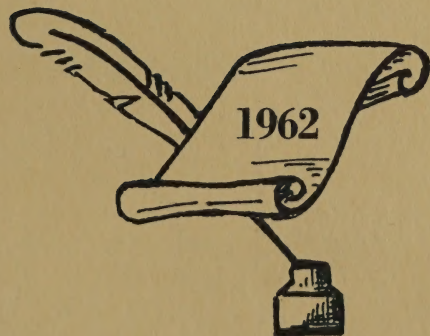

# State of New Hampshire

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## TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Richmond in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs;

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Richmond on Tuesday, the 12th day of March next at seven of the clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for highways and bridges, or take any action thereon.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for winter maintenance, or take any action thereon.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for cemeteries, or take any action thereon.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the maintenance of the Library, or take any action thereon.
7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow a sum of money not to exceed \$2500.00, to be spent under the direction of the Library Trustees for the completion of the work on the new Library.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the Fire Department, or take any action thereon.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Police work, or take any action thereon.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for relief, or take any action thereon.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$58.56 for Publicity.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$147.00 for the Elliot Community Hospital, or take any action thereon.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for brush removal, or take any action thereon.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$477.27, the State to contribute \$3181.79 for the T.R.A. program.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Civil Defense, or take any action thereon.

16. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of two per cent on all taxes paid in full within 30 days of invoice.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for use of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the installation of a Traffic Light at Four Corners or take any action thereon.

19. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00, to be added to the existing Trust Fund for the perpetual care of the D. Martin and VanBrocklin cemetery lots.

20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to execute a Quit Claim deed of the Common situated directly south of the Gailbraith property, owned by Charles and Jennie Galbraith, for the consideration of a 12 foot right of way along the west side of said Galbraith's property for access to the Quaker Cemetery.

21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the Blister Rust Control program.

22. To see if the Town will vote to ratify, approve and confirm the action of our Fire Department in joining our Town to the Southwestern N. H. District Fire Mutual Aid System in 1958 and agreeing that our Fire Dept. may give and receive outside aid as provided in RSA 154 as amended.

23. To hear reports of agents, committees, etc. heretofore chosen, or take any action thereon.



24. To take any other action that may legally come before the meeting.

## Preventing Forest Fires Is Our Responsibility

Costs of suppressing carelessly set outdoor fires in New Hampshire in 1962 cost the persons responsible \$5,545. In the same period, the costs to the cities and towns for control of such fires for which no responsibility could be placed cost another \$24,634. What utter waste of tax money and what shameful and needless loss of timber and esthetic values in the 2200 acres burned. Residences, farms, and other business places were threatened with possible total destruction.

Carelessly set man caused fires can be prevented if every citizen remembers his responsibility in regard to any source of fires in the open. We can help to keep our fire loss low by remembering these simple rules.

1. Dispose of burnable waste at the town dump.

2. If waste or brush is to be burned on the premises, **obtain** a permit from the forest fire warden. Seasonal permits may be issued for approved incinerators and sites.

3. Burn safely by picking a clean site, avoiding dry windy weather and preferably burning late in the day.

4. Have something to keep the fire under control—pails of water, garden hose, sprinkling can, broom for grass fires or shovel will help.

5. Be sure your fire is dead out before you leave it.

6. If the fire gets out of control or if you see a fire out of control, report promptly to your warden or fire department. Continue to fight it until help arrives.

There is potential danger when matches fall into the hands of children. It is never too early for parents to install in the child's mind a respect for fire.

Keep our town safe from fire.

We burned 2 acres.

My thanks to all of you for your generous contributions.

In April, I attended the National Library Week Luncheon in Concord. Mrs. Elizabeth Yates McGreal of Peterboro was the State



Chairman of the affair which was very well attended. Mr. James Michener spoke on current trends in periodical literature.

On May 9th, I attended the annual meeting of the New Hampshire Library Association at the Carpenter Hotel in Manchester. As well as several interesting talks and discussions, there were large book displays by the publishers. A silent book auction was continued during the day and a delicious banquet in the evening ended a most interesting and delightful day.

I have remained on the Governor's Committee for Better Libraries and have attended several meetings in reference to this. # Report of Director of Civil Defense

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Board of Selectmen and Citizens of Richmond:

I hereby submit my report for the year ending December 31, 1963:

A two town alert was set up for Richmond and Winchester for October, but owing to the Cuban situation, it had to be called off. On Monday, October 22, at 9:15 A.M., all Staff members were briefed and alerted at Concord. At 7:30 P.M. President Kennedy addressed the nation on television. You all know what happened: we remained on alert for 18 days.

We now have two Walkie-Talkies and bases but need one more.

Your Director has attended over fifty meetings in this area as speaker, some of which your Deputy Director attended.

We have supervised a Police Course for Richmond, Winchester and Swanzey. Five Richmond men completed the course and received State Certificates. Your Director has completed a course at the Defense Training Center in New York as Public Shelter Manager for the State with fifty men and women from all over the country, living in a fallout shelter for most of a week subsisting on only survival rations, the same as will be placed in public shelters.

We hope to obtain the old Fire House for a Control Center, Supply Depot and Mobil Unit as soon as it is available.
