Dear Fellow Citizen:

In helping you to make up your mind in regard to the articles in the warrant which call for an appropriation of money, your Selectmen felt that a short discussion of the overall picture of the Town finances was in order.

Once again, the appropriations, called for in the warrant, represent a bare minimum of town services and they have been held to the approximate level which has prevailed over the last several years. You will note that there are items in the warrant for setting up a new commission and a new committee. These are necessary starting points if we are to qualify for any aid, state or federal, in these areas. No appropriation was called for in connection with them because there is no telling at this time for just what amounts we might be eligible. If any amount is available prior to the next Town Meeting, the small amount of matching money which would be involved could be met out of overlay.

As you know, the amount raised for school purposes far exceeds the amount raised for other town purposes and the great bulk of your tax bill for this year will have been settled at the school district meeting on March 3rd prior to the Town Meeting on March 8th. Due to a number of factors resulting from conferences, legal action and the general nature of things, there has been quite a significant change in Sullivan's share of the school district cost. In the first place, in various conferences with the Tax Commission, it was established that property, instead of being assessed at 100% of valuation, was assessed at 107% of valuation, based on sales over the past two years. Through legal action it was determined that special aid would be distributed to the twenty neediest towns with need established on the same formula basis as general aid. In the general nature of things, more aid was granted by the Legislature and we are now in a position where an increase in average daily attendance does not increase our school district bill because of the offsetting aid which we receive.

The net result of the foregoing is that our percentage of contribution for that half of the school bill based on valuation, dropped from 3.40% in the 1965-66 school year to 2.96% in the

1966-67 school year. Our average daily membership rose from 3.65% in the 1965-66 school year to 4.33% in the 1966-67 school year for that half of the bill based on average daily membership. Our entitlement, as one of the twenty neediest towns in the State, is \$2,821.15. Adding all these factors together, the net amount to be raised by taxes, for school purposes this year, will be approximately \$29,209.37, as compared to the \$33,952.25 for the 1965-66 school year.

Since, as stated previously, we propose to hold town expenses to the level of the past few years, the decrease, because of the factors noted, in our share of school costs, will mean a decrease in our tax rate of around \$4.00 per thousand. You will note from the Comparative Statement of Appropriations and Expenditures that, through rigid economy and businesslike procedures, we were able to produce an operating surplus of \$2,736.78. If this is put in the bank in a capital reserve fund, as we propose, and the tax rate is lowered \$4.00 a thousand as appears probable, and since we have no debt except that funded by State TRA payments, we feel that the Town is in good financial shape and we hope you feel likewise.

Citation

During and prior to that time, for a total of eighteen years, you served with the same devotion as Selectman. Your ingeniousness was remarked early in life by the Town Historian, Rev. Josiah L. Seward, who made the following notation on page 558 of his Sullivan History: "The first electric door-bell in Town was attached . . . to the side door (on the south) of Mr. Jewett's house and was arranged by his ingenious son Edward." This ingeniousness has served you well through life, not only in the conduct of your own affairs, but in skillfully guiding our Town Meetings through the treacherous paths of doubt, indecision, misunderstanding and bickering to the end that our Meetings have reached successful conclusions with the Town Officers elected and the Town's business settled for another year. Your fellow townsmen, Edward, want to thank you for what you have done for them, and although we lose your services as Town Moderator, we hail the fact that we retain them in your capacity of Trustee of Trust Funds through the ensuing years. To John McMahon, our esteemed Town Clerk, who, after twenty-three years of outstanding service, leaves office because of your desire not to seek reelection, we extend thanks for those years. With pleasant greetings and good humor, mixed with salty candor, you have, carefully and with conscientious attention to detail, seen us through births, marriages and deaths, have legalized our dogs, have diligently recorded and kept our records; and after a long day dealing with the traveling requirements of a fickle public, have still had the energy and sense of humor to deal with our capriciousness in last minute automobile registrations and marriage intentions. To you, John, we all wish the utmost success in your new position in the State Highway Department and we congratulate you on your newfound freedom from the duties of your office so that you may pursue the trips and tours you have dreamed about.

ARTICLE 1

Election of Town Officers. See list.

ARTICLE 2

Motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,048.22 to defray town charges for the ensuing year was approved by voice vote.

ARTICLE 3

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,200.00 for Summer maintenance of highways and bridges, and any construction of same.

ARTICLE 4

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,200.00 for winter maintenance of highways and bridges.

ARTICLE 5

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for general expenses of the highway department.

ARTICLE 6

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$358.12 for Town Road Aid.

ARTICLE 7

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 to provide and maintain adequate Public Library service.

ARTICLE 8

Voted to raise and appropriate \$550.00 for support of the Fire Company.

ARTICLE 9

Voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 10

Voted to give Selectmen authority to give permits or licenses for the location of house trailers or mobile homes remaining in Town more than two weeks.

ARTICLE 11

Voted to explore the possibility of joining with Keene and other surrounding Towns to form a district department of health, but not joining at the moment.

ARTICLE 12

Voted the bookkeeper for the Trustee of Trust Funds shall receive \$25.00. Voted to increase the salary of Tax Collector from \$175.00 to \$250.00, and that of the Town Clerk from \$150.00 to \$175.00. The increases are retroactive for last year.

ARTICLE 13

Voted to accept the reports of Agents, Auditors and Committees as printed.

ARTICLE 14

Voted to accept the George D. Smith Cemetery Fund.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Sullivan in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Sullivan on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at 7:30 of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be judged necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year.
3. To raise and appropriate such sum of money, including that sum required by law, as may be judged necessary, for Summer Maintenance of highways and bridges, and for any construction of the same, for the ensuing year.
4. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be judged necessary for the Winter Maintenance of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
5. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be judged necessary for the General Expenses of the Highway Department.
6. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$404.19 for Town Road Aid in order to receive the full State share of \$2,694.58.
7. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be judged necessary to provide and maintain adequate Public Library service or to supplement funds otherwise provided.
8. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be judged necessary for the operation of the Fire Department and the purchase and maintenance of equipment,

9. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the acquisition of a site and the construction of a firehouse or take any action in relation thereto.

10. To authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$200.00 for the ensuing year to contract with the City of Keene for health services comparable to those received by Keene residents.

12. To see what action the Town wishes to take in regard to the salary of the Town Auditor.

13. To see if the Town will vote to accept as a gift from the Sullivan Community Society the Community Hall in East Sullivan.

14. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Benjamin F. Leighton Cemetery Trust Fund in the amount of \$100.00.

15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Conservation Commission as provided by RSA, Chapter 36A.

16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Community Action Committee as provided under Title I of the Act setting up the Office of Economic Opportunity.

17. To see if the Town will vote to establish a capital reserve fund for the purpose of new highway equipment and place therein the amount of \$2,736.78, the same being the operating surplus of the fiscal year 1965, and to designate the Selectmen as agents of the Town authorized to make withdrawals from said fund to carry out the purposes for which it was established.

18. To accept the reports of Agents, Auditors and Committees as printed in the Town Report.

19. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting and to listen to opinions of a purely

advisory nature in regard to the conduct of town affairs for the ensuing year.
