community, we have designated an Officer to work nearly full time in this area.

Another problem persists: an increase in the number of teenagers and young adults congregating on our streets "looking for something to do". Needless to say, this can lead to serious problems, especially in warmer weather. We encourage and support the use of the video equipment and games located in the E.L.M. Community Center. The money to buy this important equipment was obtained through a Grant which your Police Department applied for successfully in conjunction with Monadnock Family & Mental Health Service, the Winchester Board of Selectmen, and the E.L.M. Community Center Board of Trustees. The Community Center and its Director deserve the thanks and approval of our community for their far-sighted efforts to occupy our youth constructively.

cohol and Drug Abuse is certainly not a problem in our Town alone. It is nationwide and possibly worldwide. We are faced with a serious problem at this time. All our areas showed increased activity that underscores the depth of the drinking and drug problem.

our Police Department, with the support of the Board of Selectmen and cooperation from outside law enforcement agencies, has put a great deal of time and valuable resources into the different programs designed to combat the problem. So serious is the overall problem, and so threatening to you as parents and responsible citizens that we have decided to increase our efforts. Of course, this means more man hours and that means we need to have the funds to accomplish it. For this reason, we have asked for an increase in our next budget request to cover this vital need. Very few parents and taxpayers would want it any other way. Preventing D.W.I.'s, guarding the health and safety of our young people are paramount concerns for all of us..including your Police Department which is the front line in the fight.

Growth is desirable, of course, but it impacts directly on your Police and Town Emergency Services. We have seen, with the increase of low income housing projects, that more time is required for handling domestic cases which seem to occur in such projects, trailer parks and multi-family dwellings with more frequency than elsewhere. The Monadnock Family & Mental Health Service and the Division of Youth Services as well as the Women's Crisis Services of the Monadnock Region, Inc., can attest to the fact that Winchester is second only in our county to Keene for the volume of such cases. The only solution that a Police Department can provide is to slow the increase through professional police work, thorough investigation and seeing to it that more people are prosecuted in Court for Domestic Violence, Juvenile Abuse and Neglect.

It may surprise many that your Police Department has had to deal with a number of Arson Cases! Thanks to close inter-departmental cooperation between your Police and Fire Department investigators, perpetrators have been apprehended readily for prosecution.


Your Ambulance Department transported more people than ever. Your police officers are as an additional obligation, assisting in loading and in traffic control. We are fortunate, indeed, to have a good Ambulance Department manned by dedicated people.

The above average snowfall increased the need for more traffic patrols to assist motorists this past winter. Our Highway Department, as always kept our roads the best maintained in the State, despite the frequent major storms.

Your Police Department has also become active in assuring that the beautiful Squah Wilderness Park continues to be monitored by our local citizens or representatives to make its impact on our town a positive one. A full-time Park Ranger is now temporarily stationed at our Emergency Services Building to manage the large Wilderness area.

Emergency planning is an area that is seldom mentioned because it is only natural that we think of emergency services only when there are emergencies! However, your Police Department is constantly at work in liaison with State and other agencies to provide the means to help our citizens in the event of floods and other disasters. It is one more continuing responsibility for your Police Department and a vital one.

Your Police Department is comprised of individuals (Officers and Office Personnel) who are dedicated and sensitive to your needs. The Department is really a team that is effective both in preventing and in combating crime as well as contributing to the safety and security of people and property in our town. You, as a taxpayer, have the right to expect nothing less than a professional police function. I am proud to be a member of the team and I thank you for your continued support.

WINCHESTER AMBULANCE DEPARTMENT

Once more, in the period of July 1, 1985 to June 30, 1986, the Winchester Ambulance broke its own record by responding to a total of 279 calls. These included 19 in Richmond and 54 which were no transport such as standby at fires, death, or where the patient was transported by some other means.

In order to maintain their Emergency Medical Technician certification, three members of the squad attended a seminar training session at SOLO in North Conway, N.H., four days of intensive classes on all phases of rescue work, oxygen therapy, cardiac emergencies, medical emergencies, and a thorough review of all the equipment carried on our ambulance--splints, MAST trousers, backboards--you name it. Additionally, some of our crew are now certified in substance abuse care, and we have had several training session at the Fire Station where classes were held on CPR, Advanced Red Cross First Aid, and many other subjects.

We now have a total membership of 18 members -- 6 EMT's and 12 Advanced First Aiders. As the state requirements increase we find more and more attendants in the area just can't find the hours available to keep their certifications current. It is a commitment and soon requires all spare time available. We are always on the lookout for people who are interested in joining the squad and are presently waiting for two more EMT's to finish their classes.

We continually update our equipment, again thanks to the memorial gifts we receive through the year. We are presently waiting for a chair stretcher combination that will enable us to take patients down stairways, around corners and through tight places as in some of the trailers. We also have the second hand equipment used by some of our home health care people which we now make available to any Winchester residents who need it. We have wheelchairs, walkers, commodes, etc. and if you have a need to borrow this equipment, please let one of the squad know.

Thank you Winchester people -- it is your continued support that makes it possible for us to provide this very necessary service and we appreciate your cooperation. We also appreciate the help and support we receive from the police department and the firemen. It is to the credit of the whole town that we have such up-to-date facilities enabling us to provide care "at the scene" and possibly save lives.

Winchester Sewer Department  
Fiscal Year Report  
1985 - 1986

Over the year, 13 new connections were made to the sewer system. The average daily flow increased from 136,000 to 161,000 gallons. The biochemical oxygen demand removal, for the year, averaged 89.4% while the suspended solids removal averaged 94.2%. One lateral was replaced on Mechanic Street because of root intrusion.

The Concentrator began operation in March, and processed, 14,073 pounds of sludge before the end of the fiscal year. This was used along with the drying beds to help process the excessive amount of sludge.

The main focus during the past fiscal year, the third year of operation of the Town's Community Development Office, has been to implement the Ashuelot Village Housing Rehabilitation Project. Through this effort, another 35 housing units have been renovated, creating safer and more comfortable living environments for our citizens. In addition, the exterior painting of the E.L.M. Community Center's main building was completed.

The Town had been awarded \$15,000 for its economic revitalization study to investigate local market conditions to see what steps need to be taken to improve or expand local businesses. Community development staff and volunteers will survey local businesses and consumers during the summer. This data will be analyzed by Sandwich Research Group and will be the basis for a market study report to be published and distributed the following winter.

Finally, the Office of State Planning announced in April 1986 that the Town had finished first in the state wide competition for community development funds for its Target Properties Project. The intent of this project will be to renovate the large buildings which dominate the entrances to the Town and will be initiated in the fall of 1986.

# LAWS RELATING TO TRUST FUNDS

H 2 A Chapter 31

10. In General. Towns may take and hold in trust gifts, legacies and devises made to or for the establishment, maintenance and care of libraries, reading rooms, schools and other educational facilities, parks, cemeteries and burial lots, the planting and care of shade and ornamental trees upon their highways and other public places, and for any other public purpose that is not foreign to the institution of the gift with the objects of their organization.

11. Trust Funds Created by Towns. Towns may at any annual meeting grant into such sums of money as they deem necessary to create trust funds for the maintenance and care of libraries, reading rooms, schools and other educational facilities, parks, cemeteries and burial lots, the planting and care of shade and ornamental trees upon their highways and other public places, and any other public purpose that is not foreign to their institution or incompatible with the objects of their organization.

12. For Cemeteries. Towns shall take and hold in trust gifts, legacies and devises made them for the care of cemeteries and burial lots when the terms of the gift agree or devise do not impose any liability upon the town beyond the amount of the gift legacy or devise and the income thereof.

13. Funds of Cemetery Associations, etc. Towns may receive from cemetery associations or individuals funds for the care of cemeteries or for any other use, and the income thereof shall be expended by the town in accordance with the terms of the trust or contract under which the funds were received.

14. Trustees. All such trusts shall be administered by a board of 3 trustees, unless upon an annual or special town meeting votes that such trusts shall be administered by a board of 5 trustees. In towns with a board of 3 trustees, one trustee shall be elected by a ballot at each annual town meeting for a term of 3 years. In towns with a board of 5 trustees the 2 additional trustees shall be appointed initially by the selectmen one for one year, and one for 2 years. Thereafter all trustees shall be elected by a ballot at the annual town meeting to replace those whose terms expire. The term of each trustee shall be 3 years. Vacancies shall be filled by the selectmen or the remainder of the term. In cities said trustees shall be chosen and hold their office until such term, and shall be provided for by city ordinance. Trustees shall be eligible by electing one of their number bookkeeper, who shall keep the records and books for the trustees, and shall require a voucher before making any disbursement of funds from said trusts.

15. C/o Fee, Cemetery Trust Funds. Upon petition of a majority of the board of trustees and upon a finding that it is in the public interest to do so, the town may direct the application of only accumulated excess trust income for the general care and better improvements to or expansion of the cemetery relative to which the petition shall be made, and the town may determine the terms of the particular trust, until the excess income accumulation of the particular burial lot trust fund will total required for the care of the burial lot in the foreseeable future. In determining the requirement the court shall consider:

- I. The financial status of the trust account.
- II. A projection of future interest rates.
- III. A projection of future labor costs necessary to maintain the lot.

16. Single Trustee. A town wherein the total book value of trust funds is less than ten thousand dollars, acting under an appropriate article in the warrant for any annual town meeting, may vote that the board shall consist of one trustee, in which case said trustee shall be chosen by ballot at the same and each subsequent annual town meeting, and such vote may be rescinded in like manner. All the duties of such trustee shall be performed by law upon a petition of the trustees, and if no trustee is chosen, vacancies shall be filled by the selectmen for the remainder of the term, and said trustee shall receive from the town treasury such compensation as the town meeting may determine.

17. Trustees; Expenses. The expenses of trustees or the trustee provided for in RSA 31:23 shall be charged as incidental town charges.

18. Custody, Investments. The trustees shall have the custody of all trust funds not by their town. The funds shall be invested only by deposit in some savings bank or in the savings department of a national bank or trust company in this state, or in the savings department of a national bank or trust company in any other state, or in any building and loan association or co-operative bank incorporated and doing business under the laws of this state, or in the shares of any federal savings and loan association, located and doing business in this state, or in bonds, notes, city or other obligations of the United States government, or in state, county, town, city or municipal bonds, water and sewer district bonds and the notes of towns or cities in this state, and such stocks and bonds are legal for investment by New Hampshire savings banks and when so invested, the trustees shall not be liable for the loss hereof, and in any common trust fund established by the New Hampshire Charitable Fund in accordance with RSA 292:23. The trustee may reinvest investments as received from donors, until the maturity thereof.

19. Relation of Nonlegal Securities. Any security which at the time of its purchase under RSA 31:25 constituted a legal investment for New Hampshire savings banks and when so invested, the trustees shall not be liable for the loss hereof, and in any common trust fund established by the New Hampshire Charitable Fund in accordance with RSA 292:23. The trustee may reinvest investments as received from donors, until the maturity thereof.

20. Prudent Investment Defined. For purposes of RSA 31:25-a, a prudent investment is one which a prudent man would purchase for his own investment and primarily in view the preservation of the principal and the amount and regularity of the income to be derived therefrom.

21. Report to the Attorney General. The trustees shall report annually to the attorney general any securities retained under the provisions of RSA 31:25-a, which will appear as an addendum to the annual report required to be filed under RSA 1:38.

22. Investments by Single Trustee. In towns which have chosen a single trustee of trust funds such shall be invested only by deposit in some savings bank or in the savings department of a national bank or trust company in this state, or in shares of any building and loan association or co-operative bank incorporated and doing business under the laws of this state, or in the shares of any federal savings and loan association, located and doing business in this state, or in bonds, notes or other obligations of the United States government, or in state, county, town, city or local district, water and sewer district bonds and the notes of towns or cities in this state.

and when so invested the trustee shall not be liable for the loss thereof, and in any common trust fund established by the New Hampshire Charitable Fund in accordance with RSA 292:23. The trustee may reinvest investments as received from donors until the maturity thereof.

27. Collective Investments. Notwithstanding any statute or rule of law to the contrary, town or city trustees of trust funds may establish, maintain and operate one or more common trust funds, in which may be combined money and property belonging to the various trusts in their care for the purpose of facilitating investments, providing diversification and obtaining reasonable income, provided however that said common trust funds shall be limited to the investments authorized in section 25 of this chapter, provided further, that not more than ten thousand dollars or more than ten percent of the fund whichever is greater, of any town or city common trust funds shall be invested under section 25 of this chapter, but may be deposited in or transferred to any department of a national bank or trust company in this state, or in shares of any building and loan association or cooperative bank, incorporated and doing business under the laws of this state, or in the shares of any federal savings and loan association, located and doing business in this state, or in obligations of the United States and of the state of New Hampshire and its subdivisions, or in participation units of any common trust funds established by the New Hampshire Charitable Fund in accordance with RSA 292:23 and provided further, that the participating contributory interests of said trusts are properly evidenced by appropriate book-keeping entries showing on an annual basis the capital contribution of and the profits and income allocable to each trust.

28. Exceptions. The provisions of section 27 shall not apply where the instrument creating the particular trust specifically prohibits collective investments or where such investment shall violate any specific court order made in any particular trust.

29. Contributions and Withdrawals. Contribution to any common trust fund shall be made on the basis of its market value at the time such contribution is recorded in the books of the trustees. The withdrawal of a particular trust fund from any common trust fund shall be made proportionately on the basis of the market value of said common trust fund at the time such withdrawal is recorded in the books of the trustees.

30. Liberal Construction of Provisions. The provisions of sections 25, 27-29, and 38 of this chapter shall be construed liberally to effectuate the purposes state in section 27.

31. Trust Funds for Districts. Except where otherwise specifically provided in the charter of a city or by special act of the legislature whenever a gift, legacy or devise shall be made in trust to a school district, village district or any subdivision of a town and accepted by it, the same shall be held in custody and administered by the trustees of trust funds of such town or in case of districts embracing two or more towns by the trustees of trust funds of that town which the voters of said district may elect. The governing body of any such district or subdivision shall expend such district or subdivision trust funds, or the income thereof to be expended, consistently with the terms of the trust. The provisions of section 32 shall not apply to expenditures of district or subdivision trust funds.

32. Expenditures. Trust funds, or the income thereof, to be expended, shall be paid by trustee or agents of the town established to carry out the objects designated by such trusts, and if there be no such trustee or agents, then such expenditures shall be made by the full board of town trustees.

33. Audit and Publication of Reports of Trustees.

I. The accounts of the trustees shall be audited annually by the auditor of the town, the securities shall be exhibited to the auditor, and he shall certify the facts found by his audit and the list of all securities held. The trustees shall submit to the auditor a detailed statement of the securities held by them and the particular trust to which they belong, and exhibit to him a statement of all receipts and expenditures with proper vouchers.

II. The legislative body of a town may authorize the printing of the reports of the trustees and of the auditor in summary form rather than in full detail in the annual town report.

III. In a year in which a town accepts gifts, legacies and devises for any trust created, the trustee and auditor shall print the names of the donors and the value of such gifts, legacies and devises at the time of donation in the annual town report.

34. Records. The trustees shall keep a record of all trusts in a record book, which shall be open to the inspection of all persons in their town.

35. Compensation of Bookkeeper; Expenses of Trustees. The bookkeeper of the trustees shall receive such compensation as the town meeting may determine.

36. Bank Deposits. Deposits in savings banks shall be made in the name of the town which holds the same in trust, and it shall appear upon the book thereof that the same is a trust fund.

37. Payment by Towns. Each town shall pay over to the trustees the full amount of its trust funds.

38. Reports. A copy of the reports required of the town and city trustees and of the auditor thereof shall be filed annually with the attorney-general.

38-a. Professional Banking Assistance.

I. The provisions of RSA 31:19 through 31:38 as amended shall remain in full force and effect. This section is intended only to provide for trustees covered by this subsection by enabling them to have professional banking assistance in the performance of their duties as trustees.

II. Bank as used in this section means a savings bank, national bank or trust company in this state, any building and loan association or cooperative bank, incorporated and doing business under the laws of this state or any federal savings and loan association located and doing business in this state.

III. Any trustee or trustees of trust funds authorized by this chapter may hire or employ the trust department or departments of a bank or banks to assist in the management and investment of trust fund resources or to provide bookkeeping services in connection therewith or to do both. They may also place securities in the nominee name of a trust department or departments to facilitate transfers for such securities. Trust fund records maintained by any bank may be available at all times for examination by local auditors, by independent accountants or auditors retained by a municipality or by the auditors of the department of revenue administration, and such records shall be municipal records and property.

IV. Any expenses incurred pursuant to paragraph III of this section by a trustee or trustees of trust funds authorized by this chapter shall be charged against the trust funds involved and shall be identified and reported in the annual report of the trustee or trustees as expenditures out of trust funds made pursuant to RSA 31:38-a, III.
