# TOWN WARRANT

THE POLLS WILL BE OPEN FROM 10:00 A.M. TO 7:00 P.M.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pittsburg, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Bremer Pond Auditorium in said Town of Pittsburg on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March next, at 10:00 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To bring in your ballots for the election of one Selectman for three years; one Road Agent for one year; one Town Clerk for three years; one Library Trustee for three years; one Overseer of Welfare for one year; one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years; one Cemetery Trustee for three years; one Cemetery Trustee for two years; one Cemetery Trustee for one year.
2. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to appoint all necessary Town Officers not listed under Article 1.
3. To see if the Town will vote to modify the existing agreement under Section 218 of the Social Security Act by changing the FICA exclusion for election workers from \$100 to \$1,000 annually.
4. To see if the Town will vote to change the 1982 Town Meeting vote designating the Town Clerk as the officer responsible for the administration of the Social Security Plan coverage by designating the Selectmen's Secretary as the person in charge of this responsibility.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) to observe Old Home Day and elect a committee to manage the observance of same.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500) for the support of the Panthers' Den.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for the dump closure. This will be a non-lapsing account per RSA 32:3, VI and will not lapse until the closure is completed or in five years, whichever is less. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) to be added to the Police Cruiser Capital Reserve Fund previously established. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to be added to the Highway Department Heavy Equipment Capital Reserve Fund previously established. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to be added to the Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund previously established. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$618,650 which represents the operating budget. Said sum does not include special articles addressed. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
12. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

## TRANSMITTAL AND COMMENTARY LETTER

To the Members of  
the Board of Selectmen  
Town of Pittsburg  
Pittsburg, New Hampshire 03592

Members of the Board:

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements of the Town of Pittsburg, New Hampshire for the year ended December 31, 1993 we considered the Town's internal control structure to determine our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the financial statements and not to provide assurance of the internal control structure.

However, during our audit, we became aware of the following conditions that should be corrected in order to strengthen internal controls and operating efficiency. This letter does not affect our report dated June 14, 1994 on the financial statements of the Town of Pittsburg, New Hampshire.

Our following remarks are being made in the hope that they will improve the existing procedure and are in no way a criticism of Town personnel.

### 1. Investment of Capital Reserve Fund

During the course of our audit, we noted that the Trustee of Trust Funds had transferred several Capital Reserve Funds from Certificates of Deposit to the Trust checking account.

The funds were transferred with the intention of moving them into a higher yielding investment however the funds remained in the Trust Fund checking account for several months.

#### Recommendation

According to RSA 35:9, Capital Reserve Funds cannot be combined for purposes of investment, either with each other, with Trust Funds, or with any other funds. The Trustee should be sure to comply with this statute and invest Capital Reserve Funds only in savings accounts, in savings banks or national banks, in building and loan or savings and loan associations, or in obligations of the federal and state government.

2. Total Costs and Fees in the Tax Lien Process

Our review discovered that the total costs and fees for tax lien notice and execution were not the correct amount. The Tax Collector charged \$33.00 instead of \$33.50 which is the correct amount. The Tax Collector did charge \$33.50 for the 1994 tax lien.

Recommendation

The Tax Collector should be careful to charge accurate amounts for the tax lien process.

3. Formalized Policy Recording Vacation and Sick Pay

Currently the Town's vacation and sick pay policy applies only to the highway department.

Recommendation

The Town should prepare and adopt a formal policy on the accrual and payment of accrued vacation and sick pay for all Town employees. The adoption of this policy could be extremely helpful in the future in avoiding possible litigation or contingent liabilities.

We extend our thanks to the officials and employees of the Town of Pittsburg for their assistance during the course of our audit.

# POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

The Pittsburg Police Department investigated a total of 90 motor vehicle accidents in the year 1994. Among these was one fatality. A total of 28% of these accidents were animal related. I can't caution you enough to slow down in areas that you know are frequented by wild animals, such as the so-called "Moose Wallows".

Other cases prosecuted in 1994 included 34 OHRV complaints, 105 Motor Vehicle complaints including 6 D.W.I.'s, 6 Juvenile complaints, 8 Unauthorized Campers, and 7 Animal complaints. Of major concern was the increase we saw in criminal cases. Our criminal cases increased from 50 to 70. (These cases were actual crimes that were given case numbers.) We were able to solve several camp breaks and have one individual under indictment for burglary and theft. Each of you should be aware that one of our most valuable tools in solving crimes against property are you people. Each of you who are willing to call when you see a suspicious vehicle or person contributes to the solving and eventual prosecution of these criminals. We need and appreciate your help. Call us anytime and remember that anything you observe may be just the key to solving some of these crimes. We will respect your anonymity if at all possible.

It is with regret that in 1994 we lost two officers; Dwayne Covell and Bob Ward resigned for personal reasons. Bob was a seasoned officer and Dwayne showed a lot of potential. We were fortunate to hire Jules Kennett of Colebrook for a replacement. Jules is a certified officer and works with the Colebrook Police Department as well. It is becoming more and more difficult to find certified officers or people willing to attend the required training to become certified.

I want to thank each of my officers for their continued support and dedication in 1994. They are a valuable resource in our continued effort to provide you with the best coverage possible. I also want to thank the selectmen for their continued support and would like to stress to each of you that your input, comments, suggestions, etc., on how we can better improve our services are not only welcomed, but are encouraged. Feel free to stop in and talk with me about the department and its future. Remember that we are here to "PROTECT & SERVE".

# FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

Over the past five years the Pittsburg Fire Department Building Committee has raised a total of \$67,104.90 for a new fire station through their annual auction and other donations. This money has been placed in the town revenue accounts. It is the firemen's hope to raise half the cost of a new facility before presenting any request to the town.

For your information, we would like to list the mobile equipment that we have in the department:

Eng.#1: 1974 GMC; Pierre Thibault Mfg., Pumper-1,000 gal.

Eng.#2: 1967 GMC; Pierre Thibault Mfg., Pumper-750 gal.

Eng.#3: 1963 Ford; Howe Mfg., Pumper-1,000 gal.

Tanker #1: 1979 Ford; Dingee Mfg., Tanker-1,500 gal.

Equipment Van: 1973 Chevy

Brush Truck: 1954 Dodge T245; GSA; Forest Fire Equipment

Engine No. 2 is presently on restricted service because of mechanical problems. The department has appointed a committee to look into replacing or refurbishing it, and have requested its members to bring back information on (1) cost of a new pumper, (2) cost of refurbishing the present vehicle, (3) cost of a second-hand refurbished pumper, and (4) recommendations about the size, location & tank size, and type vehicle that should be purchased if it becomes necessary.

The department holds its monthly meetings on the second Wednesday of each month at 7 P.M. Currently, there are 28 active members participating in the meetings and training sessions. The past few years we have joined with our neighboring departments (Colebrook and Beecher Falls) to put on a two-day training session, the "Tri-Town Fire School". This enables us to keep the training local and for firemen to train with the persons with whom they will be working.

In 1994 the Ambulance Corps did a total of 66 ambulance runs. Out of these total runs, 59 were emergencies and 7 were transfers.

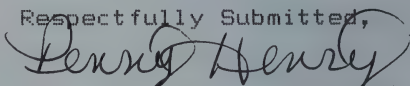
