TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Richmond in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Richmond on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2500.00 for highways and bridges.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1300.00 for snow removal.
- 5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for cemeteries.
- 6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.
- 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.
- 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Relief.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$24.00 for Publicity.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for Brush Cutting.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$480.20, the State to contribute \$3201.32, for T. R. A. roads, so-called.

- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow as may be necessary for use of the Town in anticipation of taxes.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of two percent on all taxes paid in full within 30 days of invoice.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$16.50 for the Elliot Community Hospital.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to use \$1000.00 previously appropriated for a bridge over Tully Brook, on the proposed new bridge on Route 119 about one half mile east of the Winchester-Richmond Town line and raise and appropriate an additional sum of \$300.00 in order to meet the State's estimate of \$1300.00 as the Town's share of the cost of said bridge.
- 16. To see what action the Town will take regarding unexpended balances of special appropriations carried as liabilities on Town books.
- 17. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for a Fire Truck, the Town to raise 2/3 and the Fire Company to give 1/3 of the total amount needed and the whole amount not to exceed the sum of \$3,600.00.
- 18. To hear reports of agents, auditors or committees heretofore chosen, or take any action thereto.
- 19. To take any other action on any matter that may legally come before the meeting.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board and Citizens of Richmond:

I have the honor to submit my fourth annual report.

School Population: The present enrollment of Richmond pupils and their distribution among the various schools are shown in the following table:

In view of the fact that the citizens of Richmond have expressed serious interest in Richmond's school structure, it behooves them to consider carefully what the above figures mean in terms of future enrollments. Of particular concern to the people will probably be the possible total enrollments in the first eight grades. By combining the figures in the above two tables, a picture is obtained of these future enrollments. The figures derived from the census cards represent potential school children. They are children who are now living here in Richmond. If families move in or out of Richmond, the numbers can change. However, at present, at least, they will serve to indicate the school population for the next five years.

It will be quite apparent to the citizens of Richmond that the above total enrollments are too large for a single one room school of eight grades. What then are the other possibilities!

1. Re-open the Four Corners School.

2. Continue the present arrangement of sending grades six, seven and eight to Keene.

3. Send all Richmond pupils, grades 1 through 12, to Keene. After careful consideration of the above possibilities, the Richmond School Board has prepared a budget for the second arrangement. Number three, wherein all pupils would be sent to Keene, was discarded since it was thought that small children should not be sent so far from home. The first possibility does not offer the advantages of the second for the upper grades. Furthermore, the second choice is the least expensive of all three and is the only one which will also provide transportation for the senior high school pupils.

Buildings and Grounds: New windows were installed in the North Richmond School during the summer months. The floor was sanded and sealed. The outside door was hung to open outward instead of inward as formerly was the case. This is to allow rapid egress in the event of fire and to eliminate the possibility of pressure from behind preventing the inward opening of

the door.

The wood shed has been repaired and shored by strengthening the supports. A new water reservoir was put in the stove. An iron railing was installed on the rear steps to reduce the possibility of accidents. Basketball backboards and hoops have been

set up in the play area.

Miscellaneous: One of the most worthwhile projects ever undertaken in Supervisory Union No. 25, comprising the towns of Hinsdale, Richmond, Swanzey and Winchester, was completed this past spring. I refer to the topical fluoride treatment of the teeth of pupils in grades one through six. This treatment was given to 203 pupils in Hinsdale, 20 in Richmond, 232 in Swanzey and 255 in Winchester, a total of 710 pupils.

The treatments were all given at the Community Center Building in Winchester. When it is recalled that each child had four separate sittings on different days, the magnitude of the task becomes apparent. Transportation alone was a considerable problem.

The cost of the project was borne by the federal government. If \$12 is considered a normal fee for the topical fluoride treat-

ment, the total value of 710 treatments is \$8520.

In conclusion, I wish to express my appreciation to the teachers, pupils and parents, to the School Board and to the patrons of our school for their cooperation.
