#### WARRANT FOR THE ONE HUNDRED AND NINETY-FOURTH ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

(L.S.)

To the inhabitants of the Town of Northfield, in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Northfield Highway Garage, the fifth day of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town officers and School District officers for the coming year. And on the ninth day of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:
  - 1. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations upon the following:
  - A. Town Officers' Salaries
  - B. Town Officers' Expenses
  - C. Election and Registration Expenses
  - D. Expenses to Town Hall
  - E. Reappraisal of Property

- 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,650.00 to the Tilton-Northfield District Nurse Association (a similar request will appear in the Tilton Warrant by request).
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to the Lakes Region General Hospital (by request).
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to the Franklin Regional Hospital Association (by request).
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$759.71 for Town Road Aid. The State will contribute the sum of \$5,064.75. The plan, as set by the Town, is to do work on Cross Mill Road.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,800.00 for the Tilton-Northfield

Recreation Council, to maintain a year-round program (a duplicate article appears in the Tilton warrant).

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be put into an existing Building Fund Savings Account, this Fund to be contingent on motion and amendment of the 1962 Town Meeting (a duplicate article appears in the Tilton warrant).
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,334.85 for the Lakes Region Fire Dispatch Center (by request).
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the establishment of a Capital Reserve Fund \$1,600.00 to apply to the Equipment Fund and \$400.00 to apply to Town Buildings, Depreciation Fund. The Capital Reserve Fund will become the responsibility of the Trustees of the Trust Fund.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,323.00 to provide twenty-four hour telephone answering service for the Police Department by the Merrimack County Dispatch Center in Concord.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$5,700.00 to be the Town's share to participate in the City of Franklin's Solid Waste Disposal Project.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,250.00 for rubbish pick-up.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 to be set aside as a reserve for the construction of the bridge over the Winnipesaukee River, this money to be kept in a reserve fund and to be expended by the Selectmen.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$460.00 for the yearly cost of street

lighting on Route 3B at Northfield Center and Arch Hill.

- 15. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to appoint a Dog Officer to be sworn in as a Special Police Officer in matters relating to dog complaints and violations of Town Ordinances and State laws pertaining to dogs. The payment for the services of the Dog Officer to be taken from funds received by the Town Clerk for registration of dogs, in the amount of \$300.00 per year.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$3,800.00 for a Police cruiser.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to help maintain and financially support the New Hampshire Humane Society (by request).
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,316.00 for the Town's share to participate in the Lakes Region Planning Commission (by request).
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 as Northfield's share of the Emergency Radio System (by request).
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,600.00 for the expenses of the Bailey Bridge.
- 21. To see if the Town will install a catch basin on Watson Avenue near the property of Clifford Leavitt (by request).
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to accept and maintain the following roads as recorded on Plan No. 3085, November 30, 1972, at the Merrimack County Registry of Deeds: The Highlands, Greenwood Drive, Winnipesaukee Drive, Elliot Road (by petition).

- 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Planning Board to approve or disapprove of subdivisions of land (RSA 36:19). The Planning Board must review all plans within thirty (30) days of submission and accept or reject within ninety (90) days, unless the Selectmen have granted an additional ninety (90) days. Otherwise, the plan is deemed approved as submitted (RSA 36:23, Supp. 1969: 135).
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply, negotiate and do all other things necessary to obtain such Federal, State, or other assistance as may be available for the report for, design of, and construction of a sewage disposal system, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$2,000.00 for the purpose of updating the report on sewerage and sewage treatment facilities, completing an infiltration/inflow analysis or any other requirements contained in P.L. 92-500 which will qualify the Town for Federal funds, such sum to be appropriated under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (Chapter 33 of the New Hampshire Statutes Annotated 1955 and any amendments thereto) as shall be in the best interests of the Town of Northfield, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$6,000.00 for a four-wheel vehicle with plow (not approved by the Budget Committee).
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 28. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate that may be acquired through the Tax Collector's deeds.

- 29. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of Officers as printed.
- 30. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Polls shall be closed not earlier than six of the clock in the evening.

# REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The New Hampshire Forest Fire Service is represented in every town, city or unorganized place in our state by the Forest Fire Warden. Anyone wishing to kindle an outside fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the Fire Warden. Except for cooking fires, no fire can be kindled between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. unless it is a commercial or industrial burn or it is raining. The Fire Warden is assisted in his work by the District Forest Fire Chief who works for the Department of Resources and Economic Development Forest Fire Service.

Fire prevention was, again this year, the most important part of the Forest Fire Warden's Job. Fire statistics show the need with 72% of the fires caused by smoking, debris burning and children. Smokey the Bear is an important prevention tool but he still needs much help from the public. Parents should warn their children of the hazards of playing with matches. Children tend to forget that a lighted match held in their hand is a potential forest fire.

### 1973 Annual Report

The end of '73 completes 18 years of organized activities provided by the citizens of Tilton and Northfield. The accomplishments this year include:

A. Center Activities: During Christmas week 1971 a fire at the Tilton Town Hall curtailed our Center activities. In 1973 we were unable to locate facilities to provide an indoor recreational program. During the summer and fall with the help of local citizens who volunteered their services, members of the Teen Council, and the youngsters who worked on the summer program we were able to renovate the facilities at the Tilton Town Hall. Open House was held on Saturday, December 22, 1973. The Center was reopened officially on Wednesday, December 26, 1973. The Center is now open Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday evenings from 6:00-9:00 P.M. and Saturday afternoon from 1:00-4:00 P.M. Ping-pong, pool, tumbling, weight lifting, bumper pool, chess, checkers, and assorted games are available.

The Teen Council is also sponsoring movies, dances, and special Holiday programs on some Saturdays.

- B. Swimming Program: Two 4 week periods were provided during the summer months. Three 2 hour sessions were held daily Monday-Friday and included courses from beginners to junior lifesaving. Five local youngsters were employed in this program. The program was concluded with a picnic, contests were held and prizes were awarded.
- C. Playground: For 8 weeks under the direction of the Recreation Council and Playground Co-ordinator Steve Newton and the Arts and Crafts Director Mrs. Pat La-

Liberte with the help of ten local teenagers various arts and crafts, indoor and outdoor games were provided for 3 hours in the morning daily Monday-Friday. Weekly bus trips or special events were usually held on Fridays.

D. Ski Program: The Council is sponsoring two 5 week ski programs at the Highlands Ski Area on Saturday mornings with a bus leaving at 8:30 A.M. and returning by 11:00 A.M. from the elementary school area. Approximately forty youngsters are participating in this program. Plans are being made to co-ordinate a Teenage program to be held on Wednesday evening. The Council co-ordinates the Ski Program thereby obtaining a low cost group rate which the participants pay for themselves.

E. Babe Ruth Baseball: The Council sponsored a ball team playing in the Twin Rivers League. The boys had an opportunity to play against good competition; some also had the opportunity to play on the All Star Team. Tilton's record for 1973 14 wins 0 losses. Our congratulations to this fine Team and their Coaches.

### F. Special Events:

1. Halloween party, initiated by the Tilton and North-field Police Departments, the Selectmen, Teen Council, Recreation Council, and the Tilton-Northfield Fire Department and co-ordinated by Paul Paquette was an overwhelming success. All took part on this night of spooks and goblins. A costume contest, a parade with sirens and lights, and a walk through the fun house brought an estimated 450 children to the Winnisquam Regional High School. Prizes were awarded. Beverages, apples, cookies, and candies were distributed to all.

Later in the evening a live band at the High School played to a group of 350 teenagers, who also had free beverages and foodstuffs. Many thanks to the many

merchants, companies, individuals, and organizations who donated funds or products to this happy occasion.

- 2. Teen Council Bike-A-Thon. In May the Teen Council held a 20 mile Bike-A-Thon. The returned pledges amounted to \$1,000.00 which the Teen Council donated to the Tilton-Northfield Recreation Council Building Fund.
- 3. Christmas Party. The Teen Council played host to a group of youngsters at the Tilton Town Hall. A movie was shown and refreshments were served.

"Thank you" to those individuals and groups who have helped the Council provide activities throughout the year. Special thanks to the taxpayers of our communities whose support continues to make recreational programs available.

All interested citizens are welcome to attend our regular monthly meeting, the first Thursday of every month. We meet at 7:30 P.M. at the Recreation Center at the Tilton Town Hall. We do need volunteers. Respectfully submitted,

This year's total circulation was 18,265 — a fifty per cent increase over last year and a three hundred per cent increase over five years.

Additions to the list of magazines and newspapers carried in the library and the establishment of a vertical file resulted in a circulation of 373 periodicals and pamphlets, and an expanded record library circulated 1,802 recordings for 1973. Circulations of 2,710 adult fiction, 2,544 adult nonfiction, 5,570 juvenile fiction, 3,393 juvenile nonfiction as well as the 888 Bookmobile books and books requested from the State library which circulated 1,327 completed our statistics for the year.

336 new books were accessioned, with particular emphasis being given to the reference collection, and increased interest in the library resulted in 113 gifts, either directly or as memorials. We are very thankful for the generosity of our patrons.

A program designed to reach each child in the Union School and acquaint him with basic library skills was begun, both in the classrooms and at the library.

The Hall Memorial Friends of the Library held several successful fund raising events in support of various library improvement projects. The library was also pleased to serve as a meeting place for various community groups and committees.




