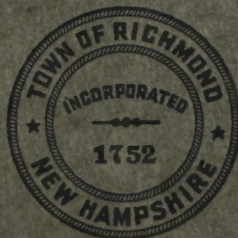

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Richmond, in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Richmond on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges in addition to the amount required by law.

4. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of two percent on all taxes paid in full within 30 days of invoice.

5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for cemeteries.

6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.

7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.

8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for relief.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen and treasurer to borrow money for the use of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$26.00 for publicity.

11. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for the completion of the Athol road, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00, the State to contribute \$22,600.00.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for brush cutting.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to be expended for blister rust control in cooperation with the Forestry Department.

14. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

15. To see if the Town will favor the following resolution: Resolved, that in the interests of the Town's welfare it is the sentiment of this meeting, the present board of selectmen and any future boards retain forever the following named property now owned by the Town: Town Pond, Shaw lots at Cass Pond, Allen Grove, The Town Commons.

16. To hear reports of agents, auditors or committees heretofore chosen, or take any action thereto.

17. To take any other action on any matter that may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Richmond :

I have the honor to submit my first annual report.

Enrollment: At the present writing the total enrollment at the Four-Corners School is 31. The distribution by grades is given in the following table :

Grade:	1	2	3	4	5	6	7	8	Total

We also have seven pupils who are attending Keene High School.

Buildings and Grounds: During the summer vacation period the usual cleaning and repairs were done. The toilet facilities were further improved by having the agitators taken out and thoroughly repaired. Chemical treatment was given to the toilets and the bowls were rigidly tightened. A new well cover has been purchased and the well will be cleaned and the water tested.

Instructional Activities: There has been, perhaps, less emphasis placed upon the tool subjects in our schools during the past fifteen or twenty years than there should have been. The curricula has expanded to an extent not known in a former generation. Progressive education has been in the forefront and too often this has been at the expense of the fundamental tool subjects. However, the pendulum has at last begun to swing back, and renewed attention is being given to the fundamentals.

Arithmetic tests have been given to all pupils in Union No. 25, in grades 3-8, to ascertain how we compare with other sections of the country. Some results were good, others not so gratifying. At least the pupils and teachers are arithmetic conscious and an immediate improvement should be the result.

Spelling, reading, and handwriting will be attacked in much the same way. It is highly essential that our pupils go forth from our schools able to figure, spell, read, and write respectably and effectively.

Guidance: Keene High School has a full time guidance director. Since the Richmond high school pupils usually go to Keene, it seemed desirable to synchronize our program as much as possible with that of Keene. To that end we have purchased guidance folders which will enable us to provide data on Richmond pupils which will be as complete as that for Keene grammar school pupils. The accumulated material will accompany each pupil as he goes to high school and will be a great aid to the counselors. Richmond pupils as a result will be helped to bridge the transition between grammar school and high school.

Health: In his address to the teachers of New Hampshire at the annual convention at Manchester, Superintendent of Schools Alexander Stoddard of Philadelphia reiterated over and over again the importance of a health program.

In Richmond the annual physical examination of every pupil in the school system is carried on each fall by the school physician. Follow-up work throughout the year is done by the school nurse. More thorough inspection in most school systems is recommended by the health division of the State Department of Education.

A recommended purchase would be an individual audiometer with which to test the hearing of the children. The old watch test, or even the more improved group audiometer test are not as reliable as the individual audiometer. It might be possible to buy one instrument for Union No. 25, and have all four towns contribute to the expense.

In conclusion, I wish to express my appreciation to the teachers, pupils, and parents, to the School Board, and to the patrons of our schools for their cooperation.

FOREST FIRE PROBLEM SERIOUS

The year 1947 was one of the worst periods of drouth and forest fire occurrence in eastern United States history. Lack of water ruined crops lowered water levels and dried up brooks everywhere. Three months of deficient rainfall and abnormally high temperatures resulted in many fires which were mostly well controlled and kept within bounds. Only the high winds beginning on October 23rd caused a few fires to escape beyond immediate control. These few fires resulted in burning some 15,000 acres and the loss of 63 or more buildings in four New Hampshire towns.

All October fires were costly. They burned deeply in the ground and required day and night patrol of large crews of men until the rains came late in October. Towns which escaped from serious fires might easily have been in the midst of the most serious conflagration we had.

Governor Dale closed the woods effective at midnight of October 15th. With the blow-up of October 23rd, a second proclamation closed all back roads and authorized towns to inaugurate patrol. The effect of this was to cut down subsequent fires for the rest of the dry period.

Local fire warden forces performed an admirable job to hold the more than 200 fires that occurred during this October period. Many men were taxed to the utmost as the emergency continued. To them and all those who did their work, the people of New Hampshire owe a debt of gratitude. The state forest fire control agency based on local town wardens and town crews wherever adequately equipped rose to the occasion and met the test in whatever town their services were needed.

It is now time to take stock everywhere of our fire fighting facilities for the season ahead and to make them adequate where necessary. To this end town fire plans and training programs for wardens, deputies and other key men in each district are being arranged or in progress. If equipment and tools are insufficient to properly equip the available man power in each community with the right tools for the job, they should be provided for at once. The yearly addition of fire tools to the town supply will generally need to be built up. The state sells tools to the towns and shares one-half their cost. Good equipment is important and can help greatly to keep both damage and fire costs at a minimum.

For many years we have requested our wardens not to issue burning permits except on rainy days. This regulation will be in effect again this year as it is one of the best means of assuring such fires from getting out of control. Nine out of every ten fires can be prevented, 98 percent of all fires being due to human carelessness. Be sure to get a permit for any fire in or near woodland when the ground is free from snow. Be sure your fires are always out before you leave them. Help us in getting the traveling public to keep from throwing out lighted matches or cigarettes. Be careful of all fires in or near woodland.
