THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Richmond in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Richmond on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges in addition to the amount required by law.
4. To see if the town will vote to accept state aid for construction of Class II road from Richmond to Fitzwilliam and raise and appropriate for said purpose the sum of \$429.00; or will vote to accept state aid for assistance of Class V roads and raise and appropriate for said purpose the sum of \$429.00.
5. To see if the town will vote to allow 5% discount on all property taxes paid on or before July 1, 1936.
6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries the ensuing year.

7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Library in addition to the amount required by law.

8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen and treasurer to borrow money for use of the town in anticipation of taxes.

9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for old age assistance and relief for the ensuing year.

10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collectors deeds, or now held by the town.

11. To see if the town will vote to dedicate in perpetuity for park purposes the Allen pasture, so called, recently acquired by the town and name same Allen Park and authorize the selectmen to improve the entrance to same and raise and appropriate a sum of money therefor.

12. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 from the estate of John A. Wheeler, in trust, the income from which to be use for the perpetual care of the said John A. Wheeler lot and that of his father in the south cemetery.

13. To see if the towns would be in favor in some way, to be determined, of reconstructing and improving the highway from the four corners to North Richmond.

14. To hear the reports of agents, auditors or committees heretofore chosen or take any action relating thereto.

15. To take any other action on any matter that may legally come before the meeting.

To the School Board and Citizens of Richmond:

I have the honor to submit, herewith, my eleventh annual report.

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS: Only minor repairs were made about the two buildings in use. Further improvements should be made upon the land recently purchased at the Four-Corners School. It would indeed be desirable to acquire more land at North Richmond. Both buildings should be repainted this summer. Some adequate supply of water should be provided at North Richmond.

TEACHERS AND PUPILS: Fortunately no change was necessary in the teaching staff this year. Too frequent changes are incompatible with sound educational policy. The work of the children compares favorably with other schools of this type. There are 41 pupils enrolled in the Richmond schools this year, 3 in Troy, 2 in Keene High School and 7 in Thayer High School, Winchester, total of 53.

HEALTH: I referred last year to the work to be begun in our schools by the school nurse, Miss Margaret E. Harris. Elsewhere in the school report you will find the first complete report of her activities. I am sure you will be interested in the type of work being done.

In conclusion, I wish to express my full appreciation for the hearty cooperation which I have received during the past year from the School Board, parents, teachers and the general

public. It is only by united, cumulative effort and intelligent cooperation that the best results can be achieved.
