To the Inhabitants of the Town of Temple in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Temple on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at seven-thirty (7:30) o'clock in the afternoon to act on the following

To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan service in any class or classes of positions of election officials or election workers for a calendar quarter in which the remuneration paid for such service is less than \$50.00.

To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for Town Officers' Salaries, Town Officers' Expenses, Town Dump, Parks and Playgrounds, Election and Registration, Town Hall and Other Buildings, Flag, Cemeteries, Forest Fires, Civil Defense, Vital Statistics, Legal Expense, Dog Damage, O.A.S.D.I. (Social Security) and for any other charge arising within the Town.

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Summer Highways.

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Winter Highways.

To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for the improvement of Class IV and V roads and appropriate the sum of \$872.26 and the State will contribute \$5,815.04.

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus for the Temple Volunteer Fire Department.

Estimated Cost: 2 units - \$780. - 4 units - \$1,560.

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Temple Volunteer Fire Department, said sum to be turned over to the Treasurer of the Fire Department. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Salary and expense of the Police Department.

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Library, said sum to be turned over to the Treasurer of the Library.

To see if the Town will vote to raise \$850.00 additional for a new floor covering for the Library.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$155.00 for the support of the Monadnock Region Association. \$.06 per \$1,000 of the 1966 equalized assessed valuation.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 to be expended in cooperation with the N.H. Forestry and Recreation Commission for the Opening and maintaining of trails and old roads for Forest Fire Protection. The state will provide a matching sum not in excess of \$25.00 for this purpose.

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day, said sum to be handled under the auspices of the Day-Quinn-Blood Ex-Servicemen's Association.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the expenses of the Planning Board for the forthcoming year.

To see if the Town will vote to acquire such of the surplus land at Site 25B (on Miller Brook) as may be made available by the Water Resources Board for purchase or lease at a nominal price, or will vote to take any other action in relation to Site 25B.

To consider the report of the Planning Board and see what recommendations the Town wishes to make in respect thereto.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to place sand at a potential beach area at the Soil Conservation Floodwater Retarding Site No. 25B on Miller Brook, said money to be expended only under arrangements that are acceptable to the Selectmen and the New Hampshire Water Resources Board, or take any other action relating thereto. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes: pursuant and under the limitations of Chapter 33, Sect. 7-8 of N.H. Revised Statutes Annotated.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$108.00 to the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service for continuing support of that community mental health facility.

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.

To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Less fortunate than our northern towns, we had too many fires. Carelessness in burning trash and discarding smoking material and children playing with fire caused most of the fires. Your Forest Fire Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follows: Fire Permit

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be prior to 9:00 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m.

Exceptions

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

Penalties

1. For kindling a fire without a permit. Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 days.

2. For kindling a fire by any means wilfully or recklessly that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is \$500.00 or one year's imprisonment.

3. For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving it the same penalties as in (1) above.

4. For dropping inflammable material in or near woodland, maximum fine is \$25.00.

REPORT OF FIRE ENGINEERS

During the year of 1969, this department was called six times. In April there was a call to Mello's where a rotten tree was smoldering.

In June the department was called to Atter Brothers, Inc. for a fire which destroyed a packing shed, an equipment shed and various equipment and supplies. Two towns, New Ispwich and Greenville, were also called in through the Mutual Aid System.

In July the department responded to a brush fire in back of the Flood Control Dam on the North side of 101. In July we were called to a car fire on 101 near the state shed. This was an out of state car.

The department made three runs to the dump this year. One in May and two in October.

The engine in our No. 1 truck was replaced and the brakes on the No. 2 truck were worked on. The old Chevy pumper is out of commission due to a freeze up.

Ernest Harling spent two days at the Meadowood School this year, with Chief James Naglie and Assistant Chief Leo Turini, each spending one day.

Chief Naglie attended a twelve week course for firemen offered by the Monadnock Community College.

Dr. and Mrs. John Bird Lloyd again donated \$50.00 to the Temple Firemen's Fund. This fund is used to help us purchase safety equipment for the men.

During the year a total of seven furnaces were inspected and permits to operate were issued.

REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD

The Planning Board was organized on July 18, 1969, one week after notification of its appointment. Stated meetings, open to the public, have been held on the third Fridays of every month since September and special meetings, similarly open, have been held on the first Fridays of the month since October. A file of the minutes of the Board has been maintained at the Mansfield Library.

The primary effort of the Board has been to study the means, under the zoning and land-subdivision statutes of New Hampshire, whereby the people of the Town may prevent the deterioration of their environment and avoid being saddled by developers with excessive cost for services that benefit primarily the developers. No such means exist that do not to some extent restrict the freedom of action by individuals. Nonetheless, it is expected shortly to be able to lay acceptable proposals before the Town.

At the request of the Selectmen, the Board reviewed the problem of the Town Dump which is a potential source of pollution of the Tobey reservior. Recommendations for a partial alleviation of the problem were made but a satisfactory permanent solution feasible for a small town has not been found. The matter of solid-waste disposal is a major nation-wide problem.

A proposal to develop a "swimming-hole" in connection with a flood control pond known as Site 25B on Miller Brook was reviewed. It was recommended that the Selectmen place before the Town the matter of acquiring control of the surplus land at the site so that whatever might be done could be so handled as to avoid an attractive nuisance.

During the summer some of the school children moved their space men around a map of the moon for each book read during a fun reading program. Preschool children met each week for a story hour.
