TOWN WARRANT

March 1947

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Plainfield in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Plainfield on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary ot defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Article 1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, Treasurer, Tax Collector, one or more Highway agents, one Trustee of Trust Funds, for three years, two Library Trustees for three years, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 2. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and to be paid on or before one year, pursuant to the Laws of 1917.

Art. 3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to pay outstanding notes and interest.

Art. 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for support of Town poor.

Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3000.00 to purchase a tractor shovel.

Art. 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise the amount of money required by law to secure State Aid on Class 5 highways, plus any additional amounts necessary.

Art. 7 To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for construction on the Class 2 road known as the Plainfield-Meriden Stage road and raise for said purpose the sum of \$1,266.00 and the State will contribute \$3,798.00

Art. 8. To see what sum of money if any, the Town will vote to raise to assist the citizens of Plainfield to Hospital expenses, also to appoint a committee or make resolutions regarding the same.

Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$150.00 for the use of the Health department.

Art. 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of publicising and promoting the natural advantages of the Town, together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee region.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow removal.

Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to assist in the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

Art. 14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to secure the assistance of the State Tax Commission in reappraising the taxable property in the Town in order to secure a greater equality as between tax payers, and to insure the assessment of all property in the Town on the same standard of value, and to raise and appropriate money for the same.

Art. 15. To see what action, if any, the Town will take to provide for a memorial for the Service men and women in the Town of Plainfield.

Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a safe for the use of the Tax Collector, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay all necessary Town expenses for the ensuing year.

Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the divition of Municipal Accounting and make an appropriation to cover the expenses of such an audit. Art. 19. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to deed to the present occupants of Leased Land, whose rent is paid in full or will pay when permission is granted by the Superior Court for the disposal of such property. The balance of such property disposed of according to the vote of the Town, March 12th, 1946.

Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Dog Constable to collect as his fee the sum of \$1.00 for each delinquent dog license issued after June 1st of each year.

Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to close the road known as the Cram Hill Road, subject to gates and bars, from the Cuddy Place to the intersection of Main road from Daniels to Woodward Place.

Art. 22. To see what action if any, the Town wishes to take in regard to the old Meriden Village school house.

Art. 23. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 2% on all 1947 property taxes paid on or before July 10th.

Art. 24. To see what action the Town will take in regards to the reports of the Town Officers.

Art. 25. To transact any other business that may legally and properly come before said meeting.

To the Plainfield School Board and Citizens:

This report will be brief.

Teachers

Teachers have been found for all schools. In these days that is news. The budget for teachers' salaries is increased with the hope that we may make the positions in Plainfield as attractive as those of our neighbors. The budget may not be large enough. One room schools of ten pupils or less should be closed, since the expense of operation is not justifiable.

Noon Luncheons

Parent-Teacher Associations were formed at Meriden and the Plainfield Schools. These have been very active and successful in carrying on the noon luncheons with small federal aid. The contract for luncheon operations is between the State and School Board.

Health Work

Mrs. Hasham, our school nurse, has a large number of towns to cover, yet she is always ready and willing to come on call for emergencies. Her work is very highly appreciated by all who know of it.

The report shows only the statistics of her activities but the personal contacts necessary to accomplish the work are innumerable.

Recommendations

I recommend a special appropriation for an artesian well water supply at the Plainfield School, the continuation of luncheons and some financial assistance for transportation to high schools.

The School Board has plans for ample toilet arrangements at the Plain School.

Conclusion

The year has been a busy one. Demands for attention to many and varied problems keep me very busy. In spite of this, I shall be glad to be of help whenever I can.
